Resolution authorizing the Department of Emergency Management, as primary grantee and fiscal agent for the Capitol-Bay Planning Area, to retroactively accept and expend a FY2010 Interoperable Emergency Communications Program Grant award in the amount of \$1,227,632 from the United States Department of Homeland Security, through the California Emergency Management Agency, for the period July 1, 2010, to March 31, 2013.

WHEREAS, The Interoperable Emergency Communications Grant Program (IECGP) is designed to address systemic shortfalls in emergency communication systems and to improve local, tribal, regional, statewide, and national interoperable emergency communications, including communications in collective response to natural disasters, acts of terrorism, and other man-made disasters; and,

WHEREAS, IECGP funding enables states, territories, local units of government, and tribal communities to implement their Statewide Communication Interoperability Plans (SCIP) and align to the National Emergency Communications Plan (NECP) to further enhance interoperability; and,

WHEREAS, The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), under the Federal Department of Homeland Security (DHS), administers the IECGP and in California, IECGP grant funds are allocated through the California Emergency Management Agency (Cal EMA); and,

WHEREAS, In connection with the California SCIP, the City and County of San Francisco and its regional partners the Counties of Alameda, Contra Costa, Marin, Monterey, Napa, San Benito, San Mateo, Santa Cruz, Santa Clara, Solano, and Sonoma (collectively,

the "Bay Region partners") are working collaboratively with the County of Sacramento and its regional partners the Counties of Alpine, Amador, Calaveras, El Dorado, Placer, San Joaquin, Stanislaus, Tuolumne, and Yolo (collectively, the "Capitol Region partners"); and,

WHEREAS, Together, the Capitol Region partners and Bay Region partners constitute the Capitol-Bay Planning Area; and,

WHEREAS, For purposes of the IECGP, the City and County of San Francisco is the primary grantee and fiscal agent from the Capitol-Bay Planning Area; and

WHEREAS, FEMA has allocated IECGP grant funds in the amount of \$1,227,632 to the Capitol-Bay Planning Area; and,

WHEREAS, The Capitol-Bay Planning Area intends to use the grant funds for an interoperable communication project that encompasses planning, training, and equipment among the partner jurisdictions in both the Capitol and Bay Area regions and benefits all recipient jurisdictions; and,

WHEREAS, The grant period is from July 1, 2010 to March 31, 2013; and, WHEREAS, The grant does not require an ASO amendment; and,

WHEREAS, The grant does not include any provisions for indirect costs; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes the Department of Emergency Management, on behalf of the City and County of San Francisco in its capacity as primary IECGP grantee and fiscal agent to the Capitol-Bay Planning Area, to retroactively accept and expend a Fiscal Year 2010 IECGP grant in the amount of \$1,227,632 from the DHS, through the Cal EMA; and, be it

## Legislation For Approval:

The proposed resolution seeks the Board of Supervisors' approval for the acceptance (retroactive) and expenditure of \$1,227,632 in funds from the United States Department of Homeland Security through the California Emergency Management Agency, to establish formal interoperable communications governance structures and common planning and operational protocols as well as enhance emergency responders' skills and capabilities through training and exercises.

## **Departments:**

Department of Emergency Management (DEM). Department will act as fiscal agent and expenditures are to the City and County of San Francisco and its regional partners the Counties of Alameda, Contra Costa, Marin, Monterey, Napa, San Benito, San Mateo, Santa Cruz, Santa Clara, Solano, and Sonoma (collectively, the Bay Region partners) and will work collaboratively with the County of Sacramento and its regional partners the Counties of Alpine, Amador, Calaveras, El Dorado, Placer, San Joaquin, Stanislaus, Tuolumne, and Yolo (collectively, the Capitol Region partners).

## Amount:

Grant allocation to the Capitol-Bay Region in the amount of \$1,227,632 to be allocated to the above jurisdictions by agreement of the Urban Area Working Group (UAWG) which will act as the Bay Region executive steering committee.

Report for Resolution to Accept and Expend FY 10 Interoperable Emergency Communications Grant Program Grant April 25, 2011

## **Grant Period:**

July 1, 2010 through March 31, 2013

## Source of funds:

U.S. Department of Homeland Security. 25 % Match required on equipment purchases only. No equipment to be purchased by San Francisco.

## **Indirect Costs:**

The proposed resolution waives indirect costs, because the grant program does not allow the charging of indirect costs.

## **Description:**

The proposed resolution authorizes the Department of Emergency Management to retroactively accept and expend \$1,227,632 in federal grant funding from the FY 2010 Interoperable Emergency Communications Grant Program (Award #21010-IP-T0-0016, OES #075-95017), issued by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS) through the California Emergency Management Agency (CalEMA) to establish formal interoperable communications governance structures and common planning and operational protocols as well as enhance emergency responders' skills and capabilities through training and exercises.

Grant funds will be allocated to the following activities to accomplish the following tasks:

- (1) Equipment: \$147,500 has been allocated for the purchase of Wide Area Digital Equipment for Sacramento and is subject to a 25% match requirement to be met by Sacramento. No match funds will be provided by San Francisco.
- (2) <u>Planning:</u> \$989,030 has been allocated to develop plans, conduct microwave assessments and waiver studies, and oversee and coordinate the broadband waiver governance plan, and equipment and exercise projects. Existing San Francisco grant funded staff will provide any planning efforts so no Annual Salary Ordinance amendment is required. San Francisco will not develop any contracts. Other partner jurisdictions may develop contracts and will utilize their internal contracting processes.
- (3) Exercise: \$30,000 has been allocated for the conduct of a workshop hosted by Sacramento.
- (4) M & A: \$61,102 has been allocated for all management and administration expenses.

- This grant was received by the City and County of San Francisco from the Department of Homeland Security and is a pass through from the California Emergency Management Agency for the Capitol-Bay region. San Francisco will act as the fiscal agent for these funds.
