

Resolution Against Texas' Senate Bill 147

The San Francisco Labor Council strongly condemns and opposes passage of Texas' Senate Bill 147, which if enacted would ban citizens of China, Russia, North Korea, and Iran from buying property or real estate in Texas. At least 11 other states are considering similar legislation. The ultra-conservative American Legislative Council is supporting and raising money to pass these bills as a "model policy" justified on the grounds of U.S. national security.

Whereas, support for these racist and xenophobic bills is based on the four countries being designated as enemies of the United States; and

Whereas, we are a nation of laws and SB147 would violate the equal protection and due process protections of the Constitution; and

Whereas, passing SB147 and similar legislation would offend our basic principles of morality, racial, and economic justice; and

Whereas, these racist, xenophobic, and unconstitutional bills would be a shameful revival of the darkest, ugliest, and most hateful periods of our past,

Therefore Be It Resolved, that the San Francisco Labor Council demands that members of the Texas Senate condemn and reject SB147; and

Therefore Be It Finally Resolved, that the San Francisco Labor Council forward this resolution to the California Labor Federation and to the AFL-CIO for concurrence and appropriate action.
