[Accept and Expend Grant - Kindergarten to College Program Participant Incentive Funds - \$240,000]

Resolution authorizing the Office of Treasurer-Tax Collector to accept and expend a grant in the amount of \$240,000 from the Earned Assets Resource Network for Kindergarten to College Program Participant Incentive Funds.

WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco established the Kindergarten to College program in 2010 to provide college savings accounts for San Francisco Unified School District kindergarteners with an initial deposit of \$50; and

WHEREAS, participant incentives, such as matching deposits, and funds to encourage regular saving through direct deposit, are integral components of Kindergarten to College; and

WHEREAS, The Earned Assets Resource Network has granted \$240,000 to provide incentives for participants to make deposits into their Kindergarten to College accounts; and

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Foundation made generous donations to the Earned Assets Resource Network to facilitate the subject grant; and

WHEREAS, The grant does not include any provision for indirect costs; and WHEREAS, The grant does not create any new positions, and will not require an amendment to the Annual Salary Ordinance; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, The City and County of San Francisco is authorized to accept and expend a grant from the Earned Assets Resource Network in the amount of \$240,000; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby waives inclusion of indirect costs in the grant budget; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Treasurer-Tax Collector, or his designee is authorized to accept the grant on behalf of the City and County of San Francisco.

Dear Treasurer Cisneros,

We are pleased to inform you that the Earned Assets Resource Network (EARN) has authorized a grant of \$240,000 for the San Francisco Office of Financial Empowerment (OFE), housed within the Office of the Treasurer and Tax Collector. This grant will be paid in one installment upon acceptance by the Board of Supervisors.

OFE will use these funds exclusively to provide savings incentives for accounts in the Kindergarten to College (K2C) program. If the OFE would like to use these funds for any other purpose, it must obtain written approval from EARN.

The OFE agrees to provide EARN with an annual report on December 1, 2011 and December 1, 2012, detailing the use of the grant funds until the grant funds have been fully expended. Each report shall include a financial accounting as to the use and disposition of the grant funds, signed by a financial office of your organization; and accomplishments and specific outcomes for clients achieved under the grant, including success against the following goals:

- 1. **Increase likelihood of college attendance.** A child with a college savings account in any amount is seven times more likely to attend college than one without, regardless of income, race or academic achievement. K2C will increase academic aspirations for every child by making college a reality from the first day of school.
- 2. Reduce financial exclusion. Low-income and minority families are overwhelmingly excluded from mainstream financial products that build wealth. One in three San Francisco children are born into families with no savings or assets of any kind, one in two for African American and Latino children. K2C will help parents begin saving by simplifying the process for opening a college savings account and incentivizing deposits.
- 3. **Increase Financial Literacy.** K2C will be the vehicle that incorporates financial education into our school classrooms, as part of the math curriculum. With K2C, our schools can create a culture of savings, improve financial literacy, increase assets, and bring more children and families into the financial mainstream.
- 4. Leverage private investment in San Francisco families. K2C will leverage private funds for savings matches, create behavioral incentives, and help families earn money for college at significantly higher rates than they can earn by saving on their own.

We are pleased to be working with you as a partner in your efforts to advance financial empowerment work in San Francisco.
