1 [Administrative Code - Core Initiatives to Strengthen City’s Responses to Homelessness,
2 Drug Abuse, Mental Health Needs, and Related Crises]

3 **Ordinance amending the Administrative Code to 1) provide that the existing waiver of**
4 **competitive procurement rules for certain contracts and grants to support projects**
5 **addressing homelessness will sunset in May 2029; 2) suspend until January 2026 the**
6 **~~waive competitive procurement and certain other Municipal Code~~ requirements for**
7 **contracts, grants, and leases necessary to accelerate the City’s response to**
8 **homelessness, drug overdoses and substance use disorders, mental health needs,**
9 **integrated health needs, and public safety hiring (the “Core Initiatives”); ~~32~~ 3) delegate to**
10 **the Mayor department heads the authority to approve certain types of contracts, grants,**
11 **and leases for Core Initiatives under Charter Section 9.118, if the Board of Supervisors**
12 **has failed to act within 45 days; ~~43~~ 4) suspend until January 2026 delete the requirement**
13 **under Chapter 23 of the Administrative Code that the Board of Supervisors approve**
14 **leases, if the lease is for a Core Initiative; ~~54~~ 5) authorize the City until January 2026 to**
15 **accept gifts, grants, and other donations for Core Initiatives; ~~65~~ 6) clarify the authority of**
16 **the Controller to transfer surplus funds to support Core Initiatives; and ~~76~~ 7) authorize**
17 **the Office of the Mayor for six months to solicit donations from various private entities**
18 **and organizations to support the City’s work on the Core Initiatives, notwithstanding**
19 **the Behested Payment Ordinance.**

1 Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

3 Section 1. Chapter 21B of the Administrative Code is hereby amended by revising the
4 title and Section 21B.1, adding new Section 21B.2, renumbering existing Section 21B.2 as
5 Section 21B.3 and revising it, adding new Sections 21B.4 and 21B.5, renumbering existing
6 Section 21B.3 as Section 21B.6 and revising it, and renumbering existing Section 21B.4 as
7 Section 21B.7 and revising it, to read as follows:

8 **CHAPTER 21B:**

9 **CORE INITIATIVES ~~COMMODITIES AND SERVICES RELATING TO~~**
10 **PROJECTS ADDRESSING HOMELESSNESS, ~~DRUG OVERDOSES AND SUBSTANCE~~**
11 **USE DISORDERS, MENTAL HEALTH NEEDS, INTEGRATED HEALTH NEEDS,**
12 **AND PUBLIC SAFETY HIRING**

13 **SEC. 21B.1. PURPOSE AND GOALS.**

14 For too long, San Francisco has faced crises related to homelessness, drug overdoses and
15 substance use disorders, mental health needs, integrated health needs, and public safety hiring. The
16 City wants to try innovative solutions to address these crises more effectively and more quickly, but
17 long-established rules often stand in the way of speedy progress. It is the intent of this Chapter 21B to
18 expedite the City's response to these challenges and expand the City's capacity to meet these
19 challenges: to give the City the tools to quickly and effectively implement the Core Initiatives described
20 in this Chapter, so that it can continue to be accountable to, and responsive to the needs of, its
21 residents. In recognition of the fact that a significant number of persons within San Francisco lack the
22 ability to obtain shelter, resulting in a threat to the health and safety of those persons, and that such
23 threat constitutes a shelter crisis, the intent of this Chapter 21B is to expedite the procurement of
24 professional and other services relating to Projects Addressing Homelessness.

1 **SEC. 21B.2. DEFINITIONS.**

2 *For purposes of this Chapter 21B, the following terms have the following meanings:*

3 *“Contracts” means contracts for public works under Chapter 6, contracts for commodities or*
4 *services under Chapter 21, grants awarded under Chapter 21G, ~~leases and related agreements~~*
5 *under Chapter 23, and loan agreements for affordable housing under Chapter 66 and/or Chapter*
6 *120.*

7 *“Core Initiative Contract” means a Contract that (1) procures commodities, services, or public*
8 *works to directly address one or more Core Initiatives or that is required to support a Designated*
9 *Department’s capacity to ensure the comprehensive operational and programmatic success of one or*
10 *more Core Initiatives; ~~(2) leases or otherwise provides for the use of real property to directly~~*
11 *address one or more Core Initiatives; or ~~(3)~~(2) provides funding for one or more Core Initiatives.*

12 *“Core Initiative Lease” means a Lease that provides for the use of real property to*
13 *directly address one or more Core Initiatives;*

14 *“Core Initiatives” means one or more of any of the following: (1) Projects Addressing*
15 *Homelessness, (2) Projects Addressing Drug Overdoses and Substance Use Disorders; (3) Projects*
16 *Addressing Mental Health Needs; (4) Projects Addressing Integrated Health Needs. and (5) Projects*
17 *Addressing Public Safety Hiring.*

18 *“Department Head means the head of a Designated Department or their designee.*

19 *“Designated Departments” means the Department of Public Works, the Department of*
20 *Homelessness and Supportive Housing, the Department of Public Health, the Police Department, the*
21 *Sheriff’s Department, the Department of Emergency Management, the Human Services Agency, the*
22 *Mayor’s Office of Housing and Community Development, the City Administrator, and the Department*
23 *of Human Resources. In addition, the Mayor may ~~select~~designate additional departments or*
24 *components of City government that are needed to support Core Initiatives to be Designated*
25 *Departments, ~~by providing with approval of the Board of Supervisors by resolution~~ a written notice*

1 that explains the need for the additional designation and the manner in which the newly
2 designated department shall be expected to support the Core Initiative.

3 “Lease” shall have the meaning set forth in Administrative Code Section 23.2.

4 *For purposes of this Chapter 21B, “Projects Addressing Homelessness” means projects*
5 *designed to prevent homelessness through the provision of housing subsidies or other*
6 *services, and projects designed to provide shelter, housing, food, and/or social services to*
7 *people experiencing homelessness.*

8 *“Projects Addressing Drug Overdoses and Substance Use Disorders” means projects designed*
9 *to reduce drug-related deaths and support individuals with substance use disorders (SUDs). These*
10 *projects include, but are not limited to, increasing access to treatment for individuals with SUDs,*
11 *providing services to enhance the success of SUD treatment, such as co-delivered mental health*
12 *treatment and contingency management incentives, providing an array of services to support*
13 *individuals with SUDs in their living environments, and strengthening community engagement,*
14 *outreach, intervention, and social support for people at high risk for overdose.*

15 *“Projects Addressing Mental Health Needs” means projects designed to support people with*
16 *mental health disorders, including, but not limited to, providing residential care and treatment services*
17 *for both long- and short-term stays, providing case management, providing therapy, and connecting*
18 *individuals with healthcare and medication, along with services to address co-occurring substance*
19 *abuse disorders and/or medical needs.*

20 *“Projects Addressing Integrated Health Needs” means projects designed to serve people who*
21 *are at risk of experiencing homelessness due to the potential loss of their shelter, housing, or release*
22 *from an institution. These projects include, but are not limited to, shelter health services, linkages,*
23 *case management, wrap around services, eligibility and benefits enrollment, and navigation services.*

