Resolution approving the FY2011-2012 HOME Investment Partnership (HOME) Program; and authorizing the Mayor, on behalf of the City and County of San Francisco, to apply for, accept, and expend the City's FY2011-2012 HOME Program entitlement from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) in the amount of \$7,576,727, and to expend Program Income in the amount of \$430,000.

WHEREAS, Under Title II of the National Affordable Housing Act of 1990, Public Law Number 101-625, the City and County of San Francisco is eligible to apply for and receive funds from the HOME Investment Partnership (HOME) Program; and,

WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco anticipates receiving approximately \$7,576,727 in 2011 HOME Program funds from HUD, and estimates \$430,000 in Program Income from previous HOME grants; and,

WHEREAS, The Mayor's Office of Housing (MOH) has prepared programs and a proposed Expenditure Schedule for an anticipated entitlement and program income totaling \$8,006,727, a copy of which is located in Board File No. 110563 (the "Expenditure Schedule"); and,

WHEREAS, The proposed grant does not require an Annual Salary Ordinance amendment; and,

WHEREAS, The funding agency (HUD) does not allow use of grant on indirect costs; and,

WHEREAS, The HOME Program will be used to provide funds for development, acquisition, and rehabilitation of low-income housing; and,

WHEREAS, A portion of the administrative and direct costs of administering the HOME Program are to be paid from the FY2011-2012 HOME Program allocation; and,

WHEREAS, The remainder of the administrative and direct costs of administering the HOME Program is an eligible Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) expense, and will be paid from CDBG funds through the FY2011-2012 CDBG Program; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Mayor of the City and County of San Francisco is hereby authorized to apply for, accept, and expend the City's FY2011-2012 HOME Program entitlement grant from HUD and an estimated \$430,000 in HOME Program Income, all in accordance with the purposes and goals for the funding as generally set forth in the 2010-14 Five Year Consolidated Plan and the Expenditure Schedule; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors does hereby approve the purposes and goals for the FY2011-2012 HOME Program funding as set forth in the Expenditure Schedule, on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors and incorporated herein by reference; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby waives inclusion of indirect costs in the grant budget; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Mayor is hereby authorized to enter into and execute agreements between the City and County of San Francisco and the various agencies consistent with the FY2011-2012 HOME Program and the Expenditure Schedule; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Mayor is hereby authorized to submit documentation and certifications as may be requested or required by HUD, and to take such additional actions as may be required to apply for, accept and expend the FY2011-2012 HOME funds consistent with this Resolution and the goals of the FY2011-2012 HOME Program and all applicable legal requirements; and, be it

consistent with this Resolution and the goals of the FY2011-2012 CDBG Program and all applicable legal requirements; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That all actions heretofore taken by the officers of the City with respect to the application for, or the acceptance or expenditure of, FY2011-2012 CDBG funds, Reprogrammed Funds and Program Income are hereby approved, confirmed and ratified.

2011 CDBG Program Administration; Capital Projects; Economic Development and Microenterprise Assistance; Workforce Development; Emergency Shelter Grants; Planning and Capacity Building; Public Services, Housing Program Grants and Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS.

AMOUNT: \$23,499,022.00

Due to ongoing uncertainty in the development of the 2011 Federal Budget the amounts of individual grants to sub-recipients are estimates and set at a not to exceed level.

**DESCRIPTION:** The project consists of overall non-construction costs for the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), Emergency Shelter Grant (ESG) HOME Investment Partnership (HOME) and Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS (HOPWA) Programs.

The resources of the CDBG program will be used by the City and County of San Francisco to develop flexible, locally designed community development strategies to address the program's primary objective, which is the development of viable urban communities. San Francisco's CDBG program revitalizes neighborhoods by funding local programs that develops workforces, economic development, housing and improved community facilities and services.

The San Francisco ESG program will improve the quality of existing emergency shelters for the homeless; provide additional emergency shelters; help meet the costs of operating emergency shelters; and provide certain essential social services to homeless individuals. The program also funds preventive programs and activities that will reduce the number of people who become homeless

The City and County will use HOME funds for rehabilitation, new construction, acquisition of affordable housing and tenant-based rental assistance

HOPWA program funds will be used to prevent homelessness of persons with HIV/AIDS and to meet the housing needs of persons with HIV/AIDS, including lease/rental assistance, shared housing arrangements, apartments, single room occupancy (SRO) dwellings and community residences. Supportive services may also be included in the program.

All costs addressed in this Programmatic Review are limited to non-construction activities. These costs include but are not limited to Architectural, Design and Engineering Services for Capital Projects; Program Administration; Housing Program Administration; Technical Assistance; Planning, Housing Program Grants and Public Services including but not limited to: vocational training, legal, fair housing, children's and health services, business and educational counseling programs for low/moderate income households and qualifying businesses. The project also includes Community Economic Development activities that lead to the employment of low-income persons. A large number of sub-recipient organizations as well as City agencies are involved in the listed activities. (See attached Table 2.)
