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[Accept and Expend Grant – Cesar Chavez Sewer System Improvement - \$669,000]

Resolution authorizing the Public Utilities Commission to accept and expend a grant administered by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency in the amount of \$669,000 for the Cesar Chavez Sewer System Improvement Project.

WHEREAS, The U.S. EPA is authorized to award Federal Grants under the Department of the Interior, Environment, and Related Agencies Appropriations Act of 2006 and 2008; and

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Public Utilities Commission (SFPUC) in August 2006 was awarded a \$477,900 Grant funded through the Appropriation Act of 2006 to support construction of a combined sewer/ stormwater system along Cesar Chavez Street, as part of the Cesar Chavez Street Sewer System Improvement Project (the Project); and

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Board of Supervisors authorized the SFPUC to accept and expend the \$477,900 EPA grant under Resolution No. 711-06 (File No. 061492) on December 12, 2006; and
