Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

Section 1. Findings.

- (a) The Wild Parrots of San Francisco, which belong to the species Psittacara Erythrogenys, are a unique and beloved feature of San Francisco's natural environment.
- (b) Commonly known as the Cherry-headed Conures within the pet industry, and the Red-masked Parakeets by ornithologists, the Wild Parrots of San Francisco are originally from Ecuador and Peru, but have made their home in our City.
- (c) The Wild Parrots of San Francisco have become a symbol of the city's diversity, sociability, and resilience, having adapted to life in an urban environment.
- (d) The Wild Parrots of San Francisco are a reminder of the importance of appreciating the natural world, and the need to support efforts to conserve wildlife and natural habitats.
- (e) While there are wild parrots living in every major city in the world, the Wild Parrots of San Francisco have their own language dialect, with a specific system of calls and

responses that are distinct from conure populations found elsewhere, making them truly unique to San Francisco.

(f) The Wild Parrots of San Francisco are raucous and noisy, wild and free, and travel in tightknit flocks that exhibit acts of solidarity, much like their human San Franciscan counterparts, who are known for their vocal public input, fierce independence, and deep love of community.

Section 2. Chapter 1 of the Administrative Code is hereby amended by adding Section 1.5-5, to read as follows:

SEC. 1.5-5. OFFICIAL ANIMAL DESIGNATED.

The wild parrot is hereby designated as the official animal of the City and County of San Francisco.

Section 3. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.
