The San Francisco Board of Supervisors voted unanimously to establish the Office of Labor Standards Enforcement in October 2000.

Initially responsible for prevailing wage enforcement, the office has since expanded to include enforcement of 36 different labor policies – many of them the first of their kind in the nation.
