[Commemorative Street Name Designation - "Sean Monterrosa Boulevard" - Park Street at the Intersection of Holly Park Circle]

Resolution adding the Commemorative Street Name "Sean Monterrosa Boulevard" to Park Street, at the intersection of Holly Park Circle, in recognition of Sean Monterrosa's contribution and legacy to San Francisco as a local figure.

WHEREAS, Sean Monterrosa, a 22 year old San Francisco native born and raised in the city, was shot and killed by officer Jarrett Tonn of the Vallejo Police Department on June 2, 2020, amidst a period of protests demanding justice for George Floyd; and

WHEREAS, Prior to his death, Sean was a participant of San Francisco organizations MYEEP, 7 Teepees, Horizons Unlimited, Lifeworks, DJ Project, and the Excelsior Boys and Girls Club, to name a few, and went on to mentor at-risk youth within his community; and

WHEREAS, Sean Monterrosa in his commitment to social justice, was involved in the fight to secure justice for Mario Woods, Alex Nieto, and all those who have been killed by the San Francisco Police Department; and

WHEREAS, As a young adult, Sean encouraged his peers to get involved in the community and read social justice themed literature; and

WHEREAS, Sean Monterrosa's last text message before he was killed at 11:49 p.m. was a request for his sisters to sign a petition to help attain justice for George Floyd, only for them to later find out that he was also shot and killed by law enforcement; and

WHEREAS, Sean Monterrosa left this earth with a powerful message of achieving Black and Brown unity and with the noble understanding that he was willing to put his own body on the line for justice; and

WHEREAS, To this day, Sean's friends, and colleagues, and community remember and honor him as a compassionate, kind, and thoughtful leader, and Horizons Unlimited, where he was a participant, described him as "compassionate, kind, and thoughtful," and a "natural born leader;" and

WHEREAS, In 2020, the San Francisco Board of Supervisors unanimously voted to pass file no. 200628 urging the City of Vallejo to require Vallejo Police to release the body camera footage related to the killing of Sean Monterrosa; and

WHEREAS, In 2020, The Monterrosa sisters held a block party attended by hundreds, near Holly Park, officially called "Tucan's Day" to remember the life that Sean led, celebrate the impact that he had on his community, and demand justice for his death; and

WHEREAS, In 2021, the San Francisco Board of Supervisors unanimously voted to pass File no. 210617 declaring June 2, 2021 as Sean Israel Monterrosa Day in the City and County of San Francisco; and

WHEREAS, In 2021, the Sean Monterrosa Knowledge Up Community Library had its grand opening on Holly Park Circle, as both a physical tribute to Sean's legacy and as a community fixture that encourages young people in the neighborhood to read books centering social justice issues; and

WHEREAS, In 2023, a mural honoring Sean's life was unveiled at the corner of South Van Ness Ave and 24th Street, in the heart of the Calle 24 Latino Cultural District; and

WHEREAS, Since Sean's passing, community members have come together time and time again to celebrate his life, demand justice for his death, and create spaces for San Francisco youth to learn about the issues that Sean was passionate about; and

WHEREAS, The intersection of Park Street and Holly Park Circle marks where Sean Monterrosa grew up; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That to honor the legacy and contributions of Sean Israel Monterrosa, there shall be a commemorative naming of Park Street at the intersection of Holly Park Circle; and, be it FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Department of Public Works is directed to add the honorary street name to its official list of Commemorative Street Names in accordance with Public Works Code, Section 789 et seq.
