Resolution authorizing the San Francisco Recreation and Park Department to retroactively accept and expend a grant in-place, valued at \$25,000, from the United States Soccer Foundation to support the purchase of new lighting fixtures for Mission Playground Soccer Field.

[Accept and Expend Grant - Lighting at Mission Playground Soccer Field - \$25,000]

WHEREAS, Mission Playground is an archetypical urban park, with a bustling recreation center, hard-top, playground, and pool tucked into a vibrant commercial and residential block; and

WHEREAS, Mission Playground's asphalt hard-top draws soccer players of all ages and backgrounds from the surrounding neighborhood for competitive and casual pick-up games; and

WHEREAS, The renovation of Mission Playground is part of a larger initiative undertaken by the San Francisco Recreation and Park Department (RPD) and the City Fields Foundation (CFF), an organization dedicated to addressing the chronic shortage of playfields in San Francisco; and

WHEREAS, In 2006, RPD and CFF teamed up for the Playfields Initiative, a public/private partnership established to remedy the deficit of youth athletic fields in San Francisco; and

WHEREAS, Since 2006, the partnership has renovated six athletic fields, including Garfield Park and Silver Terrace (2006), Franklin Square (2007), South Sunset and Crocker Amazon (2008), and Kimbell Playground (2010), by installing high-quality synthetic turf, lights, new fencing, and other park amenities; and

WHEREAS, Mission Playground Soccer Field is the next playfield to undergo renovation; and

WHEREAS, The United States Soccer Foundation will provide lighting around the parameter of the field, allowing RPD to extend playtime into the evening; and

WHEREAS, The lighting provided by this grant will allow RPD to dedicate more open play hours at Mission Playground, meeting the needs of the neighborhood as well as relieving some of the intense demand for open play from nearby grass fields; and

WHEREAS, The Recreation and Park Commission recommends that the San Francisco Board of Supervisors retroactively accept and expend the grant in-place, valued at \$25,000; and

WHEREAS, The City recognizes the generosity of the United States Soccer Foundation with sincere appreciation; and

WHEREAS, The Department proposes to maximize use of available grant funds on project expenditures by not including indirect costs in the grant budget; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby waives inclusion of indirect costs in the grant budget; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors approves the Grant and authorizes the Recreation and Park Department General Manager to retroactively accept and expend the grant in-place, valued at \$25,000, from the United States Soccer Foundation to support the purchase of new lighting fixtures for Mission Playground Soccer Field.
