13	Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:		
14			
15	Section 1. Background.		
16	(a) The Board of Supervisors approved a Redevelopment Plan for the Transbay		
17	Project Area by Ordinance No. 124-05, in June 2005, and by Ordinance No. 99-06, in May		
18	2006. The Transbay Project Area is located primarily between Folsom and Howard Streets,		
19	east of 2nd Street, and west of Spear and Main Streets, and also includes a small portion		
20	along Essex and Harrison Streets south of Folsom. The Redevelopment Plan contemplates		
21	the development of approximately 3,900 residential units, 2.5 million square feet of office		
22	space, 94,000 square feet of retail, new streets, streetscape improvements, and 9 acres of		
23	open space including the addition of three parks.		
24	(b) On February 1, 2012, Assembly Bill 26 (Cal. Health & Safety Code Section		
25	34170 <i>et seq</i> .) ("Dissolution Law") dissolved the San Francisco Redevelopment Agency		

("Redevelopment Agency") along with all 400 redevelopment agencies in California and
 created successor agencies to complete certain enforceable obligations of the redevelopment
 agencies and to wind down redevelopment activities.

4 (c) The State of California, through its Department of Finance, has approved, under
5 the Dissolution Law, the Transbay Redevelopment Project Implementation Agreement
6 (January 20, 2005) as an enforceable obligation that survived the dissolution of the former
7 Redevelopment Agency.

8 (d) Under the authority of the Dissolution Law and under Ordinance No. 215-12, the 9 City and County of San Francisco (the "City") delegated Dissolution Law authority to the Successor Agency Commission to assume the remaining obligations of the Redevelopment 10 Agency. Among the remaining obligations, the Successor Agency (commonly known as the 11 12 Office of Community Investment and Infrastructure or "OCII") is responsible for completing the 13 development of those projects that comply with the Transbay Redevelopment Project 14 Implementation Agreement, as further approved by the Oversight Board of the City and 15 County of San Francisco and the California Department of Finance in OCII's annual Recognized Obligation Payment Schedule (the "Transbay Project"). 16

(e) To assist OCII in meeting its obligations under the Transbay Project, OCII
partnered with the Department of Public Works to provide infrastructure delivery support and
coordination services, project management, construction management, construction
administration, and other professional services related to the design, engineering, and
delivery of the proposed Transbay Project park and streetscape improvements ("Project
Services"). The eligible reimbursements to the City for these Project Services are estimated
to exceed \$1 million.

(f) Under Charter Section 9.118(a), the Board of Supervisors must approve
 revenue contracts entered into by a department having anticipated revenue to the City of \$1
 million or more.

(g) The Dissolution Law establishes that OCII is a separate legal entity from the
City. Under Ordinance No. 215-12, however, the Board of Supervisors, in its capacity as the
legislative body for the City, must approve OCII's annual budget. OCII's annual budget is
initially approved by the Successor Agency Commission and subsequently requires the
approval of the Mayor and Board.

9 (h) The Project Services supplied by the Department of Public Works also requires that OCII and the City execute property access agreements to allow the City and City 10 11 contractors to enter OCII property to perform the Project Services. The Department of Public 12 Works may also need to access other property in the vicinity to perform the Project Services. 13 Under Administrative Code Sections 2A.110, 23.1, and 23.25, any lease or other means of 14 granting the Department of Public Works the right to occupy or use real property, including a 15 license, permit to enter, use permit, or other similar instrument, is to be made through the 16 Director of Property.

18 Section 2. Delegation of Authority Under Charter Section 9.118(a) to the Director of19 Public Works.

Pursuant to its authority under Charter Section 9.118(a), the Board of Supervisors delegates authority to the Director of the Department of Public Works to enter into project management and project delivery support services contracts with OCII anticipated to generate over \$1 million in reimbursements or revenue to the City to further the implementation of the Transbay Project, so long as the expenditures are authorized in OCII's Recognized Obligation Payment Schedule approved by the Oversight Board of the City and County of San Francisco and the California Department of Finance and in the City's annual budget, approved by the
 Mayor and Board of Supervisors. The Board of Supervisors further authorizes the Public
 Works Director to enter into any amendments or modifications to these contracts with OCII for
 the Transbay Project.

