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3	Motion responding to the Civil Grand Jury's request to provide a status update on the
4	Board of Supervisor's response to Recommendation Nos. R1, R2, R3, R6, R7, and R8
5	contained in the 2018-2019 Civil Grand Jury Report, entitled "Act Now Before it is Too
6	Late: Aggressively Expand and Enhance Our High-Pressure Emergency Firefighting
7	Water System."
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9	WHEREAS, The 2018-2019 San Francisco Civil Grand Jury published a report, entitled
10	"Act Now Before it is Too Late: Aggressively Expand and Enhance Our High-Pressure
11	Emergency Firefighting Water System" ("Report") on July 17, 2019; and
12	WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors' Government Audit and Oversight Committee
13	("GAO") conducted a public hearing to hear and respond to the Report on
14	September 19, 2019; and, the Board of Supervisors adopted Resolution No. 422-19 on
15	October 1, 2019, reflecting the GAO responses to the Report; a copy of which is on file with
16	the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 190786; and
17	WHEREAS, Recommendation No. R1 states "By no later than December 31, 2020, the
18	Mayor, the SFPUC, the SFFD, and Office of Resilience and Capital Planning should jointly
19	present to the Board of Supervisors a detailed plan to ensure the City is well prepared to fight
20	fires in all parts of San Francisco in the event of a 1906-magnitude (7.8) earthquake;" and
21	WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors on October 1, 2019, responded in Resolution
22	No. 422-19 that Recommendation No. R1 "has not been implemented but will be implemented
23	no later than December 31, 2021, and urges the Mayor, the SFPUC, the SFFD, and Office of
24	Resilience and Capital Planning to jointly present a detailed plan to the Board of Supervisors
25	by no later than December 31, 2021;" and

WHEREAS, Recommendation No. R2 states "The plan discussed in Recommendation
 R1 should include a detailed proposal, including financing sources, for the installation
 within 15 years of a high-pressure, multi-sourced, seismically safe emergency water system
 for those parts of the City that don't currently have one, i.e., by no later than June 30, 2034;"
 and

6 WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors on October 1, 2019, responded in Resolution 7 No. 422-19 that Recommendation No. R2 "has not been implemented but will be implemented 8 by December 31, 2021, and urges the Departments to include in its detailed plan a detailed 9 proposal, including financing sources, for the installation within 15 years of a high-pressure, 10 multi-sourced, seismically safe emergency water system for those parts of the City that don't 11 currently have one by no later than June 30, 2034;" and

WHEREAS, Recommendation No. R3 states "The Board of Supervisors should direct the Budget and Legislative Analyst to study through an equity lens and issue a report to the Board regarding (a) which areas of the City do not have sufficient water supplies for the anticipated demand for water to fight fires following a major earthquake similar in magnitude to the 1906 earthquake, and (b) options to address the issue in both the short term and the long term. The Board should issue its request by no later than December 31, 2019, and the Budget and Legislative Analyst should complete its report by no later than

19 December 31, 2020;" and

20 WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors on October 1, 2019, responded in Resolution 21 No. 422-19 that Recommendation No. R3 "has not been implemented but will be implemented 22 in the future, and Supervisor Gordon Mar will issue a request for a Budget and Legislative 23 Analyst report no later than December 31, 2019, and will direct the Budget and Legislative 24 Analyst to issue the completed report no later than December 31, 2020;" and

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WHEREAS, Recommendation No. R6 states "The SFPUC, the SFFD, and the SF
 Department of the Environment should study adding salt-water pump stations to improve the
 redundancy of water sources, especially on the west side. Findings and recommendations
 from this study should be presented to the Board of Supervisors by no later than
 June 30, 2021;" and

WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors on October 1, 2019, responded in Resolution
No. 422-19 that Recommendation No. R6 "has not been implemented but will be implemented
in the future, and urges the completion of a study for adding a salt-water pump stations to be
presented to the Board of Supervisors by no later than June 30, 2021;" and

10 WHEREAS, Recommendation No. R7 states "The SFPUC should (a) continue its 11 efforts to complete a more detailed analysis of emergency firefighting water needs (including 12 above-the-median needs) by neighborhood, and not just by FRA, and (b) present a completed 13 analysis to the Board of Supervisors by no later than June 30, 2021;" and

WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors on October 1, 2019, responded in Resolution
No. 422-19 that Recommendation No. R7 "has not been implemented but will be implemented
in the future, and urges that a completed analysis be presented to the Board of Supervisors
by no later than June 30, 2021;" and

WHEREAS, Recommendation No. R8 states "By no later than June 30, 2022, the
Mayor and Board of Supervisors should analyze whether to propose a separate bond for the
development of a high-pressure, multi-sourced, seismically safe emergency water system for
those parts of the City that don't currently have one, with a target date of completing
construction by no later than June 30, 2034;" and
WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors on October 1, 2019, responded in Resolution

No. 422-19 that Recommendation No. R8 "has not been implemented but will be implemented in the future, and will analyze by June 30, 2022, in coordination with the Mayor, whether to propose a separate bond for the development of a high-pressure, multi-sourced, seismically
 safe emergency water system for those parts of the City that don't currently have one, with a
 target date of completing construction by no later than June 30, 2034;" and

WHEREAS, The GAO Committee conducted an additional hearing on July 16, 2020, to
receive an update from City departments on Recommendation Nos. R1, R2, R3, R6, R7 and
R8; now, therefore, be it

MOVED, That the Board of Supervisors reports that Recommendation R1 has been
implemented, as the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission (SFPUC), San Francisco Fire
Department (SFFD), and Office of Resilience and Capital Planning (ORCP) jointly presented
such report to the Government Audit and Oversight (GAO) Committee on July 16, 2020; and
be it

12 FURTHER MOVED, That the Board of Supervisors reports that Recommendation R2 13 has been implemented, as the Budget and Legislative Analyst submitted a policy analysis 14 report analyzing potential financing sources to the file on November 17, 2021, and on 15 December 19, 2021, the SFPUC submitted its Emergency Firefighting Water System (EFWS) 16 2050 Planning Study, which included analysis of potential costs, uses of saltwater or 17 freshwater, and various timing options for implementation of EFWS improvements; and be it 18 FURTHER MOVED, That the Board of Supervisors reports that Recommendation R3 19 has been implemented, as the Board requested that the BLA report on this issue through 20 Resolution No. 484-19, approved on November 27, 2019, and the BLA issued its report for the 21 file on November 17, 2021; and be it 22 FURTHER MOVED, That the Board of Supervisors reports that Recommendation R6 23 has been implemented, as the SFPUC submitted its EFWS Seawater Supply study to address 24 this recommendation on June 4, 2021, and later submitted its EFWS 2050 Planning Study,

25 which included further analysis of possible EFWS improvements; and be it

FURTHER MOVED, That the Board of Supervisors reports that Recommendation R7 has been implemented, as the SFPUC submitted its Earthquake Water Requirements report to address this recommendation on June 7, 2021, and later submitted its EFWS 2050 Planning Study, which included further analysis of possible EFWS improvements; and be it FURTHER MOVED, That the Board of Supervisors reports that Recommendation R8 has been implemented, as ORCP published its EFWS Financing Study, which analyzed potential uses of bonds to finance EFWS improvements, on April 3, 2022, and performed further analysis of such bonds in its 10-Year Capital Plan, which was approved by the Board of Supervisors on May 9, 2023.
