[Health, Business and Tax Regulations Codes - Annual Retail Food Special Event Permit]

**Ordinance amending the Health and Business and Tax Regulations Codes to create a new annual retail food permit for food operators participating in special events and set the fees for the new permit.**

Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

Section 1. The Health Code is hereby amended by revising Section 452 of Article 8, to read as follows:

**SEC. 452. PERMIT REQUIRED.**

\* \* \* \*

(g) Applications for temporary permits to operate special events shall be submitted no later than ~~fourteen (14)~~ calendar days prior to the commencement of the event along with the applicable filing fees listed in Section 249.11(c) of the Business and Tax Regulations Code ~~of the City and County of San Francisco~~. If the application and/or filing fees are submitted less than ~~fourteen (14)~~ calendar days prior to the commencement of the event, the applicant shall pay an additional ~~fifty percent (50%)~~ of the filing fee as a late charge before the application can be processed or approved. Applications and/or fees (including any late charges) ~~that which~~ are submitted seven (~~7~~) calendar days or less prior to the commencement of the event may, at the Department's discretion, not be processed. This subsection (g) shall

1 not apply to annual permits to operate special events when the applicant pays the annual permit fee  
2 provided in Section 249.11(d) of the Business and Tax Regulations Code.

4 Section 2. The Business and Tax Regulations Code is hereby amended by revising  
5 Section 249.11 of Article 2, to read as follows:

6 **SEC. 249.11. TEMPORARY AND ANNUAL PERMITS FOR~~AND~~ SPECIAL EVENTS**  
7 **PERMITS; FEES.**

8 (a) Temporary permits, effective for a period of one to 90 days, and annual permits will be  
9 granted by the Department of Public Health ("Department") to operate establishments under  
10 Section 248 – Food Product and Marketing Establishments and Section 249.1 – Food  
11 Preparation and Service Establishments ~~for a fee equivalent to the hourly rate of an Environmental~~  
12 ~~Health Inspector, which will be effective for a period of one to 45 days.~~

13 (b) Business concerns whose regular sales activities concern products or  
14 commodities other than food, but sell or give away food periodically for sales promotion  
15 purposes shall obtain either a temporary or annual permit prescribed by this Section 249.11.

16 (c) Temporary Special Event permits will be granted by the Department ~~of Public~~  
17 ~~Health~~ to operate special events referred to in Section 451(~~i~~) and 452(g) of the ~~San Francisco~~  
18 Health Code upon payment of fees listed as follows:

19 (1) Application fees ~~for fiscal year 2008-09~~, per event:

20 (A) Event sponsor: \$18~~2~~0;

21 (B) Food operator, ~~\$24~~, where all food sold or distributed and the method of  
22 processing the food is considered to be low in potential hazard by the Department: \$50 ~~of~~

1 (C) Food operator, ~~\$83~~, where any food sold or distributed or the method of  
2 processing the food is considered to be high in potential hazard by the Department: ~~\$130~~ of

4 (2) Permit fees ~~for fiscal year 2008-2009~~, per location:

5 (A) ~~\$7442~~ for up to two days, and ~~\$5012~~ for each additional day, where all food  
6 sold or distributed and the method of processing the food is considered to be low in potential  
7 hazard by the Department ~~of Public Health~~;

8 (B) ~~\$11472~~ for up to two days, and ~~\$5024~~ for each additional day, where any  
9 food sold or distributed or the method of processing the food is considered to be high in  
10 potential hazard by the Department ~~of Public Health~~.

11 (d) Annual Special Event permits will be granted by the Department to operate at special  
12 events referred to in Sections 451 and 452(g) of the Health Code upon payment of the fees listed as  
13 follows:

14 (1) Application fees:

15 (A) Food operator, where all food sold or distributed and the method of  
16 processing the food is considered to be low in potential hazard by the Department: \$401;

17 (B) Food operator, where any food sold or distributed or the method of  
18 processing the food is considered to be high in potential hazard by the Department: \$401.

19 (2) Permit fees:

20 (A) Food operator, where all food sold or distributed and the method of  
21 processing the food is considered to be low in potential hazard by the Department: \$353;

22 (B) Food operator, where any food sold or distributed or the method of  
23 processing the food is considered to be high in potential hazard by the Department: \$588.

24 The annual fees set forth in this subsection (d) shall be paid annually on or before March 31, in  
25 accordance with Section 76.1 of the Business and Tax Regulations Code.

