14	Section 1. The San Francisco Administrative Code is hereby amended by adding		
15	Section 2A.74, to read as follows:		
16	SEC. 2A.74. POLICE DEPARTMENT PARTICIPATION IN FEDERAL COUNTERTERRORISM		
17	ACTIVITIES.		
18	(a) The City and County of San Francisco, including but not limited to the San Francisco		
19	Police Department, may assist federal agencies on the Federal Bureau of Investigation ("FBI") Joint		
20	Terrorism Task Force or any successor task force, joint operation, assignment or enforcement activity		
21	(collectively, "JTTF") in preventing and investigating possible acts of terrorism and other criminal		
22	activity only in a manner that is fully consistent with the laws of the State of California, including but		
23	not limited to the inalienable right to privacy guaranteed by Article 1, Section 1 of the California		
24	Constitution, as well as the laws and policies of the City and County of San Francisco and, as		

applicable to the Police Department, that Department's policies, procedures, and orders.
