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[Supporting Goals for Federal Funding - Community Development Block Grant and Emergency Solutions Grant Programs]

Resolution supporting FY2012-2013 Community Development Block Grant and Emergency Solutions Grant Consolidated Plan Goals.

WHEREAS, Under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 as amended, the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act as amended by the Homeless Emergency Assistance and Rapid Transition to Housing (HEARTH) Act of 2009 and related federal regulations, the City and County of San Francisco is eligible to apply for and receive Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) and Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) funding from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD); and,

WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco anticipates receiving approximately \$15,000,000 in CDBG and \$1,300,000 in ESG Funds from HUD in FY 2012-2013; and,

WHEREAS, On behalf of the City and County of San Francisco, the Mayor's Office of Housing (MOH) and the Office of Economic and Workforce Development (OEWD) are preparing to release Requests for Proposals (RFP) for the 2012-2013 CDBG and ESG Programs; and,

WHEREAS, The RFPs are in concert with San Francisco's 2010-2014 Consolidated Plan; and,

WHEREAS, The Consolidated Plan was approved by HUD in 2010; and,
WHEREAS, The Consolidated Plan details the five goals for the CDBG and ESG
Programs: 1) Families and individuals are healthy and economically self-sufficient; 2)
Neighborhoods and communities are strong, vibrant and stable; 3) Formerly homeless

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individuals and families are stable, supported and live in long-term housing; 4) Families and individuals have safe, healthy and affordable housing; and 5) Public housing developments that were severely distressed are thriving mixed-income communities; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors continues to support the CDBG and ESG Consolidated Plan goals, and the related 2012-2013 Requests for Proposals to achieve these goals.