24 *“Projects Addressing Public Safety Hiring” means projects to support the hiring process for,*
25 *and/or the recruitment, training, and retention of, police officers, deputy sheriffs, and 911 operators.*

2 **SEC. 21B.32. CORE INITIATIVE CONTRACTS AND LEASES**~~WAIVER OF~~
3 **COMPETITIVE BIDDING REQUIREMENTS.**

4 (a) Purpose. This Section 21B.3 is intended to streamline the process for Designated
5 Departments to enter into Contracts and Leases for Core Initiatives that they otherwise are legally
6 authorized to enter into, by waiving or modifying certain approval requirements that may otherwise
7 apply to those Contracts and Leases. This Section 21B.3 is not intended to otherwise enlarge or
8 expand the general contracting or leasing authority of Designated Departments as to different types of
9 Contracts or Leases. In addition, with regard to competitive procurement rules, this Section
10 21B.3 is not intended to alter the obligation of Designated Departments to follow any such
11 requirements that may apply under state or federal law or under the terms of funding
12 agreements.

13 (b) Waiver of Requirements Related To Competitive Bidding For Contracts and
14 Leases; Approval of Leases. A Designated Department that intends to enter into a Core
15 Initiative Contract or Lease under this Section 21B.3 shall provide the Mayor an advance
16 written justification explaining why the Contract or Lease is necessary to support a Core
17 Initiative, and shall provide a copy of the justification to the Board of Supervisors. The
18 following requirements are suspended as to such Contracts and Leases:

19 (1) Competitive Bidding For Contracts for Services, Commodities, And
20 Grants To Address Homelessness. Notwithstanding Sections 21.1 and 21G.3 of the
21 Administrative Code or any other provision of the Municipal Code, the Department of Public
22 Works and the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing may enter into and/or
23 amend contracts for services or commodities or grants for professional and other services or
24 commodities relating to Projects Addressing Homelessness without adhering to the
25 requirements of Sections 21.1, 21G.3, or any other competitive procurement requirements

1 under City law. ~~Notwithstanding Sections 21.1 and 21G.3 of the Administrative Code or any~~
2 ~~other provision of the Municipal Code, the Department of Public Works and the Department of~~
3 ~~Homelessness and Supportive Housing Designated Departments may enter into and/or~~
4 ~~amend Core Initiative Contractscontracts for services or commodities or grants for~~
5 ~~professional and other services or commodities relating to Projects Addressing Homelessness~~
6 ~~without adhering to the competitive procurement requirements of Administrative Code~~
7 ~~Sections 2.6-1, 21.1, 21G.3, 23.33, 120.2(b), or any other provision of City lawcompetitive~~
8 ~~procurement requirements, and without obtaining approval of leases by resolution under~~
9 ~~Administrative Code Sections 23.27 and 23.30, provided that in any of the above~~
10 ~~circumstances the Department Head must first provide the Mayor a written justification~~
11 ~~explaining why the Contract is necessary to support a Core Initiative.~~

12 (2) **Competitive Bidding For All Other Core Initiative Contracts.**

13 Designated Departments may enter into or amend Core Initiative Contracts other than those
14 specified in subsectionn (b)(1) without adhering to the competitive procurement requirements
15 of Administrative Code Sections 21.1, 21G.3, 120.2(b), or any other competitive procurement
16 requirements under City law. The authorizations granted under this subsection (b)(2) shall
17 only apply to Contracts awarded on or before January 8, 2026 or approved under subsection
18 (c).

19 (3) **Approval Of Core Initiative Leases.** Designated Departments may

20 enter into or amend Leases for Core Initiatives without adhering to the competitive bidding
21 requirements in Administrative Code Sections 2.6-1, 23.27, 23.30, and 23.33, and without
22 securing Board of Supervisors approval of said Leases as set forth in those Sections, except
23 that: (A) the requirements in Sections 23.27 and 23.30 to obtain appraisals and appraisal
24 reviews shall still apply, except that the effective date of value in the appraisal and appraisal
25 review shall be no earlier that nine months before the Lease execution date; (B) Board

1 approval shall still be required under Section 23.27 if the Director of Property determines that
2 the base rent will exceed the market rent; and (C) the Designated Department shall provide
3 notice to the Board if it has determined under Section 23.33 that it is appropriate to lease out
4 City property for less than market value in order to serve a public purpose. The authorizations
5 granted under this subsection (b)(3) shall only apply to Leases awarded on or before January
6 8, 2026 or approved under subsection (c).

7 (c) Approvals Under Charter Section 9.118. The Board of Supervisors hereby delegates
8 authority to the Mayor to approve Designated Departments' Contracts and Leases under
9 Charter Sections 9.118(b) and 9.118(c) to Designated Departments to enter into or amend
10 Contracts, subject to all of the following conditions:

11 (1) A resolution seeking approval under Section 9.118 has been introduced at the
12 Board of Supervisors on or before January 8, 2026;

13 (2) The resolution is signed by the Department Head and the Mayor and states why
14 the Contract or Lease is necessary for a Core Initiative;

15 (3) The Contract or Lease does not require anticipated expenditures by the City
16 and County of \$2550 million or more, or in the case of a modification or amendment of an existing
17 Contract or Lease does not have an impact of \$2550 million or more;

18 (4) The Contract or Lease does not have a term of ten years or more, or in the case
19 of an amendment or modification of an existing Contract or Lease does not extend the Contract term
20 by ten years or more, with the exception of (A) Leasesleases of City property for affordable housing
21 development which shall not exceed 99 years, (B) loans for acquisition, development, construction,
22 rehabilitation, or reconstruction of affordable housing; and (C) grants to subsidize rents or operations
23 of an affordable housing development which shall not exceed 30 years;

24 (5) The Contract or Lease is substantially in the form of the applicable City
25 templates for such Contracts or Leases, and incorporates City-standard requirements related to

1 matters such as insurance and indemnity following consultation with the City Attorney and Risk
2 Manager;

3 (6) The Board of Supervisors has failed to act within 45 days after the date of
4 introduction. The 45-day period shall be tolled during the following periods: (A) any time while
5 the resolution has been referred to the Planning Department for determination under the
6 California Environmental Quality Act, until the Board has received said determination; and (B)
7 while the Board is on regular recess. If the Board has failed to act within 45 days, the Mayor
8 may then approve the Contract or Lease in writing.

9
10 **SEC. 21B.4. AUTHORIZATION TO ACCEPT AND EXPEND DONATIONS.**

11 Designated Departments shall have authority until January 8, 2026 to accept and expend
12 gifts, grants from nongovernmental sources, services, bequests of money, and other donations of up to
13 \$10 million for purposes of supporting the City's efforts on the Core Initiatives. The Controller is
14 authorized to establish special funds as required to appropriately account for funds so received.
15 Designated Departments shall annually report to the Board of Supervisors on such donations and
16 expenditures.

17
18 **SEC. 21B.5. TRANSFER OF FUNDS.**

19 As authorized by Administrative Code Section 3.18, the Controller may transfer appropriated
20 funds within a department for the purpose of supporting the City's work on the Core Initiatives. Until
21 January 8, 2026, sSuch transfers shall not be further limited by administrative requirements not
22 required by Section 3.18 or the Charter.

