11	Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:		
12			
13	Section 1. Background.		
14	(a) Administrative Code Chapter 19B establishes requirements that City departments		
15	must follow before they may use or acquire new Surveillance Technology, as defined in		
16	Section 19B.1. Under Chapter 19B, a City department must obtain Board of Supervisors		
17	approval by ordinance of a Surveillance Technology Policy, also as defined in Section 19.1,		
18	before it may seek funding for, acquire or borrow, use, or enter into an agreement with a non-		
19	City entity to use, Surveillance Technology.		
20	(b) With the enactment of Ord. No. 205-22, the Board of Supervisors approved the		
21	Police Department's Non-City Entity Surveillance Cameras Policy ("Policy"), subject to		
22	numerous modifications set forth in that ordinance. A copy of the Policy as modified and		
23	approved is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in Board File No. 220606.		

(c) Section 4 of Ord. No. 205-22 provides that "unless reauthorized by ordinance, the

SFPD Non-City Entity Surveillance Cameras Policy, as modified herein, shall expire fifteen

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1	months after the effective date of this ordinance." Pursuant to that provision, the Policy is		
2	scheduled to expire on February 6, 2024.		
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4	Section 2. Continued Approval of Policy.		
5	The Board of Supervisors hereby rescinds Section 4 of Ord. No.205-22, thereby		
6	eliminating the sunset provision that would cause the SFPD policy to expire on February 6,		
7	2024, and hereby extends its approval of such Policy, as modified by Ord. No. 205-22.		
8			
9	Section 3. Effective Date; Retroactivity.		
10	(a) This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after enactment. Enactment occurs		
11	when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the ordinance unsigned or does not		
12	sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board of Supervisors overrides the		
13	Mayor's veto of the ordinance.		
14	(b) Upon its effective date, this ordinance shall be retroactive to February 6, 2024.		
15	Any use of non-City entity surveillance cameras by the Police Department between February		
16	6, 2024 and the effective date of this ordinance that is consistent with the Policy shall be		
17	deemed authorized.
