
CAMEO HOUSE



Cameo House is San Francisco's leading long-term transitional housing and alternative sentencing program for homeless, justice-involved women and their children.

Funded by the the San Francisco
Sheriff's Office, our program is located
in the heart of the Mission District.
We have been serving women with
children experiencing homelessness
since 1998.

Since 2006, we have prioritized justice-involved women with childre and are San Francisco's first alternative sentencing program for this population.

Cameo House provides on-site case management, a safe and stable living environment, and an array of supportive services.

Our program can serve up to 11 women and 22 children, who can live on-site to receive reunification services.

KEEPING SAN FRANCISCO FAMILIES TOGETHER SINCE 1998.

Nearly 90% of Cameo House participants are homeless women of color, specifically Black & Latina women. Our 12-24 month program serves as an alternative to incarceration for over 70% of participants.

A JANUARY 2021 PROGRAM EVALUATION FOUND THAT FOR OUR PARTICIPANTS:

100% showed decreased substance use 78% moved into permanent, stable housing 77% gained & sustained employment.

Cameo House enjoys strong support
from the San Francisco Sheriff's
Office, the San Francisco District
Attorney's Office, the San Francisco
Public Defender's Office, and a wide
network of community-based service
providers.

The program was designed and is run by persons with experience in the criminal justice system and residential treatment. Twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week. Program staff are diverse, culturally competent, and support families to achieve their individualized goals.
