Ordinance amending Article 12-A of the San Francisco Business and Tax Regulations Code by adding Section 906.3-1 to establish a Citizen's Advisory Committee for the Central Market Street and Tenderloin Area.

Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

Section 1. Findings. The Board of Supervisors hereby finds that:

- (a) In April 2011, the Board of Supervisors approved the Central Market Street and Tenderloin Area Payroll Expense Tax Exclusion.
- (b) Under the Central Market Street and Tenderloin Area Payroll Expense Tax Exclusion, a person with an annual payroll expense of more than \$1,000,000 must enter into a Community Benefits Agreement with the City Administrator in order to be eligible to claim the exclusion.
- (c) Residents of the Central Market Street and Tenderloin Area have a unique understanding of the needs and issues of their community.
- (d) Residents of the Central Market Street and Tenderloin Area are aware of the resources their community can provide to taxpayers wishing to claim the Central Market Street and Tenderloin Area Payroll Expense Tax Exclusion.
- (e) Residents of the Central Market Street and Tenderloin Area are congnizant of how development as a result of the Central Market Street and Tenderloin Area Payroll Expense Tax Exclusion may affect their community and have ideas on ways to mitigate its potentially unwanted effects.

Section 2. The San Francisco Business and Tax Regulations Code is hereby amended by adding Section 906.3-1, to read as follows:

# <u>SEC. 906.3-1. CENTRAL MARKET STREET AND TENDERLOIN AREA CITIZEN'S</u> ADVISORY COMMITTEE.

- (a) There shall be a Central Market Street and Tenderloin Area Citizen's Advisory

  Committee.
- (b) The Citizen's Advisory Committee shall be an advisory body whose purpose is to make recommendations to the Mayor and Board of Supervisors on policies and programs that mitigate the negative effects of development and seek to stabilize and protect existing tenants and small businesses in and around the Central Market Street and Tenderloin Area.
  - (c) Duties of the Citizen's Advisory Committee may include:
- (1) Advise the Mayor, City Administrator, and Office of Economic and Workforce

  Development of community issues in order to better align the Community Benefits Agreements called

  for under the Central Market Street and Tenderloin Area Payroll Expense Tax Exclusion with the

  community needs.
- (2) Make recommendations to the Mayor, City Administrator, and Office of

  Economic and Workforce Development about terms and conditions in the Community Benefits

  Agreements called for under the Central Market Street and Tenderloin Area Payroll Expense Tax

  Exclusion.

- (7) One member with expertise on homelessness, transitional age youth, or supportive housing and familiarity with the Central Market Street and Tenderloin Area.
  - (e) Each member shall be nominated by the District Six Supervisor.
  - (f) Each member shall be confirmed by the Board of Supervisors.
- (g) The members of the Citizen's Advisory Committee shall be appointed for a term of four years; provided, however, that members first appointed shall, by lot at the first meeting, classify their terms so that three shall serve for a term of two years and four shall serve for a term of four years. At the initial meeting of the Citizen's Advisory Committee and yearly thereafter, the Citizen's Advisory Committee members shall select such officer or officers as deemed necessary by the Citizen's Advisory Committee. The Citizen's Advisory Committee shall promulgate such rules and regulations as are necessary for the conduct of its business under this Section. In the event a vacancy occurs, a successor shall be appointed to fill the vacancy consistent with the process and requirements to appoint the previous appointee. When a vacancy occurs for a reason other than the expiration of a term of office, the appointee to fill such vacancy shall hold office for the unexpired term of his or her predecessor. Any appointee who misses four meetings within a twelve-month period, without the approval of the Citizen's Advisory Committee, shall be deemed to have resigned.
- (h) The Citizen's Advisory Committee shall comply with all applicable public records and meetings laws and shall be subject to the Conflict of Interest provisions of the City's Charter and Administrative Code. The initial meeting of the Citizen's Advisory Committee shall be called within 30 days from the day the Board of Supervisors confirms its initial appointments. The City Administrator shall provide administrative support to the Citizen's Advisory Committee.
- (i) The provisions of this ordinance and the operation of the Citizen's Advisory Committee shall expire upon expiration of the Central Market Street and Tenderloin Area Payroll Expense Tax Exclusion under Section 906.3 of this Article.

## **LEGISLATIVE DIGEST**

[Business and Tax Regulations Code – Establish a Citizen's Advisory Committee for the Central Market Street and Tenderloin Area]

Ordinance amending Article 12-A of the San Francisco Business and Tax Regulations Code by adding Section 906.3-1 to establish a Citizen's Advisory Committee for the Central Market Street and Tenderloin Area.

#### **Existing Law**

Article 12-A of the San Francisco Business and Tax Regulations Code provides for a payroll expense tax exclusion for persons maintaining a fixed place of business in the Central Market Street and Tenderloin Area. Any person with an annual payroll expense of more than \$1,000,000 must enter into a Community Benefits Agreement with the City Administrator in order to be eligible to claim the exclusion.

#### Amendments to Current Law

The proposed ordinance amends Section 906.3 of Article 12-A to establish a Citizen's Advisory Committee for the Central Market Street and Tenderloin Area. This committee shall consist of seven members, all nominated by the supervisor for District Six and confirmed by the Board of Supervisors. The committee members shall be residents of the Central Market Street and Tenderloin Area. The committee shall advise the Mayor, City Administrator and Board of Supervisors about issues confronting the community and terms the community would like included in Community Benefits Agreements.

## **Background Information**

The Citizen's Advisory Committee will provide advise to the Mayor, City Administrator and Board of Supervisors about the issues and needs confronting the Central Market Street and Tenderloin Area community. It will also convey to the Mayor, City Administrator and Board of Supervisors terms that the community would like included in the Community Benefits Agreements mandated under the Central Market Street and Tenderloin Area Payroll Expense Tax Exclusion.
