

1 [Directing the Budget and Legislative Analyst to Conduct Two Audits in FY2011-2012]

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3 **Motion directing the Budget and Legislative Analyst to conduct two performance**
4 **audits to evaluate in FY2011-2012 and setting the priority as follows: 1) the**
5 **effectiveness of the City's policies to develop affordable housing and the**
6 **Planning Department's oversight of City housing development; and 2) the**
7 **governance and City oversight of the Asian Art and Fine Arts Museums, War**
8 **Memorial, and Academy of Sciences.**

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10 WHEREAS, It is the policy of the Board of Supervisors that each program of the
11 City and County of San Francisco be the subject of a performance audit at least once
12 every eight years; and

13 WHEREAS, The function of regular performance audits is to ensure that City
14 departments and agencies make prudent and efficient use of city resources and also
15 effectively perform the functions assigned to them by the charter and applicable laws;
16 and now be it

17 MOVED, That the Budget and Legislative Analyst is hereby directed as a first
18 priority to conduct a performance audit of (a) the Planning Department's oversight of
19 City housing development; (b) the effectiveness of the City's current policies in meeting
20 housing needs; (c) City funding sources and implementation of housing development
21 projects; and (d) the City's ability to implement regional housing plans, such as transit-
22 oriented housing; and now be it

23 FURTHER MOVED, That the Budget and Legislative Analyst is hereby directed
24 as a second priority to conduct a performance audit of (a) the role of the City in
25 overseeing the Asian Art and Fine Arts Museums, War Memorial and Academy of

1 Sciences; (b) the governance structure of the Asian Art and Fine Arts Museums, War
2 Memorial and Academy of Sciences, oversight of the governing boards over museum
3 operations and finances, and accountability of the governing boards to the City; and (c)
4 efficient management of General Fund-supported operations, and opportunities to
5 redefine the role of the City General Fund in supporting day-to-day operations.
