












#### % of Respondents with Substance Use History







## Drugs/Alcohol Played a Role in Most Recent Incarceration





#### **Most Recent Incarceration**




#### **Know Where Living Upon Release**









#### **Assessed Through Coordinated Entry**




#### **Outcome of Coordinated Entry**






## Is there a need for long term transitional housing (1 -3 years) for justice involved people?
