On behalf of the California Native Plant Society Yerba Buena Chapter, Golden Gate Audubon Society, Nature in the City, the Center for Biological Diversity, the San Francisco League of Conservation Voters, and our collective membership of over 40,000 individuals, I am writing you to recommend Pam Hemphill and Philip Gerrie for appointment to San Francisco's Commission of Animal Control and Welfare. #### Statement from Sally Stephens Application for Reappointment to Seat 5 Commission on Animal Control and Welfare 5/23/11

I would appreciate the opportunity to continue to serve on the SF Commission on Animal Control and Welfare. The Commission acts as the Board's eyes and ears about issues and concerns involving all animals, both domestic and wild. I am personally committed to ensuring the safety and well being of all animals, and I consider it a great honor to serve on the Commission.

I was appointed to Seat 5 four years ago. In January 2008, after serving for six months, I was elected Chair of the Commission. As Chair, I prepare the agenda each month, and make the copies of the agenda and the minutes distributed to the public at meetings. I am the contact for the Commission with the Deputy City Attorney's office and other city offices, and am responsible for ensuring the other Commissioners understand Sunshine Law regulations, especially seriatim meeting prohibitions. I take the responsibilities of Chair seriously, and endeavor to conduct Commission meetings in a way that fosters civil discussion of the issues and respects all viewpoints.

In February 2009, I was appointed by the Commission to be its non-voting representative on the Joint Zoo Oversight Committee of the Recreation and Park Commission. I feel strongly that the appointment can be a bridge between animal welfare advocates and Zoo officials – two groups frequently at odds. In an attempt to foster better communications, I have organized meetings between the two groups. These meetings have centered on discussions about specific animals, their facilities and welfare.

Since becoming Chair, I have spent much time and energy on the administrative end of running the Commission, especially since we have no administrative support and no budget. I have also been actively involved behind-the-scenes, working to research and provide background information on issues brought before the Commission. I researched and brought to the Commission the idea of a ban on cat declawing, that was then passed by the Board of Supervisors in 2009. I was one of two primary writers of the Commission's report on animal welfare at the Zoo.

I have used my training as a scientist and as a science writer to gather and present facts and information on these complicated issues to help guide the Commission in its deliberations. I have worked to ensure that recommendations from the Commission to the Board of Supervisors are well thought out, well researched, workable, and fair. For example, the Commission held extensive discussions on the subject of "No Kill" (no potentially adoptable animal is ever euthanized at a shelter). Over nearly two years, we heard presentations from a wide variety of experts on the issue, to ensure we had the basic information necessary to make any decisions. Ultimately, we decided not to recommend that the Board create a legislative mandate of No Kill because we did not think it was workable at this point, even though many who attended our meetings wanted us to do so. We did what we thought was right, not what was popular.

I have been the Chair of the San Francisco Dog Owners Group (SFDOG) for seven years, serving as its Communications Director for a year before that. SFDOG advocates strongly for responsible dog ownership/guardianship. We also advocate for off-leash opportunities for dogs that are truly under voice control. At SFDOG, I have developed programs designed to increase and promote cooperation and understanding among different groups – a Dog-Horse Socialization workshop, dog park behavior workshops, Park Petiquette flyer, Dog Body Language program for Recreation and Park Dept. gardeners, and a Kids Read to Dogs childhood literacy program. I believe that, with education and common courtesy and respect, we can all get along.

I also believe strongly that everyone should give back to the City in which they live. I am active in my neighborhood, serving one the board of the Golden Gate Heights Neighborhood Association for the past nine years, initially as Secretary, and, for the past year, as President. I have been on the board of the Sunset Community Democratic Club for five years. I am an active supporter of parks, helping co-found and co-chair Friends of Golden Gate Heights Park. I have worked with the Neighborhood Parks Council over the years on a number of issues, including helping mediate minor disputes at several parks before they could become major problems. I am part of a group of neighbors who plan and hold a neighborhood block party every summer (this summer will be our 10<sup>th</sup> annual event) in which we get an official street closure and fire up the barbecues.

Like everyone who applies for this Commission, I love animals. I have actively supported wildlife protection programs and environmental groups my entire adult life – nearly 40 years now – at the local, national, and international level. Although my recent experience has focused on dogs, I can and do consider the needs and concerns of ALL animals in my Commission deliberations. I strongly believe that a society can be judged by how it treats its animals, and I want to ensure that San Francisco protects the safety and well being of all its animals. I would appreciate your support for my reappointment to seat 5 of the SF-Commission on Animal Control and Welfare.

#### Statement of Qualifications/ Pam Hemphill MD / May 22, 2011

Like the other three commissioners whose terms are expiring, I have had the privilege of serving as a commissioner on the Animal Control and Welfare Commission for four years. There are many animal issues in San Francisco that need attention...issues with domestic animals, wildlife, food animals, zoo animals and others. One might not expect our 47 square mile city to have so many animals, but it does.

I am a supporter of all animals and their interests, however I have long been particularly interested in wildlife issues in San Francisco, because these animals are often ignored and, unlike our pet population, have no one to speak up for them.

