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[Accept and Expend Grant – Cesar Chavez Sewer System Improvement - \$669,000]

Resolution authorizing the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission to accept and expend a U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) administered grant in the amount of \$669,000 for the Cesar Chavez Sewer System Improvement Project.

WHEREAS, The U.S. EPA is authorized to award Federal Grants under the Department of the Interior, Environment, and Related Agencies Appropriations Act of 2006 and 2008; and

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Public Utilities Commission (SFPUC) in August 2006 was awarded a \$477,900 Grant funded through the Appropriation Act of 2006 to support construction of a combined sewer/ stormwater system along Cesar Chavez Street, as part of the Cesar Chavez Street Sewer System Improvement Project (the Project); and

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Board of Supervisors authorized the SFPUC to accept and expend the \$477,900 EPA grant under Resolution No. 711-06 (File No. 061492) on December 12, 2006; and

WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisor's Resolution No. 711-06 required completion of environmental review under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), CEQA Guidelines prior to authorizing the expenditure of Federal Grant Funds; and

WHEREAS, The SFPUC requested an additional \$669,000 in Federal Grant Funds from the Appropriation Act of 2008 to support Project No. CENMSCIC11, Cesar Chavez Street Sewer System Improvement Project; and

WHEREAS, The U.S. EPA notified the SFPUC in June 2010 that it approved a grant award of \$669,000 in Federal Funds to the Project through an amendment to the existing EPA Grant Agreement;

WHEREAS, Matching funds of 45% of the total project costs (or \$938,373) are required according to the Appropriations Act which authorized the Project; and

WHEREAS, Funding for the required matching funding is available from Wastewater Enterprise CIP Project No. CENMSCIC11; and

WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors adopted findings under the CEQA Guidelines and San Francisco Administrative Code Chapter 31, including adoption of a mitigation monitoring and reporting program, related to the funding of Project No. CENMSCIC11 and directed the Clerk of the BOS to notify the Controller of this action, and authorized the SFPUC to expend Federal Grant in the amount of \$477,900 from the EPA by Resolution No. 411-10 (File No. 100930) on August 10, 2010; and

WHEREAS, The grant terms prohibit including indirect costs in the grant budget; and WHEREAS, The grant does not require an Annual Salary Ordinance (ASO)

Amendment; and

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Public Utilities Commission on July 27, 2010, adopted resolution no. 10-0127 authorizing the General Manager to request permission from the Board of Supervisors to accept and expend the additional Grant Funds totaling \$669,000 from the Consolidated Appropriation Act of 2008, as administered by the EPA; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the General Manager of the San Francisco Public Utilities

Commission is authorized to accept and expend a U.S. EPA administered grant in the amount of \$669,000 from the Consolidated Appropriation Act of 2008, for the aforementioned Project and to execute any and all documents necessary therefore; and, be it

	On January 13, 2010, the SFPUC and City Planning completed the environmental review required by CEQA for the Project.
	On February 23, 2010, the Commission adopted Resolution No. 10-0034, adopting the CEQA Findings and approving Project CENMSCIC11, Cesar Chavez Sewer System Improvement.
	Staff now recommends to the Commission that the General Manager be authorized to request the Board of Supervisor's approval to amend the existing EPA grant, and approve and expend the additional grant funds.
Result of Inaction:	A delay in authorizing the acceptance and expenditure of the additional EPA grant funds may result in an overall delay in the project.
Budget & Costs:	\$669,900 in federal grant funds has been awarded.
