17	Section 1. Finding	gs	
18	(a) On	, 2011, the Board of Supervisors adopted Resolution	
19	No, a	copy of which is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in	
20	File No, be	eing a Resolution declaring its intention to order the vacation of a	
21	portion of the public righ	t-of-way located on 19 <sup>th</sup> Street at its western intersection with Dolores	
22	Street adjacent to Mission	on Dolores Park (the "Vacation Area"). The location and extent of the	
23	Vacation Area is shown	on the Department of Public Works' ("DPW") SUR Map No	
24	dated	A copy of this map is on file with the Clerk of the Board of	
25	Supervisors in File No	and is incorporated herein by reference.	

1	(b) The Clerk of the Board of Supervisors did transmit to the Director of the
2	Department of Public Works a certified copy of the Resolution of Intention, and the Director of
3	the Department of Public Works did cause notice of adoption of such Resolution to be posted
4	and published in the manner required by law.
5	(c) When such matter was considered as scheduled by the Board of Supervisors at its
6	regular meeting held in the City Hall, San Francisco, on, beginning at
7	approximately P.M., the Board heard all persons interested in such vacation.
8	(d) The Vacation Area is located along the sidewalk bordering the eastern side of
9	Mission Dolores Park on an area known as the "pad", which serves as a drop off and truck
10	loading zone. Mission Dolores Park is bounded by Dolores Street on the east, Church Street
11	on the west, 18 <sup>th</sup> Street on the north, and 20 <sup>th</sup> Street on the south. A formerly vacated portion
12	of 19 <sup>th</sup> Street bisects the Park.
13	(e) The Recreation and Park Department seeks a transfer of the Vacation Area and
14	the formerly vacated portions of 19 <sup>th</sup> Street within the Park from the Department of Public
15	Works to Recreation and Park Department jurisdiction.
16	(f) The vacation of the Vacation Area will provide flexibility to the Recreation and Park
17	Department to enhance opportunities for food service as a supplement to the Park's uses.
18	(g) The City Planning Department in a letter dated, found that the
19	street vacation and other actions contemplated herein were consistent with the General Plan
20	and the eight priority policies of Planning Code Section 101.1. A copy of this letter is on file
21	with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No and is incorporated by
22	reference as though fully set forth herein. The Board of Supervisors adopts as its own said
23	consistency findings.

1	(h) On, the Planning Department determined that the Vacation v	as
2	categorically exempt under the California Environmental Quality Act. Said determination	s on
3	file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No and is incorporate	ted
4	herein by reference.	
5	(i) In DPW Order No, dated, the Director of the	
6	Department of Public Works ("DPW Director") determined: (a) the Vacation Area is	
7	unnecessary for the City's present or prospective public street, sidewalk, and service	
8	easement purposes; (b) jurisdictional transfer of the Vacation Area and formerly vacated	
9	portions of 19 <sup>th</sup> Street within Mission Dolores Park from the Department of Public Works to	the
10	Recreation and Park Department at no cost, subject to use conditions, is a policy matter for	r
11	the Board; and (c) there are no physical public or private utilities affected by the vacation	of
12	the Vacation Area. A copy of the DPW Order is on file with the Clerk of the Board of	
13	Supervisors in File No and is incorporated herein by reference.	
14	(j) The DPW Director recommends that the public interest, convenience, and nece	ssity
15	require that no easements or other rights be reserved for any public or private utilities or	
16	facilities that are in place in such Vacation Area and that any rights based upon any such	
17	public or private utilities or facilities should be extinguished.	
18	(k) Pursuant to the California Streets and Highways Code Section 892, the DPW	
19	Director also finds that the Vacation Area is currently not necessary for non-motorized	
20	transportation, though the Vacation Area, once incorporated into Mission Dolores Park, w	ould
21	be available for non-motorized transportation.	
22	(I) The Board of Supervisors adopts as its own, the recommendations of the Direct	or of
23	the Department of Public Works as set forth in DPW Order No concerning the	е
24	vacation of the Vacation Area and other actions in furtherance thereof.	

(m) The vacation of the Vacation Area is being taken pursuant to California Streets			
and Highways Code Sections 8300 et seq. and Public Works Code Section 787(a).			
(n) From all the evidence submitted at the public hearing noticed in the Resolution No.			
and the associated materials on file with the Clerk of the Board in File No.			
, the Board of Supervisors finds that the Vacation Area, as described in SUR			
Map No, is unnecessary for present or prospective public use, subject to the			
conditions described in this Ordinance.			
(o) The public interest and convenience require that the vacation be done as declared			
in this Ordinance.			
(p) On, the Recreation and Park Commission adopted			
Resolution No, a copy which is on file with the Clerk of the Board in File			
No, recommending that the Board of Supervisors approve the jurisdictional transfer			
of the Vacation Area and the Transfer Area, as described below, to the Recreation and Park			
Department. A copy of this Resolution is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in			
File No and is incorporated herein by reference.			
Section 2. The Vacation Area, as shown on SUR Map No, is hereby			
ordered vacated and pursuant to California Streets and Highways Code Sections 8300 et seq.			
and Public Works Code Section 787(a).			
Section 3. Transfer of Formerly Vacated Portions of 19th Street bisecting Mission			
Dolores Park and the Vacation Area. (a) On, the Board of Supervisors			
adopted Resolution No, a copy of which is on file with the Clerk of the Board			
of Supervisors in File No, being a Resolution declaring the vacation of a portion

3	(b) The Board of Supervisors hereby determines that the Vacation Area and Transfer		
4	Area can be used most advantageously by the Recreation and Park Department, and		
5	therefore, approves the transfer of jurisdiction of the Vacation Area and Transfer Area from		
6	DPW to the Recreation and Park Department at no cost.		
7	Section 4. All actions heretofore taken by the officers of the City with respect to this		
8	Ordinance are hereby approved, confirmed and ratified, and the Mayor, Clerk of the Board,		
9	Director of the Division of Real Estate, County Surveyor, and DPW Director are hereby		
10	authorized and directed to take any and all actions which they or the City Attorney may deem		
11	necessary or advisable in order to effectuate the purpose and intent of this Ordinance		
12	(including, without limitation, the finalization of the jurisdictional transfers for the Vacation Area		
13	and the Transfer Area, the filing of the Ordinance in the Official Records of the City and		
14	County of San Francisco; and confirmation of satisfaction of any of the conditions to the		
15	effectiveness of the vacation of the Vacation Area hereunder and execution and delivery of		
16	any evidence of the same, which shall be conclusive as to the satisfaction of such conditions		
17	upon signature by any such City official or his or her designee).
