[Accept and Expend Gift – Recycling/Trash Containers for Golden Gate Park – \$30,000]

Resolution authorizing the San Francisco Recreation and Park Department to retroactively accept and expend a gift in-place from the San Francisco Parks Trust of 15 state-of-the-art recycling/trash containers for Golden Gate Park, valued at \$30,000.

WHEREAS, Since 1971 the San Francisco Parks Trust, a non-profit organization, has been a partner of, fiscal sponsor to and philanthropic benefactor of the Recreation and Park Department, supporting San Francisco's parks, open spaces, and recreation facilities; and WHEREAS, Golden Gate Park welcomes over 13 million visitors each year; and,

WHEREAS, Recycling receptacles have historically not been available in Golden Gate Park, unnecessarily adding recyclable materials to the landfill; and,

WHEREAS, San Francisco Parks Trust contributed 15 recycling/trash containers to be placed at popular gathering places, such as the Conservatory of Flowers, Doughboy Meadow, Stow Lake, and Big Rec Ball Field; and,

WHEREAS, The Recreation and Park Commission recommends that the San Francisco Board of Supervisors retroactively accept and expend the gift in-place, valued at \$30,000; and,

WHEREAS, The City recognizes the generosity of the San Francisco Parks Trust with sincere appreciation; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors approves the Gift and authorizes the Recreation and Park Department General Manager to retroactively accept and expend the Gift in-place, valued at \$30,000, from the San Francisco Park Trust to support the purchase and placement of 15 state-of-the-art recycling/trash containers for Golden Gate Park.
