 [Accept and Expend Grant - Retroactive - California State Coastal Conservancy - 900 Innes Redevelopment Project - \$5,100,000]

3 Resolution retroactively authorizing the Recreation and Park Department to accept and expend a grant from the California State Coastal Conservancy for a term effective upon 4 5 execution of the Grant Agreement through December 31, 2024, in the amount of \$5,100,000 for the 900 Innes Redevelopment Project; approving the associated grant 6 7 agreement; approving the recording of a deed restriction that prohibits residential use 8 and commercial uses defined as "sensitive" on the property in perpetuity; and 9 authorizing the Recreation and Park Department to enter into amendments or 10 modifications to the agreement that do not materially increase the obligations or 11 liabilities of the City and are necessary to effectuate the purposes of the Project or this 12 **Resolution.**

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WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco owns the 900 Innes Property
("Property"), and has placed the Property under the jurisdiction of the Recreation and Park
Department ("RPD"); and

17 WHEREAS, RPD is pursuing a project to remediate the Property and to include the 18 Property as part of the India Basin Waterfront Parks Initiative, a partnership with the Trust for Public Land (TPL), the San Francisco Park Alliance (SFPA), and Bayview Hunters Point 19 20 (BVHP) community, and others, to develop a new park that when completed will reflect the 21 values and the culture of the BVHP community, and will provide public access and new 22 waterfront recreation for the community at large; and 23 WHEREAS, RPD has completed remediation on the Property under a series of federal 24 and state grants, including a grant from the Environmental Protection Agency ("EPA") that the

25 Board of Supervisors approved via Resolution No. 396-19, and the EPA requires in exchange

1 for its financial support that RPD must record a deed restriction on the Property to establish

- 2 that the Property will prohibit residential use, and certain commercial uses defined as
- 3 "sensitive uses" in perpetuity; and
- WHEREAS, Sensitive uses consist of (a) a hospital for humans, (b) a public or private
 school for persons less than 18 years of age, (c) a day care center for children, or (d) any
 permanently occupied habitation other than those used for industrial purposes; and
- 7 WHEREAS, The Project was initiated in Fall 2022 and is currently in construction with
 8 completion anticipated Summer 2024; and
- 9 WHEREAS, To help complete the design and development of the Property, RPD has
- also applied for a \$5,100,000 grant from the California State Coastal Conservancy ("SCC"),
- 11 which administers grant programs that support Climate Resilience, Public Access, Habitat
- 12 Restoration, and Wildfire Resilience (the "SCC Grant"); and
- WHEREAS, On September 14, the SCC Board authorized grant funding in the amount
 of \$5,100,000 for the Project; and
- 15 WHEREAS, On September 21, 2023, the San Francisco Recreation and Park 16 Commission adopted Resolution No. 2309-006 approving the RPD's application for the SCC 17 Grant, authorizing the RPD General Manager to negotiate agreements with the State 18 concerning the administration of the grants, and recommending that the Board of Supervisors 19 approve the grant contract and authorize RPD to accept and expend the grants; and 20 WHEREAS, As a condition of receiving the SCC Grant, RPD is required to agree to 21 Grant Contract substantially in the form as the draft contract which is on file with the Clerk of 22 the Board under File No. 231169 and which is hereby declared to be part of this Resolution as 23 if set forth fully herein; and

1	WHEREAS, As a further condition of receiving the SCC Grant, the SCC requires the			
2	City maintain and operate the Project for a period of 20-years commencing upon Project			
3	completion; and			
4	WHEREAS, The SCC Grant terms prohibit including indirect costs in the grant budget;			
5	and			
6	WHEREAS, The SCC Grant will not require an amendment to the Annual Salary			
7	Ordinance; now, therefore, be it			
8	RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors authorizes the Recreation and Park			
9	Department to accept and expend the SCC Grant; and, be it			
10	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby waives inclusion of			
11	indirect costs as part of this grant budget; and, be it			
12	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors approves the SCC Grant			
13	Contract; and, be it			
14	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors authorizes the General			
15	Manager to record a deed restriction as required by the EPA, on the Property to establish that			
16	the Property will prohibit residential use, and certain commercial uses defined as "sensitive			
17	uses" in perpetuity; and, be it			
18	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors authorizes the RPD General			
19	Manager to enter into any modifications and amendments to the SCC Grant Contract			
20	including to any of its exhibits, and authorizes the RPD General Manager to execute further			
21	agreements related to the Grant, that the RPD General Manager determines, in consultation			
22	with the City Attorney, are in the best interests of the City and do not materially increase the			
23	obligations or liabilities of the City, are necessary or advisable to effectuate the purposes of			
24	the Project or this Resolution, and are in compliance with all applicable laws, including the			
25	City's Charter; and, be it			

1	FURTHER RESOLVED, That within 30 days of the Grant Contract being fully execute				
2	by all parties, RPD shall provide the fi	nal Grant Contra	act to the Clerk of the Board for inclusio	n	
3	in the official file.