1           (e) Beginning with fiscal year 2025-2026 and annually thereafter, the fees set forth in this  
2           Section 249.11 may be adjusted each year, without further action by the Board of Supervisors, as set  
3           forth in this subsection (e). Not later than April 1, the Department shall report to the Controller the  
4           revenues generated by the fees for the prior fiscal year and the prior fiscal year's costs of operation, as  
5           well as any other information that the Controller determines appropriate to the performance of the  
6           duties set forth in this Section. Not later than May 15, the Controller shall determine whether the  
7           current fees have produced or are projected to produce revenues sufficient to support the costs of  
8           providing the services for which the fee is assessed and that the fees will not produce revenue that is  
9           significantly more than the costs of providing the services for which the fee is assessed. The Controller  
10           shall, if necessary, adjust the fees upward or downward for the upcoming fiscal year as appropriate to  
11           ensure that the program recovers the costs of operation without producing revenue that is significantly  
12           more than such costs. The adjusted rates shall become operative on July 1.

13  
14           Section 3. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after  
15           enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the  
16           ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board  
17           of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.

18  
19           Section 4. Scope of Ordinance. In enacting this ordinance, the Board of Supervisors  
20           intends to amend only those words, phrases, paragraphs, subsections, sections, articles,  
21           numbers, punctuation marks, charts, diagrams, or any other constituent parts of the Municipal  
22           Code that are explicitly shown in this ordinance as additions, deletions, Board amendment  
23           additions, and Board amendment deletions in accordance with the "Note" that appears under  
24           the official title of the ordinance.

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## **LEGISLATIVE DIGEST**

[Health, Business and Tax Regulations Codes - Annual Retail Food Special Event Permit]

**Ordinance amending the Health and Business and Tax Regulations Codes to create a new annual retail food permit for food operators participating in special events and set the fees for the new permit.**

### **Existing Law**

Currently, the Department of Public Health (“DPH”) issues temporary permits for various types of food establishments to operate special events, such as festivals and other community events. A temporary special event permit (also known as a temporary food facility permit) allows an event sponsor and food operators to operate food establishments for no more than 25 days within every 90-day period.

### **Amendments to Current Law**

The proposed ordinance would create an annual special event permit that would allow food operators to operate for no more than 25 days within each 90-day period over the course of a year, *i.e.*, four 90-day periods. The proposed ordinance would establish application and permit fees for the new annual special event permit and allow the Controller, with input from DPH, to annually adjust the fees for both the existing temporary special event permit and the new annual special event permit. The proposed ordinance would exempt the new annual special event permits from the late fees for temporary special event permit applications.

### **Background Information**

State law allows temporary food facilities to operate for community events where the event is conducted for not more than 25 days in a 90-day period and where the event is of a civic, political, public, or educational nature (such as county fairs, festivals, and other public gathering events).

On June 24, 2024 the Small Business Commission heard BOS File 240406 – Annual Retail Food Special Event Permit (Sponsor: Mayor Breed). This legislation creates a new annual permit for special event food vendors, known as Temporary Food Facilities, which allows them to apply for a single permit to cover multiple events throughout the year.

Currently, special event food vendors need to apply for a permit and pay an application fee every time they participate in a special event. The Small Business Commission supports policies such as this which will reduce paperwork and reduce costs. Additionally, the new annual permit will make permitting and inspection operations more efficient for the Department of Public Health.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Successor Agency Commission, commonly known as the Commission on Community Investment and Infrastructure ("Commission"), will hold a public hearing on Tuesday, July 16, 2024 at 1:00 p.m., in City Hall, Room 416, located at 1 Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett Place, San Francisco, CA to consider proposed amendments ("Plan Amendments") to Phase 2 of the Hunters Point Shipyard Redevelopment Plan ("HPS Plan") and Zone 1 of the Bayview Hunters Point Redevelopment Plan ("BVHP Plan") (collectively, the "Redevelopment Plans") and to consider all evidence and testimony for or against the approval of the Plan Amendments. At any time not later than the hour set forth above for the hearing on the Plan Amendments, any person may file a written statement supporting or objecting to the Plan Amendments with the Commission Secretary of the Successor Agency to the Redevelopment Agency of the City and County of San Francisco at One South Van Ness Avenue, Fifth Floor, San Francisco, CA 94103 or via email to [HPSACPAmendments@sfgov.org](mailto:HPSACPAmendments@sfgov.org). At the day, hour and place of the hearing, any and all persons interested in or objecting to the Plan Amendments may appear before the Commission and show cause why the Plan Amendments should or should not be approved.

