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12	Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:
13	Section 1. Findings. The Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco
14	hereby finds and declares as follows:
15	(a) May is Small Business Month and this Board desires to recognize the importance
16	of small businesses in San Francisco. As part of this recognition, the Board elects to waive
17	various permit fees for the month of May for awning replacement and installation of pedestriar
18	level lighting as these fees have acted as a bar from many small businesses to improve their
19	building facades and store fronts.
20	(b) On, 2012, the Planning Commission adopted Resolution No.
21	recommending adoption of this Ordinance, and adopted findings that the
22	legislation is consistent, on balance, with the City's General Plan and eight priority policies of
23	Planning Code Section 101.1(b). The Board adopts these findings as it own. A copy of this
24	Commission Resolution is on file with the Clerk of the Board in File No, and is
25	incorporated by reference herein.
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1	(c) Pursuant to Planning Code Section 302, this Board finds that this Ordinance will
2	promote the public necessity, convenience, safety and welfare for the reasons set forth in
3	Commission Resolution No, which is incorporated herein by reference.
4	(d) The Planning Department has determined that the actions contemplated in this
5	ordinance comply with the California Environmental Quality Act (California Public Resources
6	Code Section 21000 et seq.). Said determination is on file with the Clerk of the Board of
7	Supervisors in File No and is incorporated herein by reference.
8	(e) On, 2012, the Building Inspection Commission conducted a public
9	hearing on this legislation.
10	Section 2. This Section is uncodified.
11	(a) Notwithstanding any provision of the Planning Code, including the fee schedule
12	associated with Sections 355(a) and 355(e), the permit fee for awning replacement and for
13	signs, respectively, are hereby waived for any permit issued for such activities during the
14	month of May 2012.
15	(b) Notwithstanding any provision of the Building Code, including the fee schedules of
16	Tables 1A-A and 1A-E, the permit fees related to reviewing the structural integrity of awning
17	replacements for those permits submitted "over the counter" at the Central Permit Bureau and
18	installation of pedestrian level lighting, respectively, are hereby waived for any permit issued
19	for such activities during the month of May 2012.
20	Section 3. The fee waivers set forth in this Ordinance shall apply only to small
21	business enterprises. The Board of Supervisors hereby delegates to the Department of
22	Building Inspection and the Planning Department the establishment of a process by which the
23	respective departments will certify that an applicant is a small business enterprise.
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1	Section 4. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days from the
2	date of passage; provided, however, that the provisions of this Ordinance shall be retroactive
3	to May 1, 2012 should the effective date of the Ordinance occur after said date.
4	Section 4. This section is uncodified. In enacting this Ordinance, the Board intends to
5	amend only those words, phrases, paragraphs, subsections, sections, articles, numbers,
6	punctuation, charts, diagrams, or any other constituent part of the Planning Code that are
7	explicitly shown in this legislation as additions, deletions, Board amendment additions, and
8	Board amendment deletions in accordance with the "Note" that appears under the official title
9	of the legislation.
