WHEREAS, It is estimated about one percent of the world's population stutters and roughly three million Americans stutter; and

WHEREAS, Organizations dedicated to bringing hope and empowerment to children and adults who stutter through support, education, and advocacy, have locations in San Francisco; and

WHEREAS, Paul Castellano and Barbara Hubbard Koval, organized the drive to win Congressional recognition for people who stutter, and in 1988 President Ronald Reagan signed a proclamation establishing the second week in May 1988 as National Stuttering Awareness Week; and

WHEREAS, Many stutterers suffer frustration and embarrassment that can lead to harmful emotional stress; and

WHEREAS, Stuttering is a form of verbal diversity and should be recognized as simply a different way of speaking; and

interpersonal relationship, job opportunities, and professional growth; and

WHEREAS, During Stuttering Awareness Week, Proud Stutter Podcast seeks to raise awareness about communication disorders and the many ways that people with the daily challenges of stuttering can be supported; and

WHEREAS, Proud Stutter and stuttering advocates partnered with the San Francisco Board of Supervisors to unanimously pass a Resolution declaring the City's first annual Stuttering Awareness Week in 2022, on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 220520, which is hereby declared to be a part of this Resolution as if set forth fully herein; and

WHEREAS, San Franciscans who stutter appeared in stories featured in the San Francisco Examiner, 48Hills, and KQED around Stuttering Awareness Week and stuttering pride; and

WHEREAS, By recognizing the stuttering community, advocates and public officials can draw attention to the needs, shine a light on these often invisible disabilities, and help avoid the negative consequences of misunderstanding stuttering; and

WHEREAS, Many years of public advocacy campaigns, personal experiences, and individuals or groups acting as informal ambassadors, have raised the awareness of both speech disabilities and stuttering; and

WHEREAS, This involves awareness not only of individuals but also unique individual needs and contributions; and

WHEREAS, As these campaigns have become more common, so too has public awareness and acceptance; and

WHEREAS, A growing number of families in San Francisco have a family member with a stutter and know that inclusion is a crucial element for their loved ones' future success; and

WHEREAS, This will increase and encourage public participation at the local and state government level; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the City and County of San Francisco hereby supports Assembly Resolution, Assembly Concurrent Resolution (ACR) No. 59 (Rivas) to designate the week of May 8, through May 13, 2023, as 2023 Stuttering Awareness Week in California; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the City and County of San Francisco will work to support the stuttering community at the local, regional and state level and will encourage residents of San Francisco to participate in California's Stuttering Awareness Week activities; and, be it