23
24 **SEC. 21B.63. RULES AND REGULATIONS; REPORTING.**

1 (a) The Controller in consultation with the City Administrator shall have authority to adopt
2 rules and regulations to effectuate the purposes of this Chapter 21B. By way of example but not
3 limitation, these rules and regulations may govern the expedited approval of Contracts and Leases
4 for Core Initiatives to ensure increased transparency and accountability, and additional public
5 reporting of activities conducted under this Chapter 21B. Nothing in this subsection (a) shall limit the
6 authority of the Controller or City Administrator to conduct regular audits or reviews of department
7 activities.

8 (b) A Designated Department that enters into or amends a Contract or Lease for a Core
9 Initiative under Section 21B.3 The Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing and the
10 Department of Public Works shall submit to the Board of Supervisors an annual report every
11 three months that includes the following information for each such Contract or Lease contract or
12 grant that the respective departments executed during the prior reporting period year without
13 adhering to the requirements of Section 21.1 or Section 21G.3, pursuant to the authority in Section
14 21B.2: the name of the party with whom the City has entered into the Contract or Lease contractor
15 or grantee; the services to be provided under the eContract or grant; the amount of funds
16 conveyed or received; the duration of the eContract or Lease or grant; and any measurable
17 outcomes of the eContract or Lease or grant.

18
19 **SEC. 21B.721B.4. SUNSET PROVISIONS.**

20 This Chapter 21B shall expire by operation of law on May 5, 2029, ~~or on the effective~~
21 ~~date of an ordinance making the finding that according to the most recent Point in Time Homeless~~
22 ~~Count, that there are no more than 2,199 people experiencing unsheltered homelessness which is a~~
23 ~~50% reduction in unsheltered homelessness from the 2022 Point in Time Count, whichever date is~~
24 ~~earlier.~~ Upon expiration of this Chapter 21B, the City Attorney is authorized to cause this
25 Chapter to be removed from the Administrative Code.

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Section 23. Chapter 21G of the Administrative Code is hereby amended by revising Section 21G.3, to read as follows:

SEC. 21G.3. COMPETITIVE SOLICITATION.

(a) Granting Agencies shall award all Grants through an open and competitive process under Sections 21G.4, 21G.5, and 21G.6, except for Grants (1) to a governmental entity for programs, activities, or services that can be practically performed only by that particular entity, (2) made to a specific entity as required to comply with applicable law or contract, or as a result of the requirements of the funding source, (3) made for improvement to property by a property owner, ~~or~~ (4) awarded on a sole source basis pursuant to Section 21G.8, or (5) awarded for a Core Initiative as set forth in Administrative Code Chapter 21B.

Section 34. Chapter 23 of the Administrative Code is hereby amended by revising Sections 23.27, 23.30, and 23.33, to read as follows:

SEC. 23.27. EXECUTION OF LEASES; APPRAISALS AND APPRAISAL REVIEWS; RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING LEASE.

Except as otherwise provided by the Charter, Administrative Code Sections 21B.3 or 23.26 ~~above~~, or other provision of this Code, the Board of Supervisors shall approve all Leases on behalf of the City as tenant by resolution. Before adoption, the head of the department concerned shall recommend any such resolution for approval by the Board of Supervisors and the Director of Property shall determine the Market Rent of such Lease based on a review of available and relevant data. If the consideration to be paid by the City for the Lease as base rent is more than \$45 per square foot per year, the Director of Property, on behalf of the department concerned, shall obtain an Appraisal for the Market Rent of the Lease. If the

1 consideration to be paid by the City for the Lease as base rent is more than \$60 per square
2 foot per year, the Director of Property, on behalf of the department concerned, shall obtain an
3 Appraisal Review for such Appraisal. Any Appraisal or Appraisal Review shall have an
4 effective date of value that is not earlier than nine months before the date legislation for the
5 proposed Lease is submitted to the Board of Supervisors. All such Leases shall be executed
6 by the Director of Property or as otherwise directed by resolution of the Board of Supervisors.
7

8 **SEC. 23.30. LEASE OF REAL PROPERTY.**

9 Except as provided by Sections 4.112, 4.113, 4.114, 4.115, and B3.581 of the
10 Charter and by Sections 2A.173 and 23.36 of this Code, or as otherwise provided by the
11 Charter or this Code, the Director of Property shall have the charge of the Lease of Real
12 Property owned by the City. When the head of any department in charge of Real Property
13 reports to the Director of Property that certain land is not required for the purposes of the
14 department, the Board of Supervisors, by resolution, may authorize the Lease of such Real
15 Property. The Director of Property shall determine the Market Rent of such Lease based on a
16 review of available and relevant data. If the Market Rent of the Lease is more than \$45 per
17 square foot per year as base rent, the Director of Property shall obtain an Appraisal for such
18 Lease. If an Appraisal determines the Market Rent of the Lease exceeds \$60 per square foot
19 per year as base rent, the Director of Property shall obtain an Appraisal Review for such
20 Appraisal. Any Appraisal or Appraisal Review shall have an effective date of value that is not
21 earlier than nine months before the date legislation for the proposed Lease is submitted to the
22 Board of Supervisors. The Director of Property shall arrange for such Lease to the highest
23 responsible bidder in accordance with Competitive Bidding Procedures and for no less than
24 the Director of Property's opinion of Market Rent if there is no Appraisal, or for no less than
25 the Market Rent stated in the Appraisal if there is an Appraisal, unless the Board of

1 Supervisors has by resolution found that (a) such Competitive Bidding Procedures are
2 impractical or impossible or has authorized other means of award in furtherance of a proper
3 public purpose, or (b) a lesser sum ~~with~~ which furthers a proper public purpose. The Director of
4 Property shall collect rents due under such Lease.

5 When the Public Utilities Commission, the Recreation and Park Commission, the Port
6 Commission, or the Municipal Transportation Agency require approval of the Board of
7 Supervisors to a proposed Lease of Real Property owned by the City, the applicable
8 Commission or Agency shall determine the Market Rent of such Lease based on a review of
9 available and relevant data. If the Market Rent of the Lease is more than \$45 per square foot
10 per year as base rent, the applicable Commission or Agency shall, through the Director of
11 Property, obtain an Appraisal of the Market Rent for the Lease unless the Executive Director
12 of the Port determines, for Real Property under Port jurisdiction, that the rental rate for the
13 proposed Lease meets or exceeds the Port Commission's annually adopted parameter rental
14 rate for such Real Property, and such Lease shall be for no less than the Market Rent
15 established in the Appraisal unless (1) the Commission or Agency determines that applying
16 the Market Rent requirement would interfere with its capacity in discharging one of its core
17 functions under the City Charter, (2) the Board of Supervisors has found by resolution that a
18 lesser sum will further a proper public purpose, or (3) the Commission or Agency determines,
19 with Director of Property concurrence, that an independent, appropriately qualified real estate
20 economic expert is better suited than an Appraiser to perform the rental analysis. If an
21 Appraisal determines the Market Rent of the Lease exceeds \$60 per square foot per year as
22 base rent, the applicable Commission or Agency shall, through the Director of Property, obtain
23 an Appraisal Review for the Appraisal. Any Appraisal or Appraisal Review shall have an
24 effective date of valuation that is not earlier than nine months before the date legislation for
25 the proposed Lease is submitted to the Board of Supervisors.

