12	Section	n 1. Findings.	
13	(a)	The Wild Parrots of San Francisco, which belong to the species Psittacara	
14	Erythrogenys	are a unique and beloved feature of San Francisco's natural environment.	
15	(b)	Commonly known as the Cherry-headed Conures within the pet industry, and	
16	the Red-mask	ked Parakeets by ornithologists, the Wild Parrots of San Francisco are originally	
17	from Ecuador	and Peru, but have made their home in our City.	
18	(c)	The Wild Parrots of San Francisco have become a symbol of the city's diversity,	
19	sociability, an	d resilience, having adapted to life in an urban environment.	
20	(d)	The Wild Parrots of San Francisco are a reminder of the importance of	
21	appreciating t	he natural world, and the need to support efforts to conserve wildlife and natural	
22	habitats.		
23	(e)	While there are wild parrots living in every major city in the world, the Wild	
24	Parrots of San Francisco have their own language dialect, with a specific system of calls and		
25			

1	responses that are distinct from conure populations found elsewhere, making them truly				
2	unique to San Francisco.				
3	(f) The Wild Parrots of San Francisco are raucous and noisy, wild and free, and				
4	travel in tightknit flocks that exhibit acts of solidarity, much like their human San Franciscan				
5	counterparts, who are known for their vocal public input, fierce independence, and deep love				
6	of community.				
7					
8	Section 2. Chapter 1 of the Administrative Code is hereby amended by adding Section				
9	1.5-5, to read as follows:				
10	SEC. 1.5-5. OFFICIAL ANIMAL DESIGNATED.				
11	The wild parrot is hereby designated as the official animal of the City and County of San				
12	Francisco.				
13					
14	Section 3. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after				
15	enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the				
16	ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board				
17	of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.