Section 3. Waiver of Certain Administrative Code Real Property Provisions.
Notwithstanding the requirements of Administrative Code Sections 2A.110, 23.1, and
Section 23.25, the Board of Supervisors authorizes the Director of Public Works to execute
any access agreement necessary for the Department of Public Works to perform its Project
Services to further the implementation of the Transbay Project, so long as the access
agreement does not require the City to pay any access fee and does not have a term that
exceeds ten years.

Section 4. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after
enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the
ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board
of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.

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## LEGISLATIVE DIGEST

[Delegation of Approval Authority for Contracts with OCII for Transbay Project]

Ordinance delegating Board of Supervisors approval authority under Charter, Section 9.118(a), to the Department of Public Works to enter into and amend contracts with the Office of Community Investment and Infrastructure ("OCII") for the Transbay Projects; and authorizing the Department of Public Works to execute certain access agreements necessary to further the development of the Transbay Projects.

### Existing Law

Under Charter Section 9.118, the Board of Supervisors must approve revenue contracts entered into by a department having anticipated revenue to the City of \$1 million or more. Further, nder Administrative Code Sections 2A.110, 23.1, and 23.25, any lease or other means of granting a City department the right to occupy or use real property, including a license, permit to enter, use permit, or other similar instrument, is to be made through the Director of Property.

### Amendments to Current Law

This ordinance would delegate the 9.118 approval authority to the Director of Public Works for project management and project delivery support services contracts with OCII to further the implementation of the Transbay Project, so long as the expenditures are authorized in OCII's Recognized Obligation Payment Schedule approved by the Oversight Board of the City and County of San Francisco and the California Department of Finance and in the City's annual budget, approved by the Mayor and Board of Supervisors. This ordinance would also authorize Public Works to execute any access agreement necessary for Public Works to perform certain project services to further the Transbay Project as long as the access agreement does not require the City to pay any fee and is for less than ten years.

# **Background Information**



The Board of Supervisors approved a Redevelopment Plan for the Transbay Project Area by Ordinance No. 124-05, in June 2005, and by Ordinance No. 99-06, in May 2006.

To assist The Successor Agency (commonly known as the Office of Community Investment and Infrastructure or "OCII") in meeting its obligations under the Transbay Project, OCII partnered with the Department of Public Works to provide infrastructure delivery support and coordination services, project management, construction management, construction administration, and other professional services related to the design, engineering, and delivery of the proposed Transbay Project park and streetscape improvements.


The eligible reimbursements to the City for these Project Services are estimated to exceed \$1 million. Under Charter Section 9.118(a), the Board of Supervisors must approve revenue contracts entered into by a department having anticipated revenue to the City of \$1 million or more.

The Dissolution Law establishes that OCII is a separate legal entity from the City. Under Ordinance No. 215-12, however, the Board of Supervisors, in its capacity as the legislative body for the City, must approve OCII's annual budget. OCII's annual budget is initially approved by the Successor Agency Commission and subsequently requires the approval of the Mayor and Board.

Hello Clerks,

Attached is an Ordinance delegating Board of Supervisors approval authority under Charter Section 9.118(a) to the Department of Public Works to enter into and amend contracts with the Office of Community Investment and Infrastructure ("OCII") for the Transbay Projects; and authorizing the Department of Public Works to execute certain access agreements necessary to further the development of the Transbay Projects.

Please note, we are asking to waive the 30-day hold. The Public Works Commission will ultimately be in position to award a construction contract to the OCII client, and Board approval is necessary for commission approval. Ideally the commission will be awarding a contract bid in October 2024, so a Notice to Proceed can be issued to the contractor no later than early January 2025.

The January 2025 date is critical to allow for:

- Coordination of construction activities with adjacent Block 2 affordable housing developer where projects overlap.
- Assisting Block 2 to meet its TCO (total cost of ownership) milestone, as Block 2 is relying on the Department of Public Works project to build adjacent new Clementina Street and new sewer line and Main Street waterline relocation.

Thus, a 30-day hold will push Board review into October, which could negatively affect the contract award and thus delay the affordable housing and related utility construction.
