13 Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

14 Section 1. The Administrative Code is hereby amended by adding Section 10.4-1 to
15 Article I of Chapter 10, to read as follows:

16 **SEC. 10.4-1. POWER TO SELL TIME PERIOD FOR NONRESIDENTIAL COMMERCIAL**
17 **PROPERTIES.**

18 *In accordance with California Revenue and Taxation Code Section 3691(a)(1)(C), the Board of*
19 *Supervisors elects to have the five-year time period described in California Revenue and Taxation*
20 *Code Section 3691(a)(1)(A) apply to tax-defaulted nonresidential commercial property.*

22 Section 2. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after
23 enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the
24 ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board
25 of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.

1 Section 3. Undertaking for the General Welfare. In acting and implementing this
2 ordinance, the City is assuming an undertaking only to promote the general welfare. It is not
3 assuming, nor is it imposing on its officers and employees, an obligation for breach of which it
4 is liable in money damages to any person who claims that such breach proximately caused
5 injury.
