


Under the proposed amendment, Richmond Area Multi-Services, Inc (RAMS) would continue to provide:


- Early Childhood Mental Health Consultation Initiative (ECMHCI) Fu Yau Project:
 Provides mental health consultation to childcare setting providers, to increase their capacity to understand and prevent emotional disturbance and provide early intervention for children under their care.
- **Children Outpatient**: Provides outpatient specialty mental health services to youth, who have public insurance, and their families, including Educationally Related Mental Health Services (ERMHS).
- Children, Youth & Family Outpatient Services School-Based Partnership: Provide outpatient services to students with severe emotional disturbance (SED) who are in a SOAR (Success, Opportunity, Achievement and Resiliency) classroom; other special education students that have identified mental health needs; and provide support to school staff to increase student engagement in learning and school connection.

RAMS Programs in the Children, Youth, and Families System of Care

These services are contracted with the SFDPH BHS Children, Youth, & Families (CYF) system of care

ECMHCI Fu Yau Project

- CYF funds 4 ECMHCI programs for prevention/early intervention services, serving >6,600 clients
- RAMS is contracted for ~38% (2,500 clients).
- Referred by childcare providers/staff
- Serves children ages 0-5 from underserved families and childcare staff at 73 childcare sites
 - Focus on AAPI
- ECMHCI participants who are determined to need treatment are referred to outpatient care within the CYF system



Children Outpatient

- CYF currently contracts with 24 programs, across 19 agencies, for outpatient mental health services, serving >1,600 clients.
- RAMS is contracted to serve ~10% (160 clients)
- Can self-refer, be referred by access points, community, or providers within BHS system of care
- Serves youth up to 21 who are beneficiaries of public health insurance and their families
- Includes ERMHS
- May be referred to a higher level of care, if needed

RAMS Programs in the Children, Youth, and Families System of Care

Children, Youth & Family Outpatient Services School-Based Partnership

- CYF funds 2 SOAR programs, serving 125 clients
- RAMS is contracted for ~50% (65 clients)
- Referred by SFUSD
- Serves high school students at 5 special day classes who have exhibited significant mental health challenges that impact their education
 - Abraham Lincoln, Thurgood Marshall, George Washington, Mission, Galileo High Schools
- Clients may access different levels of care within the CYF system, as needed

Proposed Resolution

- DPH agrees with BLA recommendation to reduce the not to exceed amount of the proposed resolution to \$30.9 million.
- DPH requests approval of proposed Amendment No. 3 to the agreement between RAMS and DPH as amended
