

## Hearing on Accidental Overdoses HSH Harm Reduction and Overdose Prevention

## **Overview**

- ► We are in a **national overdose epidemic**, and continue to respond with a sense of urgency.
- → All HSH-funded programs across our system of care are committed to serving and being accessible to people using substances.
- HSH has continued to implement our Overdose Prevention Policy required under Ordinance No. 084-21, which includes required trainings, public postings and protocols for both HSH and our contracted nonprofit providers.
  - In July 2023, HSH entered into a grant agreement with National Harm Reduction Coalition (the **DOPE Project**) to provide specialized training and technical assistance to homeless service providers.
- ► In 2022, HSH launched Critical Incident Report (CIR) dashboards for Shelter and Housing, to support data collection and analyzation of critical incidents, including overdoses.
  - Data reflects the critical need for ongoing harm reduction and overdose prevention training and resources for non-profit providers who are on the front lines of reversing and preventing overdoses.



## HSH Overdose Data – FY 2022-23

- There were 234 overdoses reported in HSH funded shelter and housing in FY 2022-23, 60% of which were reversed.
- HSH is working with the Controller's Office to develop more effective metrics around this data to better inform policies and investment in resources.
- There were 67 overdoses reported across 40 permanent supportive housing sites in FY 2022-23.
  - 34 (51%) were reversed
  - 12 (18%) resulted in a known fatality
  - 68% of sites reporting had 1 overdose.
- ←There were 167 overdoses reported across 28 shelter sites in FY 2022-23.
  - 131 (58%) were reversed
  - 5 (3%) resulted in a known fatality
  - 32% of sites had 1 overdose, and 46% of sites had under 10.
