Our Achievements


- **Trial Success:** Obtained acquittals, dismissals, hangs or mixed verdicts in approx. 85% of the cases we tried.
- Clean Slate Expansion: Established partnerships leading to monthly community clinics. Continuing assistance with expungements and clears clients' criminal records for 708 clients last year.
- **Be the Jury:** Launched in March 2022, eliminates financial hardships so low-income jurors can serve on juries. To date, over 800 participants have successfully enrolled.
- Immigration Win: In 2021/22, assisted with a federal case winning a groundbreaking settlement, requiring immigration authorities to preserve COVID-19 safety measures and freeing hundreds of people from immigration detention.
- Policy to End Racially Biased Traffic Stops: In 2022-23, worked with community partners to limit police from stopping community members for nine categories of vehicle code violations. Estimated to lead to 10K fewer pretext traffic stops a year, lowering arrest rates.



Budget For Justice






FY2023-2024 PDR Budget

Average caseloads for line attorneys




Causes:

- 1) Ongoing Trial Delays
- 2) Increase in felony and misdemeanor filings by the DA's Office
- 3) Drastic reduction in referrals to diversion programs and specialty courts
- 4) Increase workloads due to changes in the state law (e.g. Racial Justice Act and Mental Health Diversion) AND body-worn camera, video surveillance footage and cell phone technology.

Call For Equity

*General Fund Allocation, Excludes Grant Funding



District Attorney's Office budget at **\$80 million** is almost **two times** larger than PDR.*

At **\$223 million**, the Sheriff's Department budget is **five times** larger than PDR.*

At \$619 million, the Police Department budget is **thirteen times** larger than PDR.*