The following is a brief summary of agenda items that I have personally brought to the Commission during my service and for which I have sought and continue to seek solutions:

- Ongoing investigation of why an unusually high number of Western Gulls are dying at Pier 94. There have been reports of these birds dying in the area of Pier 94 for years. In a recent count from early November 2010 to early March 2011, 96 dead, dying or sick birds were found there. Necropsies have shown several causes including aspergillosis, but no source has yet been determined. California Fish and Game, U S Fish and Wildlife, and the Port of San Francisco have all become involved.
- Public education on coexisting with coyotes (in 2007, immediately after the shooting of the parent coyotes in Golden Gate Park who were protecting their young), ongoing effort, including an educational radio show
- Problem of wildlife trapped for 7 to 10 days, without food and water, inside the 3 mile fence put up around the Outside Lands concert in Golden Gate Park each August since 2008 (a 5 year contract exists between SF and the promoters), as well as the problem of habitat degradation, in the form of night lighting, loud music and trampling by the crowds
- Lights Out for Birds program, a voluntary program to encourage downtown building owners to turn off unnecessary lights to protect migrating birds and additionally to save energy
- Developed contract guidelines for goat companies operating in San Francisco, to prevent wildlife being caught inside their electric fences for long periods of time.
   Ongoing monitoring to see if this problem has been resolved.

- Highlighted low live-release rates on non-dog, non-cat animals at ACC and sought solutions. For dogs and cats at ACC the live release rate is around 87%, for wildlife, it is below 50%.
- Supported an EIR for the Beach Chalet soccer field improvement project due to its potential harm to the habitat and to wildlife
- Problem of illegal fireworks on the Fourth of July in 4 parks, Stow Lake, Lake Merced, Heron's Head and Agua Vista, causing nesting birds to abandon their nests
- Opposed funding of a video financed by Grants for the Arts using hotel tax money, showing animals such as a fawn and a dog, being bludgeoned to death with a sledgehammer

Additionally, I have been an active participant in ACWC meetings on all topics (zoo, no-kill, etc) and have also participated in the following:

- During the May 2008, Cosco Busan oil spill, I trained as a volunteer for beach cleanup and also transported birds from ACC to the East Bay.
- From November 2008 to March 2009 I rode bicycles with the interim director of the Recreation and Parks Department on his tour of all of the parks and natural areas in San Francisco (59 rides, covering 240 properties), considering wildlife habitat, evaluating dog play areas and becoming much more familiar with all areas of the city.
- I have also volunteered (with my daughter) for the SPCA, socializing many feral kittens and trapping feral cats for neutering. I am a strong supporter of spay/neuter to reduce the problem of homeless dogs and cats. I just trapped a neighborhood feral cat today and will take him to the SPCA for neutering.

I have found my work on the Animal Control and Welfare Commission to be rewarding, if challenging at times. I am looking forward to continuing to hold my commission seat.



#### Dear Supervisors:

I first became interested in animal advocacy when I was shown a film on animal exploitation in my high school Biology class. That day my eyes were forever opened to the cruelty of the farm industry, and I became a vegetarian. This past year I became vegan and made the decision to reduce my professional workload to allow more time to advocate for animals. I can no longer go through my day without acknowledging how much of what we do, what we wear and what we eat are connected to the suffering of animals, nor can I justify why I am not doing more about it. It is in this light that I am applying for a position as a member of the general public for Seat 3, 4, 5, or 6 on the SF Commission of Animal Control and Welfare.

My unique abilities as a Psychiatrist are particularly effective in animal advocacy. As Chief Resident during my training, and now as Head Psychiatrist and Counseling Supervisor at a university health center, I have extensive experience in public speaking through educational presentations, lectures, and workshops. My expertise in relating to people of all walks of life and helping them understand and adjust their thoughts, actions and behaviors can be directly applied to specific animal issues in which the public is asked to reconsider their longstanding beliefs and behaviors. #### **Board Qualifications:**

The Commission of Animal Control and Welfare consists of 11 members, seven of whom are voting members appointed by the Board of Supervisors. The voting members appointed by the Board of Supervisors shall be six members representing the general public having interest and experience in animal matters and one licensed veterinarian practicing in San Francisco.

The other four members who are non-voting members include the following: One member shall consist of the Director of the Animal Care and Control Department or his or her designated representative. One City Department representative member shall be appointed by each of the following: the Director of the Department of Public Health or his or her designated representative; the Chief of Police or his or her designated representative; and the General Manager of the Recreation and Park Department or his or her designated representative.

Each member of the Commission of Animal Control and Welfare of the City and County of San Francisco shall be a resident of the City and County of San Francisco, except for the licensed veterinarian, who must practice in San Francisco, but who need not be a resident of San Francisco.

The Commission shall have the powers and duties to (a) hold hearings and submit

recommendations regarding animal control and welfare to the Board of Supervisors and the City Administrator; (b) study and recommend requirements for the maintenance of animals in public, private, and commercial care; and (c) work with the Tax Collector, the Director of the Animal Care and Control Department and authorized licensing entities to develop and maintain dog licensing procedures and make recommendations on fees.

Term of Office: Three of the members who are first appointed by the Board of Supervisors shall be designated to serve for terms of one year and three for two years from the date of their appointment. Thereafter, members shall be appointed as aforesaid for a term of two years, except that all of the vacancies occurring during a term shall be filled for the unexpired term. A member shall hold office until his or her successor has been appointed and has qualified.

Reports: The Commission shall render a written report of its activities to the Board of Supervisors quarterly as stated in Section 41.3 of the San Francisco Health Code.
