1	[Local Support for Cesar Chavez Streetscape Project]
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4	Resolution re-directing a \$3,367,985 Congestion Management Agency Block Grant from
5	the Second Street Streetscape project to the Cesar Chavez Streetscape project;
6	affirming local support of the project; reiterating commitment of the necessary non-
7	federal match of \$436,358; and stating assurance to complete the project.
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9	WHEREAS, The Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC) is the designated
10	recipient for federal Surface Transportation Program (STP) and/or Congestion Mitigation and
11	Air Quality Improvement (CMAQ) funds for the San Francisco Bay Area; and
12	WHEREAS, MTC Resolution No. 3925 established a Congestion Management Agency
13	(CMA) Block Grant program for certain categories of STP and CMAQ funds for FY 2010-11
14	and FY 2011-12; and
15	WHEREAS, The San Francisco County Transportation Agency (SFCTA), which is the
16	CMA for San Francisco County, solicited applications for \$11,700,000 in federal funds under
17	the CMA Block Grant program in FY 2010-11; and
18	WHEREAS, The Department of Public Works (DPW) applied to the SFCTA and
19	received approval for four projects to receive \$11,553,000 in federal funds under the CMA
20	Block Grant program including \$4,846,000 for Second Street Streetscape Improvements
21	Project; and
22	WHEREAS, DPW has subsequently sought and obtained SFCTA Board approval to
23	shift \$3,367,985 of the CMA Block Grant funds from Second Street Streetscape
24	Improvements Project to the Cesar Chavez Streetscape Improvement Project; and
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4	WILLEDEAS the project requires on 11 (7% less) metch for which DDW has already
1	WHEREAS, the project requires an 11.47% local match, for which DPW has already
2	allocated \$436,358 in state local streets and roads gas tax funds; and
3	WHEREAS, as part of the process to shift the use of STP/CMAQ funding, MTC
4	requires a resolution adopted by the responsible implementing agency stating the following:
5	1. the commitment of necessary local matching funds; and
6	2. that the sponsor understands that the STP/CMAQ funding is fixed at the
7	programmed amount, and therefore any cost increase cannot be expected to be
8	funded with additional STP/CMAQ funds; and
9	3. that the project will comply with the procedures specified in Regional Project
10	Funding Delivery Policy (MTC Resolution No. 3606, revised); and
11	4. the assurance of the sponsor to complete the project as described in the
12	application, and if approved, as included in MTC's Transportation Improvement
13	Program (TIP); and
14	5. that the project will comply with all the project-specific requirements as set forth
15	in MTC Resolution No. 3925;
16	now, therefore, be it
17	RESOLVED, That DPW is an eligible sponsor of STP/CMAQ-funded projects; and, be
18	it further
19	RESOLVED, That there is no legal impediment to DPW's application for the funds, or
20	DPW's ability to deliver the projects; and, be it further
21	RESOLVED, That DPW will provide \$436,358 in non-federal matching funds; and, be it
22	further
23	RESOLVED, That DPW understands that the STP/CMAQ funding for these projects is
24	fixed at the MTC-approved amount, and that any cost increases must be funded by DPW from
25	other funds; and, be it further

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1	RESOLVED, That DPW understands the funding deadlines associated with these
2	funds and will comply with the provisions and requirements of the Regional Project Funding
3	Delivery Policy (MTC Resolution No. 3606, as revised); and, be it further
4	RESOLVED, That DPW and the projects will comply with the requirements set forth in
5	MTC Resolution No. 3925; and, be it further
6	RESOLVED, That DPW will implement the projects as described in the application and
7	in this resolution, for the amount programmed in the MTC's TIP; and, be it further
8	RESOLVED, That MTC is requested to support the projects described herein and to
9	include them in MTC's TIP.