1 The requirements in this Section 23.30 for Board of Supervisors approval by resolution shall
2 not apply to leases for Core Initiatives as set forth in Leases approved under Administrative Code
3 Chapter 21B.3.

4
5 **SEC. 23.33. COMPETITIVE BIDDING PROCEDURES.**

6 To the extent that any ordinance, Code provision, or Charter provision gives the City,
7 or any of its commissions, boards, or departments, power to award Leases without
8 competitive bidding, it shall be City policy that, notwithstanding such power, all such Leases
9 that are expected to produce more than \$2,500 per month in revenue be awarded in
10 accordance with Competitive Bidding Procedures, unless such Competitive Bidding
11 Procedures are impractical or impossible. It shall also be City policy that any and all Leases
12 awarded without following the Competitive Bid Procedures shall be in an amount not less than
13 the fair market value of the leased property. If any City department wishes to award a Lease
14 of City-owned property for less than fair market value, it shall make a finding of the public
15 purpose to be served by such Lease, and such Lease and finding shall be subject to the prior
16 approval of the Mayor and the department head, as well as the applicable commission. If
17 there is no commission approval, then such Lease and finding shall also be subject to the
18 prior approval of the Board of Supervisors. The Lease shall also require that the tenant will
19 use the leased premises in accordance with the stated public purpose for the entire lease
20 term. The provisions of this Section 23.33 shall be applied subject to Administrative Code
21 Chapter 21B.3(b) and shall not apply to any leases awarded pursuant to *San Francisco*
22 *Administrative Code Chapters 21B or 23A, the Surplus City Property Ordinance.*

1 Section 45. Behested Payments Waiver.

2 (a) San Francisco has been facing multiple crises related to homelessness, drug
3 overdoses and substance use disorders, mental health needs, integrated health needs, and
4 public safety hiring, and has declared its response to these matters as its “Core Initiatives,” as
5 set forth in Administrative Code Chapter 21B. It is essential that the City respond effectively
6 and quickly to these crises, both on its own through the work of the Designated Departments
7 identified in Chapter 21B, as well as through partnerships with private entities and individuals
8 and community stakeholders who may wish to support such efforts.

9 (b) Entering into public-private partnerships will serve the public interest and is
10 critical to helping the City explore innovative strategies to support the Core Initiatives. The
11 Mayor’s Office seeks to support these efforts, understanding that some of the individuals or
12 entities with whom the City might partner may be considered to be interested parties under
13 the Behested Payments Ordinance (Campaign and Governmental Conduct Code, Section
14 3.600 *et seq.*).

15 (c) The City has rules and policies to ensure Designated Departments receiving
16 outside support do so with transparency. Under Chapter 21B, Designated Departments must
17 annually report to the Board of Supervisors on donations and expenditures related to Core
18 Initiatives and when they enter into Contracts for the purpose of Core Initiatives, and are
19 subject to additional reporting obligations determined by the City Controller. Also, Designated
20 Departments are subject to donor disclosure requirements under Administrative Code Section
21 67.29-6.

22 (d) For the foregoing reasons, the Board of Supervisors under Section 3.620(f) of
23 the Campaign and Governmental Conduct Code hereby waives application of the Behested
24 Payment Ordinance as to the Mayor and employees of the Mayor’s Office so that they may
25 solicit donations from private organizations and individuals to support the Core Initiatives, for a

1 period of six months beginning on the effective date of this Section 5 of this ordinance. The
2 granting of this waiver serves the public interest by supporting the Core Initiatives and, further,
3 does not create an appearance of impropriety.

4 (3) Consistent with Section 3.620(f), this waiver will sunset after six months unless
5 renewed by the Board of Supervisors by resolution.

6
7 Section 56. Effective Dates.

8 (a) Section 45 of this ordinance, which waives application of the Behested
9 Payments Ordinance and which the Board of Supervisors is authorized under Section 3.620(f)
10 of the Campaign and Governmental Conduct Code to adopt by resolution, shall become
11 effective immediately upon enactment.

12 (b) All sections of this ordinance other than Section 45 shall become effective 30

14 (c) Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the
15 ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board
16 of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.

18 Section 67. Scope of Ordinance.

19 In enacting this ordinance, the Board of Supervisors intends to amend only those
20 words, phrases, paragraphs, sections, subsections, articles, numbers, punctuation marks,
21 charts, diagrams, or any other constituent parts of the Municipal Code that are explicitly
22 shown in this ordinance as additions, deletions, Board amendment additions, and Board
23 amendment deletions in accordance with the "Note" that appears under the official title of the
24 ordinance.

1 Section 78. Undertaking For The General Welfare.

2 In enacting and implementing this ordinance, the City is assuming an undertaking only
3 to promote the general welfare. It is not assuming, nor is it imposing on its officers and
4 employees, an obligation for breach of which it is liable in money damages to any person who
5 claims that such breach proximately caused injury.

6

7 Section 8. Committee Amendment.

8 As originally introduced, this ordinance included a Section 2 that would have amended
9 Section 6.76 of the Administrative Code. The ordinance was amended in Committee to
10 remove that provision, with the result that the ordinance does not amend Section 6.76.

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REVISED LEGISLATIVE DIGEST
(Amended in Committee, 1/29/2025)

[Administrative Code - Core Initiatives to Strengthen City’s Responses to Homelessness, Drug Abuse, Mental Health Needs, and Related Crises]

Ordinance amending the Administrative Code to 1) provide that the existing waiver of competitive procurement rules for certain contracts and grants to support projects addressing homelessness will sunset in May 2029; 2) suspend until January 2026 the competitive procurement requirements for contracts, grants, and leases necessary to accelerate the City’s response to homelessness, drug overdoses and substance use disorders, mental health needs, integrated health needs, and public safety hiring (the “Core Initiatives”); 3) delegate to the Mayor the authority to approve certain types of contracts, grants, and leases for Core Initiatives under Charter Section 9.118, if the Board of Supervisors has failed to act within 45 days; 4) suspend until January 2026 the requirement under Chapter 23 of the Administrative Code that the Board of Supervisors approve leases, if the lease is for a Core Initiative; 5) authorize the City until January 2026 to accept gifts, grants, and other donations for Core Initiatives; 6) clarify the authority of the Controller to transfer surplus funds to support Core Initiatives; and 7) authorize the Office of the Mayor for six months to solicit donations from various private entities and organizations to support the City’s work on the Core Initiatives, notwithstanding the Behested Payment Ordinance.

Existing Law

City law requires departments to conduct a competitive process before awarding certain types of contracts and leases. Contracts involving the expenditure of City funds – for example, to procure goods or services, to improve City property, to fund private entities through grants or loans – typically must comply with these rules. Leases of real property owned by the City are subject to similar requirements.

