Dolores Street Community Services

In 1982, San Francisco Mayor Dianne Feinstein asked San Francisco churches to open their doors to refugees fleeing war and famine in Central America. <u>Dolores Street Baptist Church</u>, at that time located on the corner of 15th and Dolores Streets, was the first to answer the call and founded a "church basement" operation providing basic services of shelter and housing (the Dolores Housing Program). Over the next 10 years, this program continued to serve as the primary provider of shelter to San Francisco's Latino homeless working poor. In 1993, when the church was destroyed in a fire, both the church and the shelter were moved to new facilities, but continued to provide shelter and services to the Latino community of the Mission District.

Beginning in the early 1990's, church members began to explore how they could also help address the needs of the other community it bordered — San Francisco's Castro District. At that time, one of the primary issues affecting Castro residents was the crisis of HIV and AIDS, and church members identified housing as one of the primary needs of those who had become infected. The Cohen Residence has transformed from its first incarnation as a hospice, and is now a widely recognized residential care facility for people living with disabling HIV or AIDS. As the decade ended, the programs separated from their founding church, becoming a fully independent non-sectarian non-profit organization.

Richard M. Cohen Residence

In 1995, with the support of the San Francisco Redevelopment Agency, Dolores Street Community Services renovated an old Victorian cottage on Dolores Street and opened the doors to Hope House, a place for homeless men and women living with AIDS to spend their last days in dignity and peace. Hope House was later renamed the Richard M. Cohen Residence in honor of a local realtor and community member who died of AIDS, and whose estate provided a significant portion of the funds for the renovation.

The mission of the Richard M. Cohen Residence is to improve and maintain the health and wellbeing of our residents. Our state-licensed Residential Care Facility (RCF-CI) provides 24 hour attendant care and supportive services for 10 formerly homeless, very low income persons living with disabling HIV or AIDS, who may also be affected by other physical disabilities, mental illness and/or substance use histories. We approach our work from a strengths-based, harm reduction model that puts each resident at the center of defining and carrying out their own care plans and goals.

Services include 24-hour staffing, meals, medication assistance, nurse and attendant care supports, case management, referrals to mental health and substance abuse services, and community building activities.

The Residence itself is a restored landmark cottage, originally built in the 1850s. Residents have their own bedrooms and share a sunny kitchen and dining room, as well as a living room, two kitchenettes, five bathrooms, laundry room, a deck and patio, and extensive outdoor gardens.

Description of Services Provided:

* R.N. Case Management (coordinating care, acting as liaison between residents & health providers, providing support and health-related education to residents, scheduling appointments, ordering medication & filling medi-sets weekly)

* Social Work Case Management (coordinating care, providing mental health support, providing & bringing in alternative therapies such as meditation & massage, assistance with

benefits, transportation, and referrals to other services as needed)

* Attendant Care (support with Activities of Daily Living provided by Certified Nursing Assistants who are on duty 24/7-including administering medications, providing reminders for mealtimes, providing reminders and paperwork needed for appointments, scheduling transportation for appointments, light housekeeping duties, monitoring visitors)

* Food Services (planning and provision of 3 healthy meals per day for residents, as well as

snacks that are available at all times)

* Activities (both in-house and out-of-house activities including Bingo, movie nights, birthday and holiday celebrations, concerts, cultural performances, baseball games, meals at restaurants, etc).

RCF-CI: Residential Care Facility for the Chronically Ill

An RCF-CI is a state-licensed facility that is monitored by the California Department of Social Services, Community Care Licensing Division. The facility is bound by Title 22 (Division 6, Chapter 8.5) of the California Code of Regulations, which outlines the conditions under which we must operate.

There are RCF-CIs throughout the State of California, and in San Francisco there are a total of 5 facilities: Cohen, Maitri, Leland House and Peter Claver Community (which are operated by Catholic Charities), and Larkin Street Youth Services.

Brent O. Saupe

Brent is a coordinator for Collective Care Gardening Club, teaching others to grow their own medicine, introducing patients to gardeners, and helping to facilitate compliant, sustainable collective gardens as well as being part of a local collective garden operating in SOMA SF.

Born and raised in Southern California, Brent Saupe has been involved with marijuana throughout his life. Experiencing his first law enforcement encounter concerning indoor gardening at the age of twelve. Twelve years later he was busted again. Right here in San Francisco, and yes it was for cannabis. He has visited 18 countries and 48 states and boasts of sampling locally produced cannabis in each. A United States Marine Corps veteran, Brent is convinced cannabis can unify people and create peace around the world like nothing else, and advocates its appropriate use wherever he goes.

Finding no better place on earth than San Francisco, Brent has been living here since 1992.

After four years of Bible school and inner city church development work (mission district and the T.L.) and working in the residential drug rehabilitation arena, Brent created a cult survivor website and support network for people leaving abusive groups. During the next four years, in addition to facilitating the support group network, Brent was a board member of Glad Tidings Church in the Fillmore district of San Francisco and still calls G.T. his home church. Brents current mission is working with "Hell? No! Ministries" focusing on confronting misinformation concerning medical cannabis.

