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Resolution commending the men and women of the Department of Public Works and proclaiming May 20 - 26, 2012, as Public Works Week in the City and County of San Francisco.

WHEREAS, Public works programs and services provided in the City and County of San Francisco are delivered by a professional and committed staff of public works employees; and

WHEREAS, It is the mission of the San Francisco Department of Public Works to improve the quality of life in San Francisco through partnering with the community and providing outstanding public service; and where its programs and services, provided twenty-four hours a day, seven days per week, are an integral part of our residents' everyday lives; and

WHEREAS, During the last year, the San Francisco Department of Public Works produced significant achievements, including opening five Branch Libraries for which DPW provided project management, architectural and/or engineering services; breaking ground on the new Public Safety Building and the Pier 27 Cruise Ship Terminal; introducing new initiatives such as Mobile Food Facilities and Parklets permits; kicking off the \$248 million three-year Road Repaving and Street Safety Program (Streets Bond); introducing the Better Market Street project to the public through a series of workshops; collecting over 2,605 pounds of fruits and vegetables for the SF Food Bank from our Urban Gleaning program; developing DPWStat, a management tool to enhance service delivery efficiency; engaging a record number of over 6,600 volunteers in clean up and beautification efforts; and initiating new apprenticeship programs to provide job training and create jobs; and

2	under its Strategic Plan to achieve its vision to create a world class public works organization
3	that contributes to making San Francisco a beautiful, livable, vibrant, and sustainable city; and
4	WHEREAS, Public Works is dedicated to community outreach and has provided
5	thousands of volunteers with meaningful neighborhood improvement work in the past year
6	through DPW's signature volunteer event Community Clean Team; and
7	WHEREAS, An important feature of National Public Works Week is the recognition
8	that public-private partnerships between the city and its residents, businesses and visitors, are
9	vital to the success of public works projects; and
10	WHEREAS, The theme of 2012 National Public Works Week is Public Works: Creating
11.	a Lasting Impression, and as this year's Public Works Week coincides with the 75 <sup>th</sup>
12	anniversary of the Golden Gate Bridge, the American Public Works Association (APWA) has
13	honored San Francisco by featuring the bridge on their national posters; and
14	WHEREAS, During Public Works Week, DPW holds events to honor the women and
15	men who make daily contributions in public works-related efforts, including designing,
16	operating and improving the city's infrastructure; graffiti removal, tree planting and
17	maintenance; neighborhood beautification and volunteer clean-ups; street and sewer repair;
18	architecture and engineering services; and street use and mapping services; collectively
19	known as public works; now, therefore, be it
20	RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby proclaims May 20 <sup>th</sup> through May
21	26 <sup>th</sup> , 2012 as Public Works Week in San Francisco and commends the men and women of
22	the Department of Public Works while calling upon all of its residents, businesses, and
23	neighborhood and merchant organizations to work in collaboration with the department as it
24	enhances the quality of life in San Francisco.

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