The Administrative Code contains some exceptions to these requirements. For example, under Chapter 21B, competitive bids are not required for the Department of Public Works (“DPW”) or by the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing (“HSH”) to award contracts or grants that support projects addressing homelessness. This exception expires in May 2029, or at such time as the Board of Supervisors (“the Board”) finds that homelessness levels have dropped to a certain level, whichever is earlier.

City law also requires that some contracts and leases obtain Board approval. Under Chapter 23, the Board must approve certain leases – both where the City is the tenant, and where the City is leasing out its own property as the landlord. And Section 9.118 of the City Charter requires Board approval by resolution of contracts and leases that will do any of the following: (1) generate \$1 million or more in revenue for the City, (2) require anticipated expenditures of \$10 million or more, (3) modify an expenditure agreement previously approved by the Board

by \$500,000 or more, (4) have a term of 10 years or more, or (5) sell or transfer City real property. The Board can under certain specific conditions delegate its approval authority under Section 9.118.

The Board also is required to approve most gifts and grants to the City. In most cases, departments have delegated authority to accept gifts of up to \$10,000, and grants of up to \$100,000, without Board approval.

Finally, the City's Behested Payments Ordinance restricts designated City officials and employees from soliciting donations from persons in administrative proceedings before the City, City contractors, lobbyists, and permit consultants (collectively, "interested parties"). The Board is authorized to waive these restrictions for up to six months at a time.

Amendments to Current Law

The proposed ordinance establishes that the existing exemption in Chapter 21B, which allows DPW and HSH to award contracts and grants that support projects addressing homelessness without adhering to local competitive bidding requirements, will expire in May 2029.

The ordinance also suspends and delegates certain approvals for Contracts and Leases entered into by Designated Departments, where the Designated Department has provided the Mayor and the Board a written justification of why the Contract or Lease was necessary to support a Core Initiative.

- The term "Contracts" covers contracts for public works under Chapter 6, contracts for commodities and services under Chapter 21, grants awarded under Chapter 21G, and loan agreements for affordable housing under Chapter 66 and/or Chapter 120. The term "Leases" would be defined as set forth in Chapter 23.
- The "Designated Departments" are DPW, HSH, the Department of Public Health, the Police Department, the Sheriff's Department, the Department of Emergency Management, the Human Services Agency, the Mayor's Office of Housing and Community Development, the City Administrator, and the Department of Human Resources, and any other department or components of City government the Mayor may designate with approval of the Board of Supervisors by resolution.
- The term "Core Initiatives" means one or more of any of the following: (1) Projects Addressing Homelessness, (2) Projects Addressing Drug Overdoses and Substance Use Disorders; (3) Projects Addressing Mental Health Needs; (4) Projects Addressing Integrated Health Needs. and (5) Projects Addressing Public Safety Hiring. The ordinance describes the types of projects that can qualify as Core Initiatives under these sub-categories.

The proposed ordinance would suspend any competitive procurement requirements that may apply under local law, for the Designated Departments' Core Initiative Contracts and Leases. It would also suspend the Chapter 23 requirement concerning the Board's approval of Leases, for Leases that are for Core Initiatives, so long as the Lease does not require the City to pay above market rent. These waivers would apply to all Core Initiative Contracts and Leases awarded on or before January 8, 2026, as well as to those approved by the Mayor following introduction under Charter Section 9.118 of a resolution on or before January 8, 2026, as described in the next paragraph.

As to Charter Section 9.118, the ordinance authorizes the Mayor to approve certain types of Core Initiative Contracts and Leases under Section 9.118(b) and (c) on the Board's behalf. A resolution seeking the Board's approval would first need to be introduced at the Board on or before January 8, 2026. If the Board had failed to act on the resolution within 45 days after introduction (not counting time when the matter was under CEQA review or while the Board was on recess), then the Mayor could approve the Contract or Lease on the Board's behalf.

- The resolution would need to be signed by the Department Head and the Mayor, and state why the Contract or Lease is necessary for a Core Initiative;
- The Contract or Lease could not require anticipated expenditures by City of \$25 million or more, or in the case of a modification or amendment of an existing Contract could not have an impact of \$25 million or more;
- The Contract or Lease could not have a term of ten years or more, or for an amendment or modification of an existing Contract or Lease could not extend the term by ten years or more, with the exception of (A) leases of City property for affordable housing development which shall not exceed 99 years, (B) loans for acquisition, development, construction, rehabilitation, or reconstruction of affordable housing; and (C) grants to subsidize rents or operations of an affordable housing development which shall not exceed 30 years; and
- The Contract or Lease would need to be substantially in the form of the applicable City template for such a Contract or Lease, and incorporate City-standard requirements related to matters such as insurance and indemnity following consultation with the City Attorney and Risk Manager.
- In this context, the Board would have "failed to act" if it had neither approved nor disapproved the resolution within 45 days. Both the defeat of a motion to approve, and the passage of a motion to disapprove, would constitute the disapproval of the resolution.

Until January 8, 2026, the ordinance would also authorize Designated Departments to accept gifts, grants, services, and similar donations (up to \$10 million) provided for the purpose of

supporting the Core Initiatives. And it would clarify the legal authority of the Controller to transfer funds within the City budget for purposes of supporting the Core Initiatives.

Finally, the ordinance would grant the Mayor and the Mayor's Office Staff a six-month waiver from the Behested Payments Ordinance, to facilitate fundraising to support the Core Initiatives.

BACKGROUND

The ordinance suspends competitive procurement rules but does not waive or alter any other contracting requirements that may apply under federal, state, or local law. Also, the ordinance does not expand the general contracting or leasing authority of any Designated Departments.

On January 29, 2025, the ordinance was amended in Committee in the following key respects: requiring Board approval to designate additional departments; requiring additional notice and reporting to the Board; changing the dates when new waivers will expire; tolling the 45-day period for the Board to consider 9.118 resolutions; reducing the 9.118 threshold to \$25 million; eliminating any provisions that would amend Administrative Code Section 6.76; making various clarifying changes; and providing that donations for Core Initiatives may be accepted without further Board approval if the value does not exceed \$10 million.

MANDATE STATEMENT

City Charter Section 2.105 states that all legislative acts shall be by ordinance, approved by a majority of the members of the Board of Supervisors.

BACKGROUND

Contracting

Competitive Solicitation Requirements

The Administrative Code provides procurement regulations for various types of contracts. Chapter 6 pertains to construction contracts, Chapter 21 pertains to professional service contracts, Chapter 21G pertains to grants, and Chapter 23 pertains to leases. In general, each of these code sections requires City Departments to award contracts using competitive solicitations. The Board of Supervisors has approved waivers from competitive bidding requirements for the Department of Homelessness & Supportive Housing and Public Works for contracts addressing homelessness through May 5, 2029, codified in Chapters 6.76 and 21B of the Administrative Code (File 23-1129). The Board also approved waivers from competitive bidding requirements for the Department of Public Health for procuring residential care and treatment services through March 29, 2025 (File 24-0015). That waiver also allowed DPH to enter into such contracts without approval of the Office of Contract Administration.

