[Commemorating the ARC/AIDS Vigil]

Resolution recognizing the historic significance of the ARC/AIDS Vigil and encouraging the City and County of San Francisco to place a plaque on or near the site of the ARC/AIDS Vigil.

WHEREAS, On October 27, 1985, two HIV-positive gay men chained themselves to the doors of the old federal building located at 50 United Nations Plaza in San Francisco, to protest the United States government's inaction in the face of the deadly AIDS epidemic; and,

WHEREAS, These two brave HIV-positive gay men were soon joined by a dedicated group of volunteers who through their efforts began what is officially known as the "ARC (AIDS Related Complex)/AIDS Vigil", a decade-long demonstration that brought needed awareness about the AIDS epidemic and our federal government's failure to respond to it; and,

WHEREAS, These courageous men and women braved the elements, condemnation from passersby, and repeated efforts to remove them from 50 UN Plaza; and,

WHEREAS, Numerous San Franciscans, including elected officials such as then Supervisors Harry Britt and Nancy Walker, participated in the vigil by chaining themselves to the old federal building and even being arrested, thereby bringing more attention to the demonstration; and,

WHEREAS, participants of the vigil presented four demands to our federal government, including the need to publicly recognize AIDS, condemn AIDS-related discrimination, allow physicians to prescribe medicines and treatments to AIDS patients, and begin a "Manhattan Project" type effort to fight the AIDS epidemic; and,

WHEREAS, The ARC/AIDS Vigil was a turning point in the fight against the AIDS epidemic, helping to awaken the conscience of the City and push for action by our federal government; and,

WHEREAS, The ARC/AIDS Vigil ended in December 1995; and,

WHEREAS, It is critical that we as a City preserve our history and do not forget the significance of the demonstration; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors hereby officially recognizes the historic significance of the ARC/AIDS Vigil; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors hereby honors the contributions of all the brave men and women who participated in the ARC/AIDS Vigil; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors hereby commemorates the memory and contributions of these brave men and women and calls upon the government of the City and County of San Francisco to place a plaque on or near the site of the ARC/AIDS Vigil so that we and future generations never forget what happened during the fateful period of October 1985 through December 1995; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors calls upon the government of the City and County of San Francisco to take any other steps that would be appropriate and necessary to commemorate the ARC/AIDS Vigil.

## ARC/AIDS Vigil FIUI MORIL PPEALS

- We appeal for a "Manhattan Project" on AIDS coordinated and funded to take advantage of advances made anywhere in the world. The main goals of this project should be to find a cure for AIDS and to prevent the spread of AIDS through a National AIDS Education and Prevention program reaching every American. Funding for this project should be at least \$2 Billion in F.Y. 1989 and NOT TAKEN FROM EXISTING SOCIAL PROGRAMS.
- We appeal to the Federal Government to recognize AIDS Related Conditions [ARC] as a critical dimension of the AIDS crisis affecting vast numbers of Americans. We call for aggressive Federal action to ensure the prompt granting of Social Security Disability Income [SSDI] benefits for those eligible and in need. We call for an affordable and accessible National Health Care Plan to ensure that anyone who is sick can recieve prompt treatment.
- We appeal to the FDA to immediately allow American physicians to prescribe medicines and treatments for ARC and AIDS which are available to their colleagues in other countries.
- We appeal to President Bush and government officials at all levels to publicly condemn AIDS related discrimination against current risk groups, and to repudiate incitements of fear and hatred which exploit this tragic epidemic.
