[Maintenance Agreement - State of California, Department of Transportation, Caltrans - Southern Skyline Boulevard Ridge Trail Extension Project]

Resolution approving the terms and conditions and authorizing the execution of the no-cost Project Specific Maintenance Agreement with the State of California,

Department of Transportation, for San Francisco Public Utilities Commission's ongoing maintenance of its proposed improvements at 18 locations within Caltrans' right-of-way along a six-mile section of State Route 35, south of State Route 92, in San Mateo County, California, for the Southern Skyline Boulevard Ridge Trail Extension Project, subject to Board of Supervisors' approval under Charter, Section 9.118.

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Public Utilities Commission (SFPUC) has developed and funded the Southern Skyline Boulevard Ridge Trail Extension Project (Project) under the Water Enterprise 10-year Capital Improvement Program to improve and construct recreational trails and associated facilities within the Peninsula Watershed in San Mateo County on Cityowned land under the SFPUC's jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, On May 10, 2022, the Board of Supervisors adopted Resolution No. 195-22 authorizing the SFPUC to accept and expend a \$1,000,000 grant from the Metropolitan Transportation Commission, with funds from the Federal Highway Administration for the Project; and

WHEREAS, The Project includes a new six-mile long trail aligned roughly parallel to Skyline Boulevard, a two-lane state highway under the California Department of Transportation's (Caltrans) jurisdiction, officially known as California State Route 35 (SR-35); and

WHEREAS, Due to the potential impact of the Project on SR-35, SFPUC staff invited Caltrans to review the 18 locations where Project improvements would fall within the SR-35 right-of-way through a Standard Caltrans Encroachment Permit Application; and

WHEREAS, Caltrans requires an encroachment permit to construct Project improvements at eight of the 18 locations within Caltrans right-of-way, and, as a condition of the encroachment permit, Caltrans requires that the SFPUC enter into a Project Specific Maintenance Agreement (Agreement) with Caltrans to allocate responsibility to the SFPUC for maintenance of the Project improvements at all 18 locations within Caltrans right-of-way; and

WHEREAS, A delay in adopting the Resolution will delay Caltrans from issuing an encroachment permit for the construction of the Project; and

WHEREAS, There is no cost to the SFPUC for the Agreement, and the Agreement would remain in effect until amended or terminated at any time upon mutual consent of the parties to the Agreement or until terminated by Caltrans for cause if permitted under the relevant deed, resulting in an indefinite duration that could exceed 10 years, which is one of Caltrans' nonnegotiable conditions for the Agreement and approval of the encroachment permit; and

WHEREAS, Under the Agreement, the SFPUC will be solely responsible, at its own expense, for the maintenance of all 18 Project improvements within the SR-35 right-of-way, including, but not limited to, structural adequacy, graffiti removal, sweeping, debris removal, and signage required for the direction and operation of the improvements; and

WHEREAS, On April 29, 2021, the Planning Commission certified the Final Environmental Impact Report for the Project by Motion No. 20900 (Planning Department Case No. 2016-016100ENV); and

WHEREAS, The San Mateo County Planning Commission found the Project consistent with the San Mateo General Plan on December 9, 2020; and

WHEREAS, On May 11, 2021, by Resolution No. 21-0077, the SFPUC approved the Project and, as required by the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), adopted findings including a statement of overriding considerations (CEQA findings) and a Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program; and

WHEREAS, The work to be conducted under the Agreement is within the scope of the Project as authorized under the Final Environmental Impact Report; and

WHEREAS, On June 13, 2023, by Resolution No. 23-0116, the SFPUC approved the terms and conditions of the no cost Agreement with Caltrans for ongoing maintenance supporting proposed improvements at 18 locations within Caltrans right-of-way along a six-mile section of State Route 35, south of State Route 92, in San Mateo County, California; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors has reviewed and considered the information contained in the Final Environment Impact Report (including appendices), CEQA Findings, Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program, and SFPUC Resolution No. 21-0077, and all written and oral information provided by the Planning Department, the public, relevant public agencies, SFPUC staff and other experts and the administrative files for the Project; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors further finds that since the Final Environmental Impact Report was certified there have been no substantial Project changes and no substantial changes in Project circumstances that would require major revisions to the Final Environmental Impact Report due to the involvement of new significant environmental effects or an increase in the severity of previously identified significant impacts, and there is no new information of substantial importance that would change the conclusions set forth in the Final Environmental Impact Report; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors herby approves the terms and conditions of the no cost-Project Specific Maintenance Agreement pursuant to Charter, Section 9.118, and authorizes the SFPUC General Manager to execute the no cost Agreement with the State of California, Department of Transportation, for ongoing maintenance supporting proposed improvements by the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission at 18 locations within Caltrans right-of-way along a six-mile section of State Route 35, south of State Route 92, in San Mateo County, California, at no cost to the City and with an indefinite duration that may exceed 10 years; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That within thirty (30) days of the execution of the Project Specific Maintenance Agreement, the General Manager of the SFPUC shall provide the signed Agreement to the Clerk of the Board for inclusion in the official file.
