Resolution determining that the issuance of a Type 40 on-sale beer license to Mark E. Rennie for Bar Downtown, LLC., dba Craft, located at 440 Mission Street (District 6), will serve the public convenience and necessity of the people of the City and County of San Francisco, in accordance with Section 23958.4 of the California Business and Professions Code, with conditions

WHEREAS, Mark E. Renne is seeking issuance of a Type 40 on-sale beer license for Bar Downtown, LLC., dba Craft, located at 440 Mission Street; and,

 WHEREAS, The Planning Department has verified that the area is properly zoned; and,

WHEREAS, The Police Department recommends that the liquor license application be approved with conditions; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That in accordance with Section 23958.4 of the California Business and Professions Code, the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco hereby determines for the foregoing reasons that the issuance of a Type 40 on-sale beer license to Mark E. Renne for Bar Downtown, LLC., dba Craft, located at 440 Mission Street, will serve the public convenience and necessity of the people of the City and County of San Francisco.

Conditions: (1) Sales, service and consumption of alcoholic beverages shall be from 11:00 a.m. and 2:00 a.m. daily, and from 6:00 a.m. to 2:00 a.m. when the premises is broadcasting (real time) the World Cup soccer and the Olympics. This privilege shall be subject to advance written notice to the Department at least one (1) week prior to the event. (2) No noise shall be audible beyond the area under the control of the licensee

as defined on the ABC-257. (3) No person under the age of twenty-one (21) shall sell, furnish, or deliver alcoholic beverages. (4) Loitering (loitering is defined as "to stand idly about; linger aimlessly without lawful business") is prohibited on any sidewalks or property adjacent to the licensed premises under the control of the licensee as depicted on the ABC-257. (5) The petitioner(s) shall be responsible for maintaining free of litter the area adjacent to the premises over which they have control. (6) Graffiti shall be removed from the premises and all parking lots under the control of the licensee within 72 hours of application. If the graffiti occurs on a Friday or weekend day, or on a holiday, the licensee shall remove the graffiti within 72 hours following the beginning of the next weekday. (7) The exterior of the premises shall be equipped with lighting of sufficient power to illuminate and make easily discernible the appearance and conduct of all persons on or about the premises. Additionally, the position of such lighting shall not disturb the normal privacy and use of any neighboring residences. (8) There shall be no off sale of alcoholic beverages in containers of less than 32 ounces. (9) All off sale alcoholic beverages shall be restricted to craft beers.

ABC Type 40 License—On-Sale Beer
Original License Application.

Dear Ms. Cavillo:

This office represents Bar Downtown, LLC. dba Craft My clients have applied to the California Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC) for an original Type-40 On-Sale Beer License. This type of ABC license authorizes the sale of beer [only] for consumption on or off the premises at 440 Mission Street, while providing sandwiches or snacks to its patrons. No wine or spirits will be sold at this location.

Craft beer is defined as one that comes from a small independent brewer using traditional ingredients. The craft beer movement is very strong in other cities in the western region of the USA (especially San Diego and Portland), but relatively new to the San Francisco scene. My clients will provide a large selection of hard to find craft beers and will have many of those beers available on draft. We hope to make Craft the new primary beer locale in downtown San Francisco. We believe that local beer aficionados are hungry for more venues and options in which they can find and enjoy obscure and largely unavailable brands. Besides beer, Craft will also serve quality non-alcoholic beverages such as gourmet root beer on tap, fresh juices, and coffee drinks.

Craft will be located at 440 Mission Street in a classic 1930s building located on the northeast corner of First and Mission Streets, directly across the street from the construction site of the new Transbay Transit Center. The South Financial District area around Craft is transforming dramatically as the San Francisco Planning Department's neighborhood plan takes shape. A number of urban residential high-rise buildings such as

Millennium Tower (420 units) and The Infiniti Towers (650 units), have recently opened in the neighborhood, as well as an award-winning residential redevelopment project at One Ecker (56 modern loft-style units in a historic icehouse building). Once completed, the Transbay Transit Center will become the preeminent public transportation hub of San Francisco (and Northern California). City Park, a 5.5 acre crown jewel park will sit atop the Transit Center.

Despite all the new construction, this neighborhood still lacks the casual and easily accessible community hubs that are needed to foster a dynamic urban neighborhood. Local restaurants and eateries are primarily focused on lunch time business and the night time eateries nearby are either unhealthy fast food joints or expensive fine-dining restaurants. There is little in the area that offers well-prepared food in an informal setting that are open beyond the typical business lunch hours.

The goal of this project is to fill that need for a friendly community gathering spot where one can find a world class pint of beer, an after work or late-night bite to eat, a welcoming place to gather to watch the big game, or enjoy a cup of coffee. Local employees need such venues for after-lunch breaks, informal meetings and post-work gatherings or for light meals. Residents need nearby options within walking distance for light meals not found on a restaurant menu, or after other restaurants' kitchens have closed. Nearby residents would also enjoy a late-night social scene that is not a club-type of environment. Public transportation users and park goers will need a convenient respite where they can enjoy the neighborhood - its residents, students, and workers. The Craft project will offer just this: a convenient yet relaxed and comfortable neighborhood gathering spot in this underserved neighborhood.

The Craft project will be owned and managed by The Bar Downtown, LLC, who also own a cocktail bar in the same neighborhood called 83 Proof. Like 83 Proof, the owners will position Craft to eschew the party-going public and weekend club-style vibe in favor of the neighborhood's professional residents and working class. They hope to create a scene based on new and quality taste-based experience. Professionalism, personal service, and attention to clientele's desire for quality and selection have been the cornerstone of this ownership group's success.

The approval by the Board of Supervisors of this original on-sale beer ABC License would not have any detrimental effect on the surrounding neighborhood or the city of San Francisco. The clientele of this operation fit well into the existing neighborhood and have posed no public safety problems. This new business will also provide additional job opportunities to the community.

In summary, Craft will be a great asset to the local neighborhood and the greater San Francisco Community. It will upgrade a historically significant building, and will bring

increased business to other small businesses in the area. It will serve unique beers, other beverages and great food in an informal setting. It will further serve as a community meeting spot for the local community. It is my client's intention to further support the local community with food drives, Christmas dinners and benefits for local charities and organizations. Clearly, allowing this new ABC license to issue to our location at 440 Mission Street, San Francisco will serve the public convenience and necessity of the people of the City and County of San Francisco.

For the reasons outlined above, applicant Bar Downtown, LLC dba Craft respectfully requests that this letter be forwarded to the City Operations & Neighborhood Services Committee of the Board and that this Committee and the full Board of Supervisors make a determination under California Business and Professions Code § 23958.4 that the public need or convenience would be served by the issuance of an original On Sale Beer liquor license to Bar Downtown, LLC dba Craft at 440 Mission Street, San Francisco.
