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# Mount St. Joseph-St. Elizabeth (Epiphany Center) Services

- Under the proposed contract, Mount St. Joseph-St. Elizabeth (Epiphany Center) would continue to provide:
  - Epiphany Residential: Residential SUD treatment program for women.
    - For: perinatal women, women, and women with young children (80 clients/year)
  - <u>Epiphany Residential Step Down</u>: Supportive transitional housing for women who have completed ≥ 30 days in residential treatment.
    - For: perinatal women, women, and women with young children (17 clients/year)
  - <u>Epiphany Family Treatment</u>: Outpatient mental health program for youth (ages 0-21) and their families.
    - For: those affected by parental substance abuse, separation, reunification, or trauma (20 clients/year)

# **Epiphany Center Residential Within the System of Care**

#### **Epiphany Center Residential**

- Under the SFDPH-BHS system of care for substance use disorder (SUD).
- Can self-refer, or use referral points (e.g., Treatment Access Program)
- Capacity for 26 women and 20 children (ages 0-3) at a time. (80 clients per year)

#### Offers:

- Individual and group sessions, case management, crisis intervention, drug education and relapse prevention
- Life skills training, parenting support, referrals for housing
- Referrals to medication assisted treatment, psychiatric medication management and consultation, and medical services
- Referrals to residential step-down and outpatient treatment once treatment is complete<sub>San Francisco Health Network</sub>
   Behavioral Health Services

#### **Short-Term SUD Residential Treatment Programs**

Total Capacity: 245 beds

Average Length of stay: 90-120 days

### **Epiphany Center Residential Step-Down Within the System of Care**

#### **Epiphany Center Residential Step-Down**

- Under the SFDPH-BHS system of care for substance use disorder (SUD).
- Capacity for 12 women and 10 children (ages 0-4) at a time. (17 clients per year)
- Clients are referred from residential treatment programs once they have completed treatment.
- Offers supportive transitional housing to help women grow in their recovery skills and live independently.
- Program works with client and social services to transition to housing and work force development.

#### Serves

People transitioning from more intensive SUD residential programs to outpatient

#### Eligibility

 Must successfully complete a short-term residential program.

### **Epiphany Center Family Treatment Within the System of Care**

#### **Epiphany Center Family Treatment**


 Under the Children, Youth, & Families system of care, in outpatient services.

#### Serves:

- Mothers with young children stepping down from adult residential SUD program
- Families involved in Family Treatment Court
- General referrals as capacity allows, with focus on children 0-3 (dyadic treatment) and Educationally Related Mental Health Services (ERMHS)

#### Offers

- Short-term (up to 1 year) intensive individual and family therapeutic services
- Crisis intervention
- Case management and case conferences