Being an advocate for patients rights, Brent became involved in Americans For Safe Access in 2002. He has traveled around the state giving ASA legal trainings, and has worked as a peer councilor in dispensaries around the Bay Area answering patients legal questions concerning medical cannabis.

A dedicated group of local volunteer activists created the local chapter of ASA SF and Brent became one of them. Facilitating meetings, coordinating volunteers, creating fund raising opportunities, emergency response planning, rallying patients for dispensary/court support, whatever ASA SF needs, Brent has worked with local patients to get it done.

Working tirelessly during the formulation of our initial San Francisco MCD ordinances, encouraging patients, providing public input, and offering innovative solutions, Brents focus has always been on creating reasonable garden guidelines that are easy for patients and law enforcement to understand.

Before becoming a patient, Brent supported his family as a general contractor. With this experience Brent found a niche in the San Francisco medical cannabis community helping patients set up safe and legally compliant gardens. In addition to giving advice to others, Brent has experienced six medical cannabis garden "inspections" personally over the last ten years. Brent has shown his continued commitment to intentional compliance by being "caught" following the rules each time.

Currently working on the cultivation subcommittee under the medical cannabis task force, Brent is applying for seat #10 on the medical cannabis task force that was recently vacated by Albert Blais. Brent is recommended for this seat by Albert as well as by unanimous vote of the cultivation subcommittee. Among others who support Brent for this seat are Shona Gochenhaur, president of Axis of Love, as well as David Goldman, current president of Americans for Safe Access San Francisco.

The Task Force shall consist of 15 members, appointed by the Board of Supervisors as follows:

- Seat 1: A community organizer representative with a background in organizing neighbors, businesses or organizations around social justice and quality of life issues. This representative should also have a background working on medical cannabis related issues.
- Seat 2: A representative of a local patient advocacy organization with a background in working to protect the interests of medical cannabis patients.
- Seat 3: A representative of a local patient advocacy organization with a background in working to protect the interests of medical cannabis patients.
- Seat 4: A representative of a hospice or a residential care facility with a background as an employee or volunteer in direct services working with medical cannabis patients or as a nurse or physician with a background in working with or treating of medical cannabis patients.
- Seat 5: A person with a background in the management of a medical cannabis dispensary.
- Seat 6: A person with a background in the management of a medical cannabis dispensary.
- Seat 7: A person with a background in the management of a medical cannabis dispensary whose primary mode of operation is delivery.
- Seat 8: A representative of a drug policy organization working specifically on medical cannabis issues.
- Seat 9: A licensed California attorney with a background working with San Francisco medical cannabis dispensaries and experience with the City's medical cannabis dispensary permitting and regulatory process.
- Seat 10: A person with a background in providing medical cannabis to low-income patients.

San Francisco BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

- Seat 11: A person with a background in providing medical cannabis to permitted medical cannabis dispensaries located in the City and County.
- Seat 12: A person with at least fifteen years of experience working on medical cannabis issues in the City and County.
- Seat 13: A person with at least fifteen years of experience working on medical cannabis issues. A representative of a recognized neighborhood organization that has a medical cannabis dispensary within its boundaries.
- Seat 14: A person with a background in providing medical cannabis to permitted medical cannabis dispensaries located in City and County.
- Seat 15: A licensed or accredited health care practitioner practicing in the City and County with a background in medical cannabis and familiarity with the laws and regulation governing medical cannabis.

The Task Force shall have the power and duty to:

- (1) Hold hearings and take testimony regarding medical cannabis issues and related matters.
- (2) Create subcommittees as necessary.
- (3) Review local medical cannabis related laws, and make recommendations for changes.
- (4) Develop and make recommendations for a mediation process to be used by operators of medical dispensaries, patients and neighbors of dispensaries to address community concerns and resolve conflicts and disputes.
- (5) Develop and make recommendations regarding medical cannabis cultivation, production and baking guidelines for medical cannabis dispensaries.
- (6) Develop and make recommendations regarding cultivation and distribution of medical cannabis by individual patients, caregivers or small collectives that may fall outside the definition of a medical cannabis dispensary under the City's Health Code.
- (7) Develop and make recommendations regarding the cultivation of medical cannabis, particularly in residential dwellings, that may violate the City's Planning Code or applicable San Francisco or California Building Code requirements.
- (8) Develop and make recommendations regarding the taxation of medical cannabis lawfully dispensed or cultivated in the City and County.
- (9) Develop and make recommendations regarding the local regulation of medical cannabis in the event that State Proposition 19 is approved by the voters in the election held on November 2, 2010.

Report: During each year of its operation the Task Force shall submit to the Board of Supervisors an annual report summarizing its recommendations.
