Resolution urging Governor Jerry Brown and Attorney General Kamala Harris to join the Governors of Illinois, Massachusetts, and New York in suspending or terminating agreements with Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) on the Police/ICE collaboration program known as "Secure Communities" and to support Assembly Bill 1081, the TRUST Act - state legislation that would permit localities to opt out of the program.

WHEREAS, U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) has developed a new collaboration program between local police and Immigration and Custom Enforcement (ICE), known as "Secure Communities," requiring sharing fingerprints at booking by local or state law enforcement of citizen or non-citizen with the Department of Homeland Security/ICE; and, since implementation of S-COMM, about 70% of the individuals deported as a result of the program have no criminal record, or have been found to have committed low level crimes -- some of those including survivors of domestic violence who called the police for help; and

WHEREAS, The program has torn apart communities across the nation and has

eroded immigrant communities' trust of police, leading the Governors of Illinois, New York,

and Massachusetts, to each formally request to terminate, suspend, or refuse to sign an

agreement with ICE on S-COMM; and, law enforcement officials, including San Francisco

Sheriff Michael Hennessey, Yolo County Sheriff Edward Prieto, and retired Sacramento Chief

Arturo Venegas, have all expressed strong concerns regarding damage caused by S-Comm

1	WHEREAS, Crime victims, including domestic violence survivors, such as Norma in
2	San Francisco whose story was in the Los Angeles Times; ii have been swept into deportation
3	proceedings by S-Comm after calling the police for help, the U.S. Congressional Hispanic
4	Caucus, the U.S. Congressional Progressive Caucus, and the Los Angeles Congressional
5	Delegation all have urged President Obama to suspend the S-Comm Program nationally
6	because of concerns regarding racial profiling and harm caused crime victims; therefore, be
7	it;
8	RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors urges Governor Brown and
9	Attorney General Harris to support passage of AB 1081, the TRUST Act, which is pending
10	state legislation that would permit localities to opt out of the program, and to join the
11	Governors of Illinois, Massachusetts, and New York in terminating or suspending S-COMM in
12	California; and be it,
13	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors urges President
14	Obama, Secretary Janet Napolitano, Senators Dianne Feinstein, Barbara Boxer, and Speaker
15	of the House of Representatives, Nancy Pelosi, to take steps to pass just, fair, and
16	comprehensive immigration reform, rather than strengthen deeply flawed police/ICE