Board of Supervisors Approval

Section 9.118 of the City Charter requires that the Board of Supervisors approve certain contracts. Section 9.118(b) provides for Board approval of contracts that exceed \$10 million in spending, that have a term greater than ten years, or modifications of such contracts that exceed \$500,000. Section 9.118(c) requires Board approval of leases that have a term greater than ten years, generate more than \$1 million in revenue, or amendments to such leases. 9.118(c) also provides for Board approval of any sale of City property.

Administrative Code Chapter 23 has stricter triggers for Board approval of leases. Leases of City property (excluding enterprise departments) require Board approval. Leases in which the City is a tenant require Board approval if they are longer than one year and/or cost more than \$15,000 per month.

DETAILS OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION

The proposed ordinance would amend Chapter 21B of the Administrative Code to make the following changes:

1. **Waive competitive bidding requirements through May 5, 2029 for contracts** that deliver “Core Initiative” services. The waiver would extend to (1) Public Works, (2) the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing, (3) the Department of Public Health, (4) the Police Department, (5) the Sheriff’s Department, (6) the Department of

Emergency Management, (7) the Human Services Agency, (8) the Mayor's Office of Housing and Community Development, (9) the City Administrator, and (10) the Department of Human Resources, and any other City Department the Mayor chooses, if the Mayor provides written notice to the Board of Supervisors.

Contracts include agreements for public works services, professional services, grants, leases, and loans for affordable housing.

2. Defines **Core Initiatives** as projects addressing homelessness, substance use disorder, mental health, integrated health, and public safety hiring.¹
3. **Delegates authority under City Charter Section 9.118(b) and 9.118(c) from the Board of Supervisors to the City Department Heads to enter into contracts for Core Initiatives if all of the following conditions are met:**
 - a. **A resolution seeking Board of Supervisors approval of the contract is introduced before January 8, 2026.**
 - b. The Board of Supervisors has not approved or rejected the resolution within 45 days of introduction. The 45-day timeline begins on the date the legislation is introduced at a Board of Supervisors meeting. To reject a resolution approving a Core Initiative contract, the full Board of Supervisors, not a committee, must reject the resolution.
 - c. The resolution is signed by the Department Head and the Mayor and states why the contract is necessary for a Core Initiative.
 - d. The contract does not exceed \$50 million in City spending, or in the case of a modification to an existing contract, does not have an impact of \$50 million or more.
 - e. The contract does not have a term of ten years or more, or in the case of a modification of an existing contract, does not extend the contract term by ten years or more. Leases for affordable housing may have a term of up to 99 years and grants subsidizing affordable housing may have terms up to thirty years. The limit on contract duration does not apply to loans for affordable housing.
 - f. The contract conforms to standards set by the City Attorney and Risk Manager.

¹ Integrated health is defined in the ordinance as projects designed to serve people who are at risk of experiencing homelessness due to the potential loss of their shelter, housing, or release from an institution. These projects include, but are not limited to, shelter health services, linkages, case management, wrap around services, eligibility and benefits enrollment, and navigation services. Projects Addressing Public Safety Hiring means projects to support the hiring process for, and/or the recruitment, training, and retention of, police officers, deputy sheriffs, and 911 operators.

4. **Delegates authority from the Board of Supervisors to City Departments through May 5, 2029 to accept and expend** gifts, grants from nongovernmental sources, services, bequests of money, and other donations to support Core Initiatives.
5. **Clarifies the authority of the Controller to transfer money within the same fund and same City Department through May 5, 2029.** Administrative Code Section 3.18 currently allows such transfers if the accounts have not been reduced by the Mayor or Board during the budget process and requires notification to the Board if the transfers exceed ten percent of the account being augmented.

The Controller's Accounting Policies and Procedures require Departments to justify such transfers to the Controller and generally discourage Departments from seeking transfers that do not meet the ten percent rule. Under the proposed ordinance, transfers within the same fund and Department related to Core Initiatives would be approved by the Controller, so long as the account was not reduced by the Mayor or Board in the budget process.

The proposed ordinance also:

6. **Delegates authority from the Board of Supervisors to the Director of Property to execute leases related to Core Initiatives through May 5, 2029,** unless the leases meet the Charter 9.118(c) criteria of having a term greater than ten years or generating revenue of \$1 million or more.
7. **Waives requirements from Administrative Code Chapter 6 (Public Works Contracting), Chapter 14B (Local Business Enterprise), the San Francisco Labor & Employment Code, and San Francisco Environment Code through May 5, 2029** for public works contracts related to the Core Initiatives. Projects addressing homelessness already have a waiver from these requirements through May 5, 2029 or when the Point In Time Count for unsheltered people falls below 2,199.
8. Provides a **behested payments waiver** for all staff in the **Mayor's Office** for six months following approval of the proposed ordinance. The waiver would allow the Mayor and his staff to solicit donations to fund Core Initiatives from Interested Parties, which are defined in the Campaign and Governmental Conduct Code as (a) entities seeking permits, licenses, or other entitlements, (b) contractors, (c) lobbyists, or (d) permit consultants, when they are seeking approval from the City official requesting payment to a third party. According to the Ethics Commission, under State law, behested payments must be disclosed. Under San Francisco Campaign and Governmental Conduct Code, behested payments solicited by City officials from Interested Parties are forbidden unless a waiver is approved by the Board of Supervisors.
9. Removes a sunset provision in Administrative Code Chapter 21B (which currently only provides a competitive solicitation waiver for homeless projects), which currently provides for expiration of that code section when the Point In Time Count for unsheltered people falls below 2,199.

Reporting to the Board of Supervisors

The proposed ordinance includes the following annual reporting to the Board of Supervisors: (a) All donations and related expenditures and (b) All contracts entered into without competitive bidding, including the name of the contractor, service, amount of funding conveyed or received by the City, the term of the contract, and any measurable outcomes.

FISCAL IMPACT

The fiscal impact of the proposed ordinance is difficult to estimate since the universe of contracts that will be awarded or amended is not yet known. In addition, the amount of fundraising that could offset any new costs is not known. Exhibit 1 below shows the total grant and contract budget for the Departments that are designated in the proposed ordinance to undertake Core Initiatives in FY 2024-25, which totals \$1.1 billion in the General Fund.

The table below does not show the total fiscal impact of the proposed changes to procurement regulations but does provide a universe of contract spending. It does not include spending funded by the Homelessness Gross Receipts tax or state grants.

We believe that waiving competitive solicitation requirements is likely to increase City costs for service delivery. However, according to the Departments of Public Health and Homelessness & Supportive Housing, service provider capacity, provider experience, and program design, rather than cost, are the primary determinants of which non-profits receive City funding.

POLICY CONSIDERATIONS

The proposed ordinance would expedite contracting for Core Initiatives in three ways: (1) waiving competitive solicitation requirements, (2) eliminating Board of Supervisors review of certain leases, and (3) by setting a time limit for Board of Supervisors review of certain large contracts. According to the Mayor’s Office, the purpose of these changes is to expedite delivery of 1,500 shelter and treatment slots within six months. According to City data, there are 3,650 shelter

slots and 575 substance use treatment slots funded by the City. We were not able to compile the number of mental health bed by publication time.

