14	Section 1. Finding	s	
15	(a) On	, 2011, the Board o	of Supervisors adopted Resolution
16	No, a co	ppy of which is on file with the Cler	k of the Board of Supervisors in
17	File No, bei	ng a Resolution declaring its intent	ion to order the vacation of a
18	portion of the public right-	of-way located on 19 <sup>th</sup> Street in Mi	ssion Dolores Park and at its
19	western intersection with	Dolores Street adjacent to Mission	Dolores Park (Vacation Area).
20	The location and extent of	f the Vacation Area is shown on th	e Department of Public Works'
21	(DPW) SUR Map No	, dated	A copy of this map is on file
22	with the Clerk of the Boar	d of Supervisors in File No	and is
23	incorporated herein by ref	erence.	
24	(b) The Clerk of th	e Board of Supervisors did transm	it to the Director of the
25	Department of Public Wor	ks a certified copy of the Resolution	on of Intention, and the Director of

1	the Department of Public Works did cause notice of adoption of such Resolution to be posted	
2	and published in the manner required by law.	
3	(c) When such matter was considered as scheduled by the Board of Supervisors at its	
4	regular meeting held in the City Hall, San Francisco, on, beginning at	
5	approximately P.M., the Board heard all persons interested in such vacation.	
6	(d) The Vacation Area comprises: (1) a portion of 19 <sup>th</sup> Street that bisects Mission	
7	Dolores Park and (2) a portion of 19 <sup>th</sup> Street that is located along the sidewalk bordering the	
8	eastern side of Mission Dolores Park on an area known as the "pad," which serves as a drop	
9	off and truck loading zone. Mission Dolores Park is bounded by Dolores Street on the east,	
10	Church Street on the west, 18 <sup>th</sup> Street on the north, and 20 <sup>th</sup> Street on the south. A formerly	
11	vacated portion of 19 <sup>th</sup> Street bisects the Park.	
12	(e) The Recreation and Park Department seeks a transfer of the Vacation Area from	
13	the Department of Public Works to Recreation and Park Department jurisdiction.	
14	(f) The vacation of the Vacation Area will provide flexibility to the Recreation and Park	
15	Department to enhance opportunities for food service as a supplement to the Park's uses.	
16	(g) The City Planning Department in a letter dated, found that the	
17	street vacation and other actions contemplated herein were consistent with the General Plan	
18	and the eight priority policies of Planning Code Section 101.1. A copy of this letter is on file	
19	with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No and is incorporated by	
20	reference as though fully set forth herein. The Board of Supervisors adopts as its own said	
21	consistency findings.	
22	(h) On, the Planning Department determined that the Vacation was	
23	categorically exempt under the California Environmental Quality Act. Said determination is or	
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1	file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No and is incorporated		
2	herein by reference.		
3	(i) In DPW Order No, dated, the Director of the		
4	Department of Public Works ("DPW Director") determined: (a) the Vacation Area is		
5	unnecessary for the City's present or prospective public street, sidewalk, and service		
6	easement purposes; (b) jurisdictional transfer of the Vacation Area from the Department of		
7	Public Works to the Recreation and Park Department at no cost, subject to use conditions, is		
8	a policy matter for the Board; and (c) there are no physical public or private utilities affected by		
9	the vacation of the Vacation Area. A copy of the DPW Order is on file with the Clerk of the		
10	Board of Supervisors in File No and is incorporated herein by reference.		
11	(j) The DPW Director recommends that the public interest, convenience, and necessity		
12	require that no easements or other rights be reserved for any public or private utilities or		
13	facilities that are in place in such Vacation Area and that any rights based upon any such		
14	public or private utilities or facilities should be extinguished.		
15	(k) Pursuant to the California Streets and Highways Code Section 892, the DPW		
16	Director also finds that the Vacation Area is currently not necessary for non-motorized		
17	transportation, though the former sidewalk portion of the Vacation Area, once incorporated		
18	into Mission Dolores Park, would be available for non-motorized transportation.		
19	(I) The Board of Supervisors adopts as its own, the recommendations of the Director of		
20	the Department of Public Works as set forth in DPW Order No concerning the		
21	vacation of the Vacation Area and other actions in furtherance thereof.		
22	(m) The vacation of the Vacation Area is being taken pursuant to California Streets		
23	and Highways Code Sections 8300 et seq. and Public Works Code Section 787(a).		
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1	(n) From all the evidence submitted at the public hearing noticed in the Resolution No		
2	and the associated materials on file with the Clerk of the Board in File No.		
3	, the Board of Supervisors finds that the Vacation Area, as desc	ribed in SUR	
4	Map No, is unnecessary for present or prospective public use, sub	ject to the	
5	conditions described in this Ordinance.		
6	(o) The public interest and convenience require that the vacation be done	e as declared	
7	in this Ordinance.		
8	(p) On, the Recreation and Park Commission	adopted	
9	Resolution No, a copy which is on file with the Clerk of the E	Board in File	
10	No, recommending that the Board of Supervisors approve the jurisdic	tional transfe	
11	of the Vacation Area to the Recreation and Park Department. A copy of this Re-	solution is on	
12	file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No and is	incorporated	
13	herein by reference.		
14	Section 2. The Vacation Area, as shown on SUR Map No,	is hereby	
15	ordered vacated and pursuant to California Streets and Highways Code Section	s 8300 et seq	
16	and Public Works Code Section 787(a).		
17	Section 3. Interdepartmental transfer of the Vacation Area. Notwithstand	ling the	
18	procedures set forth in Administrative Code Chapter 23, the Board of Superviso	rs hereby	
19	determines that the Vacation Area can be used most advantageously by the Re	creation and	
20	Park Department, and therefore, approves the transfer of jurisdiction of the Vaca	ation Area	
21	from DPW to the Recreation and Park Department at no cost.		
22	Section 4. All actions heretofore taken by the officers of the City with res	pect to this	
23	Ordinance are hereby approved, confirmed and ratified, and the Mayor, Clerk of	the Board,	
24	Director of the Division of Real Estate, County Surveyor, and DPW Director are	hereby	

1	authorized and directed to take any and all actions which they or the City Attorney may deem
2	necessary or advisable in order to effectuate the purpose and intent of this Ordinance
3	(including, without limitation, the finalization of the jurisdictional transfers for the Vacation
4	Area, the filing of the Ordinance in the Official Records of the City and County of San
5	Francisco; and confirmation of satisfaction of any of the conditions to the effectiveness of the
6	vacation of the Vacation Area hereunder and execution and delivery of any evidence of the
7	same, which shall be conclusive as to the satisfaction of such conditions upon signature by
8	any such City official or his or her designee).
9	Section 5. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days from the
10	date of passage.
