I am writing to urge you to approve the e-bike incentive program developed by advocates at eBikeSF.org.

My neighborhood, Bayview/Hunters Point, has among the weakest public transit networks in San Francisco. To make matters worse, the city is planning to demolish and rebuild the Islais Creek Bridge in 2026, leaving us without a light rail line or main artery and cramming cars, bikes, buses, and trucks (we have a cement factory) into two smaller streets.

The residents of Bayview and Visitacion Valley are mostly working class. My back of the envelope calculation is that having 35,000 people who average \$30 per hour add 30 minutes to their daily commute will cost working class families \$180 million over the course of two years.

A properly administered, speedy, efficient e-bike incentive program can help Bayview and Visitacion Valley residents to mitigate some of the harm from the upcoming bridge closure. I urge you to approve the incentive and to ensure that it is administered in a quick, efficient way.

I am writing to support the proposed **E-Bike Incentive Fund and Program**. This initiative can transform San Francisco's transportation landscape and benefit our community. I am Kevin H. Souza, and I have lived in District 4, San Francisco, for 31 years.

Firstly, e-bikes significantly reduce barriers to cycling, making it accessible to a broader range of people. Research shows that e-bikes extend riders' range by up to 40 times compared to walking, allowing more residents to consider biking a viable transportation option (Culdesac). This increased accessibility fosters a stronger sense of community and encourages more diverse participation in cycling. I am a recent retiree and have adopted e-bike cycling as my primary form of solo travel in San Francisco. Within a few short months, cycling an average of 30 miles each week has brought my body weight into a healthier range, reduced my blood pressure, and stabilized my blood sugar levels. This, in addition the joy I experience being more connected to San Francisco.

Secondly, promoting sustainable transportation is crucial for our city's future. E-bikes offer an eco-friendly alternative to traditional vehicles, with studies showing that if just 5% of commuters switched to e-bikes, emissions could fall by 4% (NREL). This aligns perfectly with San Francisco's climate goals and helps improve our air quality. I used to own an electric car, but since I only used it to travel in San Francisco, I decided to give it up in exchange for travel on my e-bike and our outstanding MUNI system.

Thirdly, e-bikes play a significant role in reducing traffic congestion. A study in Atlanta found that banning e-scooters and e-bikes led to a 9-11% increase in commuting times (American City and County). By encouraging e-bike use, we can help alleviate road congestion, making commutes faster and more efficient for everyone. Our City is limited in sustaining increased car traffic, regardless of gasoline or electric. Bicycles are essential to expand our travel options and reduce car congestion.

Furthermore, e-bikes support our local economy. When people travel by bike, they're more likely to shop locally. A study in Colorado found that e-bike riders chose to use e-bikes for 28% of all trips, many of which were for accessing local businesses (NREL). This boost to local spending strengthens our community and supports small businesses. Since riding, I have discovered and patronized small businesses I used to drive by all the time and had never noticed, particularly along Fillmore Street between Geary and Fell Streets, Post Street in Japantown, and the Financial District.

Lastly, this incentive program should be paired with the visionary Biking and Rolling

<u>Plan</u> to create a citywide connected network of car-free and people-prioritized streets. Such infrastructure is crucial for integrating e-bikes with sustainable transportation options, creating a seamless, efficient system that benefits all San Franciscans.

In conclusion, the E-Bike Incentive Fund and Program represents a forward-thinking approach to urban transportation. It aligns with our City's sustainability, community, and innovation values. I strongly urge you to support this initiative and help shape a more sustainable, accessible, and vibrant San Francisco.

This figure doesn't even include parking, which for many renters in the city, is another huge cost.