According to interviews with City staff, a typical procurement process takes 6-8 months, including the competitive solicitation process (two months) and Board of Supervisors review (one to two months). The elimination of a competitive process and Board of review of leases, in particular, will likely reduce the contracting timeline. The Board review of large contracts typically takes 45-60 days, so that proposed change could speed up contracting by up to two weeks, on average.

At the same time, the proposed changes carry significant risks. The ordinance reduces key protections for procurement integrity (competitive solicitations, Board of Supervisors review). It allows the Mayor to request payments from City contractors and other interested parties while selecting new contractors or amending existing contracts, and expedites Board review of certain contracts during which City staff may not be able to respond to Board inquiries regarding program design, cost, or effectiveness. The Mayor would be able to enter into leases (for terms up to ten years) for Core Initiatives in any neighborhood in San Francisco without the review, approval, or knowledge of the district Supervisor. The proposed ordinance also allows the Mayor to alter the budgets of City Departments after the Board has adopted an appropriation ordinance. The proposed changes would result in an extraordinary diminishment of Board of Supervisors authority and for that reason, we consider approval to be a policy matter for the Board of Supervisors.

The Board of Supervisors should consider amending the proposed ordinance to limit the scope and duration of the requested authority and associated risks, such as:

- a) remove waivers from competitive solicitation requirements or requiring a less structured competitive solicitation process than is required by the municipal code
- b) remove or extend the expedited timeline to review 9.118 contracts,
- c) reduce the size of contracts that are eligible for expedited Board approval,
- d) remove the delegated authority to enter into leases,
- e) limit the duration of the delegated authorities to six months,
- f) limit the scope of services eligible for streamlined contracting and/or Board review (such as just for opioid treatment or shelter services),
- g) request the Mayor's Office disclose more information about its fundraising strategy (such as who the Interested Parties will be, what programs and contractors they will fund) before providing a behested payment waiver
- h) remove language that allows the Mayor to designate additional Departments that may use the proposed streamlined procurement processes without Board approval
- i) remove language that allows the Mayor and Controller to shift funding within Department budgets without Board approval

Other Procurement Processes Not Addressed in Proposed Ordinance

The proposed ordinance does not address other steps in the procurement process that can add to the time and expense of contracting, including review by Departmental commissions, the Civil Service Commission, the Office of Contract Administration, and the City Attorney. Collectively, these other entities contribute to a larger share of the procurement process timeline than the competitive solicitation process or Board of Supervisors review. The Board should work with the Mayor to eliminate or set time limits for these reviews as well. Certain actions to increase the speed of the City's procurement process may require additional legislation though others could be accomplished by executive action.

In addition, according to interviews with City staff, certain social requirements (which are not addressed in the proposed ordinance) can add to the time and expense of contracting with the City, including:

- Local Business Enterprise requirements (Chapter 14B of the Administrative Code)²
- First Source Hiring (Chapter 83 of the Administrative Code)
- Wood Attributes (Chapters 8 and 13 of the Environment Code)
- Use of Non-Recyclable Materials (Chapter 16 of the Environment Code)
- Prohibiting Bottled Water (Chapter 24 of the Environment Code)

The Board may wish to amend or suspend these or other contracting requirements for the Core Initiatives as well.

Context for this legislation

The current approach is not working: The situation on the streets of San Francisco is dire, with people tragically losing their lives every day.

To address this crisis, we need to bring people indoors: To address street conditions and provide humane treatment quickly, it is critical to hire more public safety and public health professionals, stabilize those in need indoors, and provide pathways to real treatment

It is too hard to act quickly: addressing the crisis requires many solutions, but complex bureaucracy too often leads to piecemeal half-measures that end up being costly. We need speed with responsibility.

Goals of this legislation

Allow us to act quickly: The legislation allows the city to enlist the personnel and services needed to act more quickly

Enable us to better address street conditions and bring people in need indoors to receive the treatment or shelter needed

Create time certainty, while preserving oversight: by introducing a “shot clock”, Supervisors still play a critical oversight role and departmental reporting requirements ensure there is accountability for outcomes

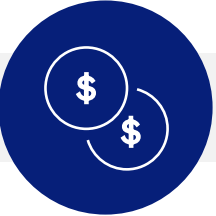

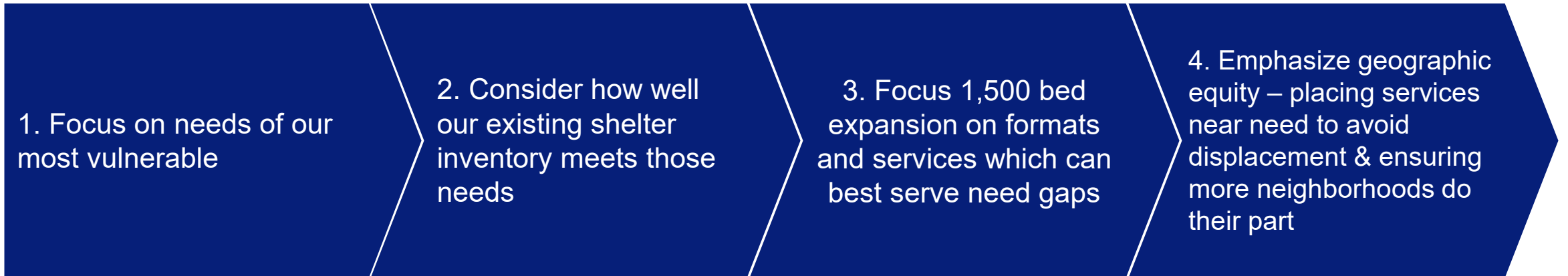

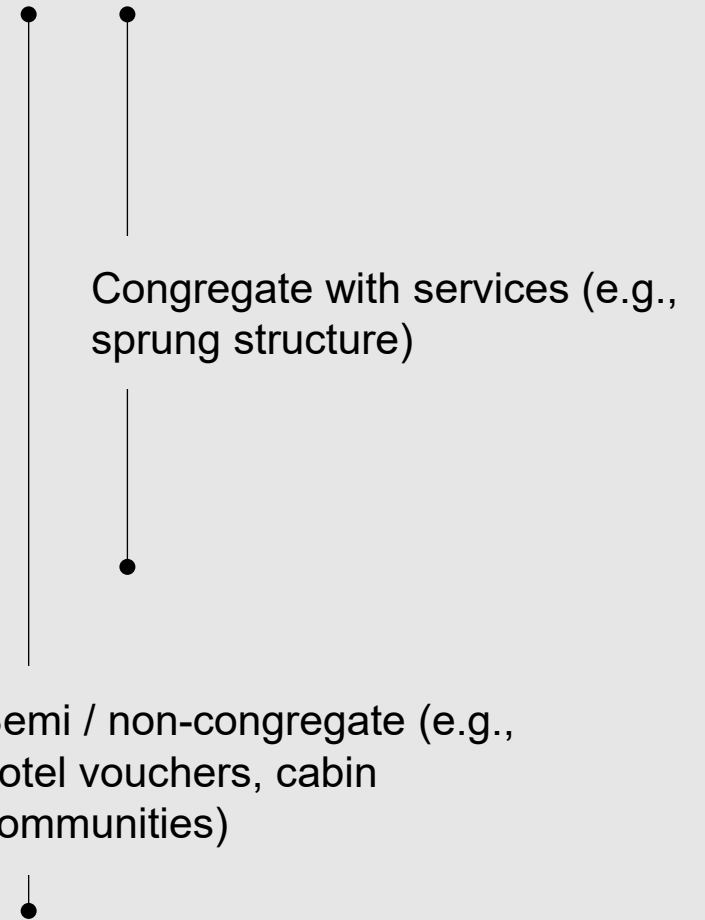

Overview of key elements in the ordinance

Expedition of Lease Approvals Under Specific Codes: Department head must provide written justification, detailing why the contract is essential to support a core initiative*

