DAS Housing-Related Services

Rental Subsidies Small-scale rental subsidy programs based in an aging and disability service delivery model. Our programs are provided by community based organizations (CBOs) with expertise in the population and community.

Supportive Services in Affordable Housing Sites

Supportive services provided in former public housing sites managed by MOHCD and at veterans housing sites.

Housing Advocacy

Advocacy services and counseling to help improve housing conditions for older people and adults with disabilities



Rental Subsidies

Program	Description	Clients Served	Budget
DAS Housing Subsidies Partners: Self-Help for the Elderly, Catholic Charities, Eviction Defense Collaborative	Stabilizes existing housing of older people and adults with disabilities at imminent risk of eviction. Staff also provide clients with help connecting to other social services and resources that promote their housing stability.	380	\$4.8M
Scattered Site Housing Partner: Brilliant Corners	Supports individuals to leave institutional care (such as skilled nursing) and live in private market housing units. Clients receive ongoing housing retention services to support their ability to remain housed.	110	\$3.2M

DAS also holds \$3.2M in one-time funds for deep subsidies through the Senior Operating Subsidy that will be transferred to MOCHD when an appropriate site is identified



Supportive Services in Affordable Housing Sites

Program	Description	Clients Served	Budget
Rental Assistance Demonstration Partners: Community Housing Project, Bridge Housing, Glide, Mercy, TNDC	Promotes housing retention and community connection in public housing developments. This includes supports for health and wellness, community development, and resolution of individual issues related to housing.	2,000	\$1.7M
Veterans Services Connect Partner: Swords to Plowshares	Promotes independence, connection to supportive services, and facilitates community at veterans housing developments.	350	\$394K



Housing Advocacy

Program	Description	Clients Served	Budget
Housing Advocacy Partner: Senior and Disability Action	Advocacy services and counseling help to improve housing conditions for older people and adults with disabilities by providing both direct support and systems-level advocacy.	250	\$174K
