Resolution declaring March 26, 2011, as Monsignor Oscar Romero Day in San Francisco, to honor a person who dedicated themselves to, and ultimately gave their life for, social justice and human rights protection, and preached the message of peace, non-violence, reconciliation, and love.

WHEREAS, Oscar Arnulfo Romero y Galdamez, Archbishop of El Salvador, was murdered at the altar while celebrating Mass in a small chapel in San Salvador on March 24, 1980; and

WHEREAS, He was an outspoken advocate for poor people in El Salvador and used his sermons to plead with both the left and right to end the violence and human rights abuses taking place throughout the country; and

WHEREAS, Other religious leaders, such as Monsignor Gerardi of Guatemala and Monsignor Ruiz of Mexico, were persecuted for their advocacy on behalf of the poor and indigenous populations in all of Latin America; and

WHEREAS, Faith communities are globally committed to serving the poor, dispossessed and disempowered; and

WHEREAS, Monsignor Romero's assassination was a result of military orders to silence his criticism of an oppressive governmental regime and the culture of violence perpetuated by that government against these communities; and

WHEREAS, Various United Nations Truth Commissions charged with investigating the military suppression of these populations found that the United States' government politically and militarily supported these anti-democratic actions; and

WHEREAS, There will be an interfaith service to honor Monsignor Romero on March 26, 2011 at the Basilica Mission Dolores in San Francisco; and

WHEREAS, This Romero commemoration represents interfaith and local community organizations that wish to celebrate this universal champion of non-violence, reconciliation and respect for human rights; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors declare March 26, 2011 as Monsignor Oscar Romero Day; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of San Francisco will stand in solidarity with those faith leaders who seek social justice for the poor, dispossessed and disempowered throughout the world and work together for justice, peace and human rights.