9.118 Contracts:

- **Resolution Timeline:** Must be introduced before January 8, 2026
- **Signatures Required:** The contract must be signed by both the department head and the mayor, with a statement explaining why the contract is necessary for core initiatives
- **Financial Scope:** The contract value must be between \$10 million and \$50 million. Contracts valued under \$10 million do not require Board of Supervisors (BOS) approval. For modifications to existing contracts, the financial impact must not reach or exceed \$50 million*
- **Duration:** The contract must not exceed a term of ten years. For modifications, the extension must not add ten years or more to the original contract term
- **Exceptions:** Affordable housing leases with terms under 99 years, loans for affordable housing, grants for affordable housing with terms under 30 years
- **Shot Clock:** If BOS fails to act within 45 days from the date of introduction, delegation takes effect*

San Francisco deserves a permanent Drug Market Agency Coordination Center, an SF Hospitality Zone Task Force, a 24/7 drop-off Crisis Stabilization Unit, and for it to be easier to procure resources, write contracts, issue funding, and hire workers to make San Francisco safer.

Dear Chair Chan and Committee Members,

On behalf of both the Safer Inside and Treatment on Demand Coalitions — two coalitions deeply committed to improving the health and well-being of San Francisco's most vulnerable residents — we write to express our concerns about the proposed ordinance to amend the Administrative Code as referenced above. Collectively, we represent decades of experience working directly with individuals in crisis, and we bring a wealth of knowledge about effective, evidence-based approaches to increasing healthy outcomes and addressing complex issues such as homelessness, behavioral healthcare, and substance use disorder.

While we recognize and share the sense of urgency underlying this ordinance, we believe its provisions stand to undermine the principles of transparency, accountability, and collaboration that are critical for meaningful progress and garnering public trust.

Undermining Transparency and Accountability

The ordinance's provisions to waive competitive procurement requirements, bypass Board oversight on contracts after 45 days, and remove Board approval for leases tied to Core Initiatives pose significant reason for pause. Competitive procurement processes exist to ensure fairness, accountability, and the efficient use of public funds. Removing these safeguards and eliminating a critical layer of scrutiny for major public expenditures *creates* opportunities for inefficiency, with no evidence suggesting that such waivers will meaningfully improve community health outcomes. The ordinance does not provide evidence to demonstrate that these processes cause delays or inefficiencies or that they serve as barriers to treatment on demand or adequate shelter and overdose prevention resources.

Similarly, allowing department heads to approve contracts and leases with minimal oversight weakens the system of checks and balances that is fundamental to effective governance. These provisions risk eroding public trust, particularly in areas such as behavioral health, where specialized expertise and rigorous oversight — from both the local and state levels — are essential.

Failure to Include Stakeholder Input

The ordinance does not reflect meaningful engagement with community-based organizations, individuals with lived experience, or behavioral health experts. These voices are integral to designing interventions that address gaps in services and to ensuring that solutions are practical and equitable.

As providers working on the front lines, we know that addressing homelessness, mental health crises, and substance use disorders requires strategies that are co-designed with those closest to the issues. Excluding these stakeholders weakens the initiatives' effectiveness and risks alienating the communities we seek to support.

Absence of Clear Goals and Metrics

While the ordinance purports to strengthen the City's response to homelessness, behavioral health, and substance use disorders, it fails to offer concrete solutions or meaningful strategies to address these crises. Instead, it prioritizes administrative shortcuts over the substantive, evidence-based interventions that are necessary to meet the needs of people who use drugs and those experiencing homelessness.

The ordinance identifies broad areas of focus, such as reducing overdose deaths and addressing mental health needs, but it provides no specific, measurable objectives or mechanisms to do so or to track progress. Without clear goals or metrics, the City cannot be held accountable for outcomes, nor can the effectiveness of these initiatives be evaluated. Effective responses to these issues require detailed plans grounded in data, evidence-based practices, and accountability.

Centralization of Authority

The proposal consolidates significant authority in the Mayor's Office, including the ability to designate additional departments and reallocate surplus funds. While we understand the importance of streamlined decision-making, this centralization risks sidelining collaborative governance, which is crucial for addressing multifaceted issues like homelessness and behavioral health.

Potential for Conflicts of Interest

The six-month waiver of the Behested Payments Ordinance to allow the Mayor's Office to solicit private donations raises serious concerns about conflicts of interest. Bypassing established safeguards undermines public confidence and creates the appearance of impropriety. Transparent fundraising and donor relationships are essential to maintaining trust in the City's efforts.

Our Commitment to Collaboration

Thank you for considering our perspective. We deeply appreciate the Mayor's leadership in prioritizing responses to homelessness, substance use disorders, and mental health crises. These are urgent challenges that demand bold action; however, this ordinance does not provide the comprehensive, community-driven solutions that these crises require.

As coalitions with extensive experience in behavioral health and substance use disorder treatment, we urge the Committee to carefully reconsider this proposal. The City's response must be rooted in accountability, collaboration, and equity to ensure it effectively addresses the needs of San Francisco's most vulnerable residents. Dear Ms. Campbell and Messrs. Menard and Holober:

We take great umbrage with the Budget and Legislative Analyst’s characterization of Chapter 14B of the Administrative Code as being one of “*certain social requirements*” [emphasis added] that “can add to the time and expense of contracting with the City.” While the BLA’s Legislative Digest attributes this characterization to hearsay “interviews with City staff,” its insertion without providing accurate, balanced analysis contributes to a grossly distorted picture of the important role of the Local Business Enterprise (LBE) ordinance in the City’s economic sustainability.

The City-certified LBE program is not meant to serve as feel-good social welfare. LBEs, many of whom are utilized by out-of-town and out-of-state prime contractors, provide a vital conduit for the reinvestment of City contracting dollars into the local economy, in the form of high-quality, locally-sourced jobs, tax payments, etc. The economic role of LBEs is multiplied even further when they themselves are utilized as the primes. LBE subcontractors oftentimes finance City projects by not being paid until the City pays the prime. This practice of “paid when paid” is a form of interest-free financing of City work that is rarely taken into account when the true economic value of LBEs is considered.

Please correct your report to remove the insinuation of Chapter 14B as a “social requirement” that drains the City of time and money. It is a sorely underutilized instrument of time- and cost-effective local know-how towards responsible local economic development.
