Resolution retroactively authorizing the Department of Children, Youth and Their Families to accept and expend a grant in the amount of \$1,000,000 from the United States Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, Bureau of Justice Assistance, for participation in a program, entitled "STOP School Violence Program," for the period of October 2, 2023, through October 1, 2026; the funds will enhance the current San Francisco School Crisis Support Coordination Project to improve San Francisco Unified School District's school climate.

WHEREAS, The Department of Children, Youth and Their Families (DCYF) was awarded a grant in the amount of \$1,000,000 by the United States Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, Bureau of Justice Assistance for participation in a program, entitled "STOP School Violence Program;" and

WHEREAS, A request for retroactive approval is being sought because DCYF received the award on September 28, 2023, for a project start date of October 2, 2023; and

WHEREAS, The grant funds these activities for the period beginning October 2, 2023, through October 1, 2026, and will hire additional staff to be based in the San Francisco Unified School District (SFUSD); purchase data collection software; develop a San Francisco Youth Violence Prevention Public Service Announcement campaign; mobilize a Social Media Task Force; and continue training and capacity building of school violence interrupters, school personnel, and probation officers; and

WHEREAS, The grant does not require an Annual Salary Ordinance Amendment; and WHEREAS, DCYF proposes to maximize use of available grant funds on program expenditures by not including indirect costs in the grant budget; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors authorizes DCYF to accept and expend the grant in the amount of \$1,000,000 from the United States Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, Bureau of Justice Assistance to enhance the current San Francisco School Crisis Support Coordination Project to improve SFUSD's school climate; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby waives inclusion of indirect costs in the grant budget; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes the Mayor or alternatively the Executive Director of DCYF to enter into, execute, and deliver any and all documents required or deemed necessary or appropriate to be awarded the STOP School Violence Program award, and all amendments thereto, and the Grant Agreement with the Office of Justice Programs, Bureau of Justice Assistance; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That grant funds received hereunder shall not be used to supplant expenditures controlled by this body; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the City and County of San Francisco agrees to abide by the terms and conditions of the Grant Agreement as set forth by the United States Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, Bureau of Justice Assistance; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That within thirty (30) days of the agreement being fully executed by all parties, DCYF shall provide a copy to the Clerk of the Board for inclusion into the official file.
