WHEREAS, According to a 2022 Point in Time count, San Francisco has over 7,700 people experiencing homelessness on our streets, making this is an urgent public health crisis, and is one of the most pressing issues facing our City; and

WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco has limited resources to solve the city's homelessness crisis on our own, and to meaningfully address the homelessness crisis we must work with federal and state partner agencies; and

WHEREAS, On May 18, 2023, the White House launched the ALL INside Initiative, a federal strategic plan to prevent and end homelessness with the goal of reducing homelessness by 25% by the year 2025 and ultimately build a country where everyone has a safe affordable home; and

WHEREAS, The ALL INside Initiative builds a partnership between the U.S. Interagency Council on Homelessness (USICH) and 19 federal member agencies to accelerate local efforts to move people off of the streets and into homes; and

WHEREAS, The ALL INside Initiative specifically targets five cities across the United States, Chicago, Dallas, Los Angeles, Phoenix Metro, and Seattle as well as the State of California; and

WHEREAS, The strategy of the ALL INside Initiative includes embedding a dedicated federal official in each participating community to offer knowledge and resources and provide "tailored support" to accelerate locally-driven strategies and enact system-level changes to reduce unsheltered homelessness; and

WHEREAS, The ALL INside Initiative seeks to reduce barriers to housing, health care, and other support for people experiencing unsheltered homelessness by deploying resources across federal agencies including identifying opportunities to navigate federal funding streams, leverage data-sharing, and breakdown layers of regulations; and

WHEREAS, The ALL INside Initiative draws on a \$486 million package of grants administered by the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development which sets aside \$36 million for communities across California; and

WHEREAS, On May 17, 2023, San Francisco Mayor London N. Breed joined the California Big City Mayors coalition to call on State leaders to continue funding to address the statewide homelessness crisis; and

WHEREAS, The California Big City Mayors coalition requested \$2 billion a year in ongoing funding through the Homelessness Housing, Assistance, and Prevention (HHAP) grant program which can be used to build new housing, providing operating costs for shelter beds, supporting youth drop-in centers, delivering enhanced services at shelters, and other urgent needs; and

WHEREAS, The Big City Mayors coalition also advocated for an additional \$1.5 billion in funding for Project Homekey to help cities purchase more buildings to provide housing for formerly homeless individuals; and

WHEREAS, To date, San Francisco has acquired six properties totaling 799 units using Homekey funding; and

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Department on Homelessness and Supportive
Housing has a singular focus on preventing and ending homelessness for people in San
Francisco; and

WHEREAS, San Francisco recently launched "Home by the Bay", a strategic plan to cut homelessness in half over the next five years through increased investment in housing, shelter, and prevention services; and

WHEREAS, Homelessness in the San Francisco Bay Area does not have city or county limits; and

WHEREAS, San Francisco offers services and support to more individuals experiencing homelessness than its neighboring counties; and

WHEREAS, In order to combat the regional crisis of homelessness in the Bay Area, there should be a strategic regional response, including shared county resources, shared county data, and coordination with local health care systems, including but not limited to providing shelter and health care facilities beyond city boundaries; and

WHEREAS, Due to San Francisco's high cost of living, we must continue to ensure that residents are not getting priced out of their homes and put onto the streets; and

WHEREAS, Increased assistance from the Biden Administration and the State of California can help the City and County of San Francisco expedite the process of getting individuals into long term housing; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors urges the Biden

Administration to specifically direct funding and resources through the ALL INside Initiative to

San Francisco to develop a tailored plan to addressing unsheltered homelessness; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors reaffirms Mayor London Breed's request for increased state funding and urges the Newsom Administration to

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FURTHER RESOLVED, That San Francisco Board of Supervisors urges the San Francisco Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing to develop a regional strategic response across the nine Bay Area Counties to share resources including access to data, services, and coordinated responses in responding to the regional homeless crisis; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit a copy of this Resolution to President Joe Biden, Governor Gavin Newsom, the San Francisco Federal Legislative Delegation, San Francisco's State Legislative Delegation, the City and County of San Francisco State Lobbyist, the USICH Director of National Initiatives, Beverley Ebersold, and the San Francisco Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing.