The Plan Amendments are consistent with proposed changes in the Candlestick Point-Hunters Point Shipyard Phase 2 project agreements ("Project Agreements"), which the Commission, Oversight Board of the City and County of San Francisco, and California Department of Finance will separately consider under the authority of Section 14 of Senate Bill 143 (2023) (codified at Section 34177.7 (j) of the California Health and Safety Code). The Plan Amendments would authorize, subject to approval of the Project Agreements, the following: 1) transfer of approximately 2,050,000 square feet of commercial uses from the Hunters Point Shipyard Project Area ("HPS Project Area") to commercially-zoned areas of Zone 1 of the BVHP Project Area with a corresponding reduction in those uses at Phase 2 of the HPS Project Area; 2) clarify that certain commercial uses currently authorized within the HPS Project Area are also allowed within the BVHP Project Area; 3) extend the limitations relating to time for establishing loans, advances, and indebtedness, the effectiveness of the Redevelopment Plans, and the time to repay indebtedness and receive property taxes, in connection with the Candlestick Point-Hunters Point Shipyard Phase 2 project; 4) authorize property tax increment revenues from Phase 2 of the HPS Project Area and Zone 1 of the BVHP Project Area to be combined to fund costs under the Project Agreements; and 5) adjust the limit on the amount of bonded indebtedness that can be outstanding at one time by establishing a single limit on the amount of bonded indebtedness applicable to Zone 1 of the BVHP Plan and Phase 2 of the HPS Plan. The Plan Amendments would also provide for other minor amendments to the definitions, regulations, and standards of the HPS and BVHP Plans, but would not change the boundaries or legal descriptions of the HPS Project Area or the BVHP Project Area.

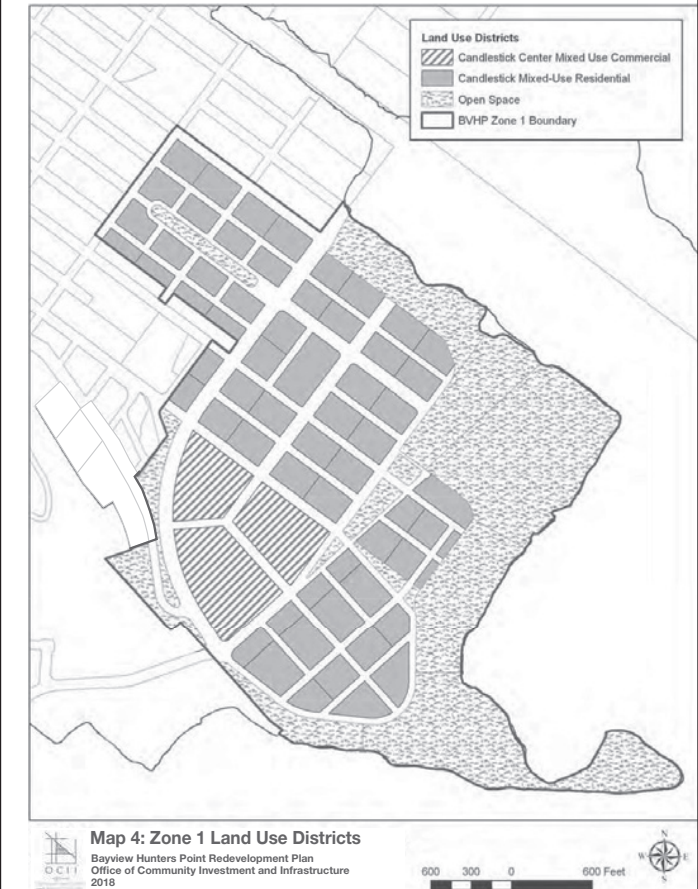
The legal descriptions of the boundaries for the project areas in the Redevelopment Plans were recorded as follows. Phase 2 of the HPS Plan (Map 2 and Attachment A) was recorded with the San Francisco Office of the Assessor-Recorder on October 23, 2018 as Document No. 2018-K685940-00. Zone 1 of the BVHP Plan (Project Area B as described in Attachment B and Map 4) was recorded with the San Francisco Office of the Assessor-Recorder on October 23, 2018 as Document No. 2018-K685939-00.

Following the close of the public hearing, the Commission will consider approval of the Plan Amendments. If the Commission approves the Plan Amendments, the Planning Commission will consider the General Plan referral and the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco will consider adoption of the proposed amendments to the Redevelopment Plans together with OCIL's Report to the Board of Supervisors on the Redevelopment Plan amendments.
