

[Declaration of the November 8, 2011, Election Results]

Resolution declaring the results of the November 8, 2011, Consolidated General Election.

WHEREAS, A Consolidated General Election was conducted in the City and County of San Francisco on Tuesday, November 8, 2011, which placed before the electorate candidates for election to City and County offices and City and County ballot measures; and
