- [Supporting California Senate Bill Nos. 36 (Skinner), 345 (Skinner), and 729 (Menjivar), and California State Assembly Bill Nos. 571 (Petrie-Norris) and 576 (Weber) Reproductive and Gender-Affirming Health Care]
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Resolution urging the passage of California State Senate Bill No. 36, introduced 4 by Senator Nancy Skinner to expand California's reproductive freedom state 5 protections, Senate Bill No. 345, introduced by Senator Nancy Skinner to provide 6 additional protections to medical providers who provide reproductive healthcare 7 or gender-affirming services, Senate Bill No. 729, introduced by Senator Caroline 8 Menjivar to require that health plans cover fertility care, Assembly Bill No. 571, 9 introduced by Assembly Member Cottie Petrie-Norris to increase the number of 10 licensed healthcare providers who are able to provide abortion and gender-11 affirming care, and Assembly Bill No. 576, introduced by Assembly Member 12 Akilah Weber to require the California Department of Healthcare Services to fully 13 reimburse providers to the provision of medication abortion. 14 15 WHEREAS, California State Senate Bill Nos. 36, 345, and 729 as well as 16 California State Assembly Bill Nos. 571 and 576 constitute a sweeping legislative 17 packet that expands access to quality reproductive and gender-affirming healthcare 18 services through additional protections, increases the number of healthcare providers 19 able to perform these essential medical services, and creates new health plan coverage 20 requirements for patients receiving this care; and 21 WHEREAS, Following the Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization 22 United States Supreme Court decision, California serves as a leader in the fight against 23

the rollback of reproductive healthcare rights nationwide, as compared to other anti-

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1 choice states that have diminished or criminalized access to abortion medication,

2 reproductive healthcare services, or gender-affirming care; and

WHEREAS, Limitations and restrictions – legally enacted in some form across 18 states in the United States – to reproductive and gender-affirming care cause significant harm to the health and welfare of women; Black, Indigenous, and People of Color; lowincome individuals; the LGBTQ+ community; individuals living in rural areas; and more; and

8 WHEREAS, California State Senate Bill No. 36 expands California's reproductive 9 freedom state protections by prohibiting the capturing of people in California who have 10 fled their home states to avoid criminalization for seeking abortion or gender-affirming 11 care; and

WHEREAS, California State Senate Bill No. 345 provides additional protections
 to providers who prescribe or dispense medication abortion, provide other reproductive
 healthcare services, or provide gender affirming care to patients, regardless of where
 the patient is located; and

WHEREAS, California State Senate Bill No. 729 requires health plans to provide
coverage for fertility care, including treatment for infertility and in vitro fertilization (IVF);
and

WHEREAS, California State Assembly Bill No. 571 ensures that California
 providers have access to professional liability insurance without discrimination and thus
 increases the number of licensed healthcare providers who are able to provide abortion
 and gender-affirming care in California; and
 WHEREAS, California State Assembly Bill No. 576 requires the California
 Department of Health Care Services to fully reimburse providers for the provision of

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medication abortion that aligns with clinical guidelines, evidence-based research, and
 the discretion of the provider; and

WHEREAS, Amidst this backdrop, enacting these pieces of legislation empowers
California to continue to lead the way to protect the right to access abortion and
contraceptive care, especially for those systematically disadvantaged caused by
structural inequities; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors hereby supports
California Senate Bill Nos. 36, 345, and 729, as well as California State Assembly Bill
Nos. 571 and 576, and urges the California State Legislature to pass these bills; and be
