Leonard Watkins, seat 4 (residency requirement waived), succeeding Mary Schroeder, resigned, must be a representative of a hospice or a residential care facility with a background as an employee or volunteer in direct services working with medical cannabis patients or as a nurse or physician with a background in working with or treating of medical cannabis patients, for a term ending December 31, 2012.

Martin Olive, seat 6, succeeding Martin Olive, term expired, must be a person with a background in the management of a medical cannabis dispensary, for a term ending December 31, 2012.

Sarah Shrader, seat 8, succeeding Sarah Shrader, term expired, must be a representative of a drug policy organization working specifically on medical cannabis issues, for a term ending December 31, 2012.

- 1. The membership of the Medical Cannabis Task Force has a goal to be representative of the diversity of the City and County of San Francisco.
- Applicant Leonard Watkins, a new appointee, who is not a resident of San
