17	WHEREAS, Following the brutal attack by Hamas militants on Israelis on October 7,
18	2023, San Francisco Israelis, Jews and others have experienced, and continue to experience,
19	shock, trauma, grief, and fear, compounded by rising antisemitism in our nation and our city;

Dear San Francisco Supervisors,

Today, I stood in line at City Hall to make public comment in favor of the resolution calling for an immediate ceasefire in Gaza. After three hours, I had to leave to teach my Poetry for the People class at City College of San Francisco, so I am writing to you now.

I write to you as a proud resident of District Nine since 1995 and a San Francisco educator, poet, and artist since 1990. I am an Indian Muslim who married into a Filipino, Salvadoran, and African-American family that has been in The City since the 1930's. I've had the privilege of raising a son into adulthood here in our city. I've taught citizenship in senior centers, poetry in elementary schools, and I currently teach poetry at City College.

I would like to share an excerpt of a poem from Gaza:

I shelter you and the children who are sleeping as chicks in the lap of their nest they don't walk in their dreams because death towards the house walks

. . . .

I shelter you from wound and woe, and with seven verses I shield the taste of orange from phosphorus, the color of clouds from smoke.

Ten days after Hiba Abu Nada published this poem, she was killed in Gaza on October 20. She was 32 years old. She had degrees in organic chemistry and clinical nutrition. She was a person -- with hopes, dreams, and a sense of purpose -- just like us. She mattered. Since October 8, Israel has killed 16,000 people, including 8,000 children. Each of them was a person with a purpose in the world. Each one of them had hopes and dreams -- a child who read books and played soccer, a teen with a first crush, a baby learning to talk. Each one of

them mattered.

How is it that 2000 of us have to come out en masse to call for a ceasefire? Shouldn't it be a no-brainer? What kind of a world are we living in? Clearly some people believe that Palestinian humanity is worth less than Israeli humanity. Otherwise, how could any of us allow this to happen?

If half of San Francisco, with the support of the US military, dropped bombs on the other half, what would we do? What would we say?

I implore you to pass this resolution next Tuesday, without delay.

I wanted to provide you with a copy of what I would have said had there been more time. While my comments did provide the gist of this statement, here is the full statement. I sincerely hope that the San Francisco Board of Supervisors can find a way to get the resolution passed before the Board takes what is not available to the Palestinians - a well deserved break!

My name is Laura Goldin. I am an almost 40 year resident of District 1. I am also a privileged Jewish woman.

Germany rounded up Jews, suspected homosexuals, black people, treated them like animals, transported them to camps where they were either gassed or starved and died from horrible, preventable diseases.

During the 2023 2nd Nakba, the Israeli government is ordering Palestinians from their homes, bombing their homes, mosques, camps, hospitals, denying Palestinians access to food, water, fuel. Palestinians are ordered from their homes to locations deemed safe by the Israelis. There the Israelis bomb them. Those that aren't bombed are starving and suffering from horrible, preventable diseases.

Benjamin Netanyahu has acknowledged that he is engaging in ethnic cleansing, stating that the Palestinian numbers must be "thinned", that they can go from their traditional homes "into the sea"; that they must leave. His ministers have referred to Palestinians as animals. The IDF – his military – jeer at Palestinian suffering, erect menorahs in places where people's homes have been reduced to rubble, make videos mocking the lack of water, force people to act in accord with their wishes or be shot.

Dear Board of Supervisors,

On behalf of the San Francisco Women's Political Committee (SFWPC), we are writing in strong support of a resolution calling for an immediate ceasefire in Gaza. As an organization that champions policies that advance intersectional feminism and racial justice, we are deeply saddened by the situation in Gaza. We urge the Board of Supervisors to affirm the values of San Francisco as a city of peace, freedom and love, and take a firm stand for peace in Gaza.

We mourn the deaths of the I,400 Israelis at the hands of Hamas, and we fear for the lives of the hostages. However, the atrocities committed on October 7th do not provide moral cover for the genocide of Palestinians in Gaza by the Israeli army. We call for the return of all the Israeli hostages, the end of the bombing and for the coordinated entry of humanitarian aid in Gaza, as well as for the U.S. government to stop enabling the genocide of Palestinians through military aid and unconditional support to the Israeli government. We believe that it is the duty of San Francisco to join other cities and counties all over the country and call for the Federal government to stop funding the war in Gaza.

International organizations have warned that the escalation of the conflict is disproportionately affecting women and newborns, as they represent 67% of the casualties in the Gaza Strip. The World Health Organization (WHO) has published



that 420 children have been killed or injured every day since the beginning of the bombings¹. Recently, the WHO disclosed that a child is killed or injured every 10 minutes in Gaza. The United Nations have reported that if no ceasefire is achieved, these numbers will continue to rise. We are heartbroken thinking of the conditions that women, children, and families are living under the siege of the Palestinian territory, and we condemn the resulting large-scale humanitarian and health crisis that mainly affects civilians. Not only are they under the constant threat of bombings and hunger due to the siege, but the risk of gender-based violence is heightened, as highlighted by multiple reports from the UN Women's Rapid Assessment and Humanitarian Response in Palestine².

We cautiously celebrated the temporary ceasefire, and we are disappointed in the resumption of violence. We want to reiterate what we ALL know: temporary solutions are not enough to bring long-term peace and stability. We fully understand that the situation is complex. However, we are convinced that a long-term ceasefire on all sides is the first step to achieving peace, as well as any sustainable solution for both Israelis and Palestinians. It is also essential to call for peace at a time of rising antisemitism and Islamophobia in our own country, and show our commitment to the safety of both our Jewish and Muslim neighbors. Many organizations, as well as millions of protesters in the United States, have now called Congress and the White House to demand a ceasefire. It is time elected officials at every level of government listen to the calls for peace and take a strong position.

We urge you to support a resolution calling for an immediate ceasefire in Gaza and humanitarian aid in Gaza. By supporting such a resolution, you will make sure that our city unequivocally rejects hatred and war, and embodies San Franciscans' values of peace and openness.
